over activist's murder Admits to police about opening fire

A Chhatra League leader has been arrested for his involvement in the murder of a BCL activist, who was shot dead in broad daylight in Brahmanbaria during the fourth phase of the upazila polls on Wednesday. Prior to his arrest, Hasan Al Farabi Joy was

expelled from his post as vice president of BCL's district unit.

Farabi was directly involved in the murder of BCL activist Ashrafur Rahman Ijaz, said Mohammad Shakhawat Hossain, superintendent of Brahmanbaria police, at a press conference in his office yesterday.

A court sent Farabi to jail yesterday afternoon, a day after the victim's father filed a case against 16 people, including Farabi, in connection with the murder.

A team from the Detective Branch (DB) of police arrested Farabi from Kutubpur village under Atpara upazila of Netrakona on Friday morning, said the SP.

After the arrest, Farabi told police where he dumped the pistol used in the murder. Subsequently, the pistol was retrieved from a bush in Bhatpara village under Brahmanbaria Sadar Upazila, said SP Shakhawat.

During primary interrogation, Farabi admitted that he opened fire at a victory procession brought out by Ijaz and others before the announcement of the results of the Sadar upazila parishad election.

The police official also mentioned that Farabi had a conflict with Ijaz. A heated argument took place between them at a polling centre on Wednesday morning. Later in the afternoon, Farabi opened fire on the victory procession.

POST-POLLS VIOLENCE Journo attacked by defeated candidate

A local journalist was allegedly assaulted by a defeated upazila vice-chairman candidate and her supporters in Bakshiganj upazila, Jamalpur early vesterday

Masud Ul Hasan, 35, Bakshiganj correspondent of the daily Samakal, filed a written complaint with the local police against four named people and five to six unnamed others.

According to the complaint, as Masud was returning home on his motorcycle from his office, a group of people ambushed him when he reached Russell Amin Market 12:15am, leaving him injured. They also vandalised his motorbike and snatched his camera.

Atiq Mia and his wife defeated female vice chairman candidate Masuma Yasmin Smrity led the attack, Masud alleged in his complaint.

Hearing his scream, locals rescued him and took him to Bakshiganj Upazila Health Complex.

Masud said he has no dispute with Masuma Yasmin Smrity, adding that she might have attacked him for not working in favour of her in the recent upazila parishad election.

This correspondent could not reach the accused over the phone for their comment.

Abdul Ahad, officer-in-charge of Bakshiganj police station said they received a complaint in this regard. "We are looking into the matter."

The president and general secretary of Bakshiganj Press Club condemned the attack and demanded the immediate arrest of the attackers.

Capacity payments reached Tk 28,000 crore in 2022-23, a major leap from Tk 5,600 crore in 2017-18, said the study.

In the current fiscal year, it was Tk 32,000 crore, according to officials of Bangladesh Power Development Board (PDB).

Contacted, Mohammad Hossain. director general of the Power Cell, said, "It is not true that the subsidy money is spent to pay capacity charges. The PDB buys electricity from the Independent Power Producers at a higher rate than we sell [at a lower rate] to the distributor companies and consumers. What we get as subsidy is used to fill the up."

The PDB pays for gas and fuel used by the power plants, he said. "The volatile prices of fuel in the global market and devaluation of the taka

generation costs.

"We only slightly increased power But we are still spending more for each unit of electricity."

Khondaker Golam Moazzem, research director at the CPD, said capacity payments and higher energy prices in the international market were making the subsidy necessary in 2024-25.

Even after raising power prices several more times, the government will still need to subsidise the sector because power plants that are in the pipeline will soon require capacity charges, he said.

By retiring the inefficient and old power plants and getting rid of the allocated Tk 7,000 crore for provision for capacity charge when a importing liquefied natural gas plant does not produce electricity, the (LNG), up from Tk 6,000 crore in the

The government has plans to raise prices and have plans to hike more. power tariffs three to four times a year to lower subsidies over the next three years.

Considering the rising costs of living, food subsidy has been raised to Tk 7,250 crore from the current year's Tk 6,916 crore.

Ahasanul Islam Titu, state minister at the commerce ministry, told a press conference yesterday that more people will get subsidised food.

"We plan to have shops in designated areas under the Open Market Sale programme," he said.

In the agriculture sector, Tk 17,533 crore was allocated in the proposed budget last year, but the amount reached Tk 25,644 crore in the revised budget. In the new budget, the amount is Tk 17,261 crore.

The government will provide Tk 9,025 crore to the export sector in the form of incentives.

Parliamentary regulations require the opposition leader to come from a party that commands at least 10 percent of the lawmakers in the 543seat lower house.

The post has been vacant for 10 years because two dismal election results for Congress -- once India's dominant party -- left it short of that threshold.

Tuesday's election results increased the party's parliamentary representation from 52 to 99 seats.

A statement from the Congress executive said that "many challenges" remained in the party's road to reclaiming its credibility and returning to government in the future.

"The people of India have spoken the Congress has been given another chance," the statement said.

"It is now up to us to build on it. We must and we will."

Modi and his Hindu-nationalist BJP ruled outright for the past decade but failed to repeat its previous two landslide wins this time, despite widespread expectations of another easy triumph.

"The visit of the leaders to attend the swearing-in ceremony of Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi for his third consecutive term is in keeping with the highest priority accorded by India to its 'Neighbourhood First' policy and 'SAGAR' vision," the ministry said.

Muizzu was a surprise addition to the list of invitees, especially amid the

after the January 7 parliamentary polls in Bangladesh. During her stay in New Delhi, the Bangladesh premier, who is leading a 60-member delegation, is likely to meet

Modi after his swearing-in ceremony. Hasina along with other foreign leaders will attend a banquet, to be hosted by Indian President Droupadi Murmu, at the Rashtrapati Bhavan after the oath-taking.

Apart from Hasina, Sri Lankan President Ranil Wickremesinghe, Maldivian President Mohamed Muizzu, Vice-President of Seychelles Ahmed Afif, Prime Minister of Mauritius Pravind Kumar Jugnauth, Prime strained ties between India and the Maldives since his election last year on the back of an "India Out" campaign.

The opposition INDIA bloc is yet to get invitation for attending the swearing-in of Modi.

Replying to a question from reporters, Congress leader Jairam Ramesh said his party was yet get any invite for the swearing-in. "If and when we get it, we as INDIA bloc will take a collective decision."

In Kolkata, West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee vesterday made it clear that her party Trinamool Congress would not attend Modi's oath-taking.
