# Help us resolve Rohingya crisis

PM urges China during meeting with Chinese minister Liu Jianchao

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina vesterday sought Chinese support to solve the Rohingya crisis quickly.

It has already been six years since the influx of the forcibly displaced Myanmar nationals to Bangladesh. Bangladesh is now very much worried about the Rohingya crisis due to the uncertainty in finding solutions," she said.

The premier said this at a meeting with visiting Minister of International Department of the Communist Party of China Liu Jianchao at her Jatiya Sangsad Bhaban office, reports BSS.

PM's press secretary M Nayeemul Islam Khan briefed the reporters afterwards.

Naveemul quoted Hasina as saving, "It [Rohingya crisis] is very much frustrating and worrying for us." He said the premier told the Chinese minister that "It's a special message [from myself] to convey to the Chinese president [to resolve the Rohingya issue]."

Liu Jianchao said China is committed and working with Myanmar to facilitate repatriation of the Rohingyas from Bangladesh, adds UNB.

"Even the Myanmar government does not have the position to implement any plan [regarding this issue]. The civil war situation has turned into a complex issue due to the conflicting situation [in Myanmar]," he said.

Jianchao also said China realises that Bangladesh is affected due to the Rohingya issue and they highly appreciate that Bangladesh is supporting the Rohingyas on humanitarian grounds.

### Govt preparing list of top loan defaulters **Finance minister tells JS**

The list of top loan defaulters, both individuals and organisations, is being prepared, Finance Minister Abul Hassan Mahmood Ali informed parliament yesterday.

This announcement came in response to a query from Awami League MP Farida Yasmin, who asked for the names of the top 30 loan defaulters and the amounts they owe.

Meanwhile, AL MP Nurunnabi Chowdhury of Bhola-3 inquired about permanent measures aken to prevent loan scams in banks and financia institutions. In response, the minister highlighted several initiatives, including amending the Bank Companies Act, 1991, issuing guidelines for identifying and addressing willful defaulters, conducting regular inspections and monitoring by Bangladesh Bank, implementing a specific action plan to reduce the classified loan ratio below 8 percent by June 2026 and ensure corporate governance in the banking sector. The Finance Company Act, 2023 was also enacted to enhance transparency, accountability, and systematic management in finance companies, the minister added.

## **EID JOURNEY** Road crashes kill 262 in 13 days

At least 262 people were killed and 543 were injured in 251 road crashes in the 13 days centring the Eid-ul-Azha holiday, said Road Safety Foundation vesterday.

Of them, 32 were women and 44 children.

Of the casualties, 104 were killed in 129 bike-related crashes between June 11 and June 23, which is 39.69 percent of the total deaths, it said through a press release.

The rate of motorcycle accidents was 51.39 percent, a 13.31 percent rise compared to the same period last year.

During this time, there were seven waterway accidents, resulting in 12 deaths and 3 injuries. There were also 16 railway accidents in which 14 people were killed and eight injured. Regional statistics of the accidents indicate that 28.68 percent of the accidents occurred in Dhaka division. Of them, 18 took place in the capital, resulting in 14 deaths and 11 injuries.

The organisation has also identified 10 main causes behind these road accidents, which include faulty vehicles, reckless speeding, incompetence and physicalmental illness of drivers, plying of slow-moving vehicles on highways, and reckless bike riding by the youth.

It has also made several recommendations, like ensuring strict monitoring systems on roads, waterways, and railways before and after Eid, formulating sustainable transport strategies, and implementing the "Road Transport Act-2018" without any hindrance.

Road Safety Foundation prepared the data by compiling several media reports. Referring to the IRAP (International Road Assessment Programme) method, the organisation said the country incurred a Tk 998.55 crore loss of human resources due to road crashes.
