Three of my projects were disrupted due to the ongoing turmoil in the country. I will ioin the shoots from July 31, starting with Vicky Zahed's projects and another will be directed by Mohon Ahmed. Both of the shoots will take place outside Dhaka

In your entire career, you were not seen in more than one television series, why is that?

I was featured in only one television series, Joint Family. Although I got offers for serials, I wanted to focus more on telefictions and telefilms only. Working in both serial and one-hour fiction gets tough, thus I prefer to choose one-hour fiction over serials.

You did not appear in OTTs either.

Not that I didn't get offers, however, till now I haven't got a role that has intrigued me. I am waiting for such a story and character – since it really matters how

you present yourself on your first outing in a platform. Thus, I am waiting for the perfect opportunity for an OTT debut.

Do you wish to work on the silver screens? Which actress doesn't? Just a few days ago, I was offered a governmentfunded film, but the script to par. For now, I will keep doing

The musician passed away due to a massive heart attack in a hospital in Virginia, United States, shortly after 6:00am last Thursday (July 25).

Earlier, on July 20, Shafin Ahmed was set to perform at a concert in Virginia, but the event was canceled due to his sudden illness. Later, he was placed on life support and passed away while receiving treatment.

## MORE ON REMAND

Eight more people, including former Ducsu vice-president Nurul Haque Nur and BNP Senior Joint Secretary General Ruhul Kabir Rizvi Ahmed, were placed on a five-day remand each after in a case filed over the vandalism of the Kazipara Metro Station in the city's Mirpur on July 19.

Qazi Sayedul Alam Babul, its Dhaka North City unit Member Secretary Aminul Haque, Publicity Secretary Sultan Salauddin Tuku, Bagerhat district BNP Convener MA Salam and its activist Mahmudus Salehin.

Dhaka Metropolitan Magistrate Md Mainul Islam passed the order after investigating officer Asaduzzaman Munshi, an inspector of the Detective Branch (DB) of police, produced them before it with a 10-day remand prayer.

In the forwarding report, the IO said the accused planned and committed such offences as per the direction of Nur and others with an intention to topple the government. So, they need to be interrogated to find out vital clues about the incident, it added.

The court granted the accused 5-day remand each after cancelling their bail petitions along with the petitions to cancel the remand prayer on grounds they were implicated in the case as part of a conspiracy to harass them over political rivalry.

"I believe BIMSTEC has a bright future. All members are committed to make BIMSTEC a success story," he added.

BIMSTEC adapted its charter on May  $20\ this$  year,  $27\ years$  after the founding of the regional body. It has institutional mechanisms and policies but is lacking practical cooperation.

Indra Mani Pandey said the upcoming summit would add new vigour to regional cooperation within BIMSTEC. It will adopt Bangkok Vision 2030, which would give direction to the organisation, he hoped.

BIMSTEC wants to create an enabling environment for rapid economic development through identification and implementation of specific cooperation projects in the agreed areas of cooperation.

It also wants to accelerate economic growth and social progress through ioint endeavours in the spirit of equality and partnership, Indra Mani said.

shutdown. Mobile internet was temporarily made unavailable on July 17 and 18 in some areas upon the recommendation of the law enforcement agencies with the technology support of BTRC and Telecommunication the National Monitoring Centre, Palak said.

On July 18, due to a fire in the Department of Disaster Management (DDM) caused by a group of miscreants, two data centres became non-operational, and hundreds of kilometres of ISP cables and the fibre

optic cable from Dhaka to Chattogram were set on fire, making the internet temporarily unavailable, he added.

However, industry experts said that since most of the country's bandwidth comes from India through Benapole and the second submarine cable from Kuakata via Barishal, even if the first submarine cable's bandwidth is disconnected, at least 75 percent of the bandwidth should be supplied smoothly, keeping the country mostly connected.

Even if hundreds of kilometres of ISP cable were burnt, the internet outages should be limited since ISPs have deployed cables spanning hundreds of thousands of kilometres to provide internet to homes and businesses throughout the country, they said.

People with knowledge of the matter said the outage was ordered by the government.

The Daily Star has visited the data centres in question and found no sign of damage to the building that housed

Officials of the data centres also confirmed that there was no fire in the building. However, the DDM opposite

the building was torched and that fire partially damaged some overhead cables connected to the data centres.

Around 8:00pm on July 18, officials of the Internet Service Providers Association of Bangladesh said the fire might have cut 30-40 percent of the bandwidth supply, leaving some users disconnected and many with slow

An hour later, the entire Bangladesh was without internet.
