Govt set to ban Jamaat-Shibir

14-party combine makes unanimous recommendation; gazette within two days

The Awami League-led 14-party alliance yesterday unanimously recommended that the government ban Jamaat-e-Islami and Islami Chhatra Shibir for their alleged involvement in anti-state activities.

The alliance made the recommendation at a meeting at the Gono Bhaban, presided over by AL President Sheikh

Hasina, also the prime minister, assured that her government will act on the recommendation and issue a gazette notification in this regard within two days, said

"For the sake of national interests, the 14-party members unanimously agreed to ban politics of Jamaat Shibir to eliminate the anti-state element," Awami League General Secretary Obaidul Quader told reporters after the meeting, which started at 5:00pm and ended around 8.

Protesters take to streets again

Face obstruction from law enforcers; 80 detained; demo organisers reject call for nationwide mourning

Quota reform protesters yesterday staged demonstrations across the country, including in Dhaka and Chattogram cities, but law enforcers dispersed them at many places and detained at least 80.

Ruling party men also obstructed them from holding demonstrations in some places.

Students from different universities and colleges held the demonstrations to protest the "detention of six coordinators of the quota reform protest by the Detective Branch of Dhaka Metropolitan Police and forcing them to issue a statement on ending protests".

End mass arrests, arbitrary detention **Amnesty urges Bangladesh govt**

Amnesty International yesterday urged Bangladesh to end mass arrests and arbitrary detention of student leaders and protesters.

In a statement, Smriti Singh, regional director for South Asia at Amnesty International, made the call responding to reports of the arrest and detention of student leaders, protest participants, and members of opposition parties following the quota-reform protests, with over 9,000 arrests over the weekend in Bangladesh.

Don't mock the nation

Says HC about DB's handling of 6 protest organisers

The High Court yesterday expressed its displeasure at detective branch taking six coordinators of quota protests to its office and showing the media that they are having food there.

"Don't mock the nation," said the HC. "Who told you to do this? Why did they do it? Whoever is taken there [DB office] is made to sit at the dining table," the HC bench of Justice Mustafa Zaman Islam and Justice SM Masud Hossain Dolon said during a hearing on a petition.

Supreme Court lawyers Aynunnahar Siddiqua and Manzur-Al-Matin yesterday filed the petition seeking orders to have the six protesters released immediately and to stop the use of bullets against protesters.

The bench set today for further hearing and passing orders on the petition.

Quota reform protest organisers Nahid Islam and Asif Mahmud were reportedly picked up on July 19.

Nahid was found on July 20 at Purbachal and Asif was found near Niketon on July 24.

Nahid and Asif, along with protest coordinator Abu Baker Majumder, were taken again from a city hospital on July 26.
