

J&K CLASHES
Indian soldier,
suspected
rebel killed

Soldiers in Indian-administered Jammu and Kashmir battled insurgents yesterday, with a captain and a suspected rebel killed in clashes in the territory, the army and police said.

The Indian army, in a post on social media platform X, offered its “deepest condolences” over the death of the officer.

Police said in a statement that “during the ongoing operation, one terrorist has been neutralised”, a term they use indicating a gunman had been killed.

The violence is the latest in a string of clashes in the Hindu-dominated southern Jammu region this year.

Indian Defence Minister Rajnath Singh called a meeting with army, security, and intelligence chiefs yesterday after the latest clashes in Jammu.

POST-COUP MYANMAR
Military denies
junta chief detained
by generals

Myanmar's military yesterday said rumours top generals had detained the embattled junta chief in a new coup were “propaganda” spread by “traitors” ahead of a visit by China's foreign minister.

Junta chief Min Aung Hlaing has faced public criticism from military supporters in recent weeks as government troops lose territory to ethnic minority armed groups and other opponents battling to overturn its 2021 coup.

On Tuesday several social media posts claimed that top generals had detained Min Aung Hlaing in the capital Naypyidaw in a bid to change the junta's top leadership.

The claims were “propaganda... with the aim of disrupting the country's peace and stability,” the junta said in a statement, accusing those sharing the news of being “traitors”.

“The head of state and authorities are fulfilling their national responsibility together,” it said. Chinese Foreign Minister Wang Yi was due to arrive in Myanmar yesterday for talks with Min Aung Hlaing. The visit is “aimed at deepening bilateral mutually beneficial cooperation in various fields,” an unnamed Chinese foreign ministry spokesman said on Tuesday.

China is a major ally and arms supplier to the junta but analysts say it also maintains ties with ethnic armed groups. In recent weeks an alliance of ethnic armed groups has seized territory from the junta in northern Shan state, which borders China's Yunnan province.

Hamas to stay out of
new Gaza truce talks

Demands adoption of Biden-backed proposal; 36 more
Palestinians killed in Israeli attacks

The Palestinian group Hamas said yesterday it would not take part in a new round of Gaza ceasefire talks slated for today in Qatar, dimming hopes for a negotiated truce that Iranian sources say could hold back an Iranian attack on Israel.

The US has said it expects indirect talks to go ahead as planned in Qatar's capital Doha today, and that a ceasefire agreement was still possible. However, Axios reported that US Secretary of State Antony Blinken has postponed a trip to the Middle East that had been expected to begin on Tuesday.

Three senior Iranian officials have said that only a ceasefire deal in Gaza would hold Iran back from direct retaliation against Israel for the assassination of Hamas leader Ismail Haniyeh on its soil last month.

The Israeli government said it would send a delegation to today's

talks, but Hamas, the Palestinian group that controls Gaza, requested a workable plan to implement a proposal it has already accepted rather than more talks.

“Hamas is committed to the proposal presented to it on July 2,

which is based on the US Security Council resolution and the Biden speech and the movement is prepared to immediately begin discussion over a mechanism to implement it,” Senior Hamas official Sami Abu Zuhri told Reuters.

There has been no let-up in fighting in Gaza, where residents of the southern city of Khan Younis said Israeli forces blew up homes

in the east and intensified tank shelling on eastern areas of the city centre.

Israel said it was responding to Hamas rocket fire towards Tel Aviv on Tuesday and had struck “rocket launching pads and militants among 40 military targets over 24 hours, including in central Gaza, Khan Younis, and western Rafah in the south”.

Armed groups of Hamas and the Islamic Jihad said they had attacked Israeli forces in several areas, while Palestinian health officials said Israeli strikes had killed at least 14 people yesterday, mostly in the centre and south.

Israel's military offensive in the Gaza Strip has killed at least 39,965 Palestinians and wounded 92,294 since October 7, the Palestinian enclave's health ministry said yesterday. A total of 36 Palestinians have been killed and 54 wounded in the past 24 hours, the ministry said in a statement.

MAJOR DRONE ATTACK
Ukraine targets 4
Russian airbases

Ukraine carried out its largest long-range drone strike of the war on four Russian military airfields in an overnight operation, a Ukrainian security source said yesterday.

The strike, which targeted Russia's Voronezh, Kursk, Savasleyka and Borisoglebsk air bases, aimed to undermine Moscow's ability to use warplanes for gliding bomb attacks on Ukraine, the source said.

Reuters could not immediately verify the claim. Ukraine was still assessing the scale of damage, the source said. Russia's defence ministry said earlier that its air defences had destroyed 117 drones and four tactical missiles launched by Ukraine at several regions including Kursk.

The strike on the airfields comes as Ukrainian troops are trying to press forward in Russia's Kursk region after they launched a surprise operation which has yielded their biggest battlefield gains since 2022.



Nepal approves
long-delayed war
crimes bill

Nepal's parliament yesterday approved long-delayed amendments to the transitional justice act aimed at addressing war crimes committed during the country's Maoist insurgency, but victims said some problematic provisions remain.

Both security forces and former rebels have been accused of carrying out torture, killings, rapes and forced disappearances during Nepal's decade-long civil war, which ended in 2006 with more than 16,000 people dead and around a thousand missing.

“We have brought this document forward through a unanimous agreement,” Prime Minister KP Sharma Oli told parliament, saying that the changes were “victim-centric”.

The amendment bill was passed with the support of a majority of lawmakers, parliamentary Speaker Dev Raj Ghimire said.

The peace deal brought the Maoist rebels into mainstream politics, ended a 240-year-old Hindu monarchy, transformed Nepal into a secular federal republic and integrated former rebels into the national army.

But authorities have been criticised for failing to adequately probe war crimes and instead create provisions for amnesty, with two commissions set up for that purpose in 2015 failing to resolve a single case between them despite over 60,000 complaints.
