

Constable injured on Aug 5 dies

A police member, who was beaten and pushed off the rooftop of Shyampur Police Station during clashes with protesters on August 5, died at a hospital in Dhaka yesterday evening.

The deceased was identified as Khalilur Rahman, 53, a constable of the police station.

On the afternoon of August 5, a group of people beat him up and threw him off the roof of the police station. With severe injuries, he was admitted to a private hospital in Dhanmondi, where he breathed his last around 5:00pm, his colleague, Sub-Inspector Torgul Hasan, mentioned in the inquest report.

The body was sent to Dhaka Medical College Hospital morgue for autopsy.

Along with him, at least 43 police personnel were killed so far during the mass protests, during which many police stations and offices across the country were attacked and looted as law enforcers opened fire indiscriminately, killing many protesters.

Over 500 people, including many students, were killed during the protests, which eventually forced prime minister Sheikh Hasina to resign and flee the country on August 5.

RAJBARI GOVT POULTRY FARM

28 years of neglect

Established in the 1981-82 fiscal year, the Rajbari Government Poultry Farm, spanning 2.88 acres in the Bhabanipur area of Rajbari town, was once a beacon of hope for the local meat industry.

It aimed to alleviate poverty by encouraging chicken rearing among locals.

However, the farm's hatchery operations have been non-functional since 1996 due to mismanagement, negligence, and a severe shortage of workers.

Now, the farm imports chicks from government hatcheries in Kushtia and neighbouring districts, and sells them to locals after 28-50 days at Tk 80-100 each.

The warehouse, residential quarters, water tank, hatchery shed, and two of the four chicken rearing sheds are in a state of disrepair. The only vehicle available for farm operations has been out of order for a long time.

An official said, "If the sheds are made operational again, the farm could produce 100,000 chicks, rear 18,000-20,000 chickens for meat, and raise 150,000 egg laying hens annually. However, only two sheds are currently in use, with around 12,000-14,000 Fayoumi and Sonali chicks being reared."

The farm, which requires 13 workers to function smoothly, is currently operating with only four.

Local poultry farmer Jasim Mondal said Sonali chicks from the farm are significantly cheaper than those from private farms, costing Tk 15 per chick compared to Tk 35-50 elsewhere.

However, supply is inconsistent, often leaving buyers empty-handed.

Md Kamal Bashar, the acting manager of the farm, said, "The annual demand for chicken in Rajbari is 20,000, but we receive only 10,000-12,000 chickens yearly. We have requested an increased budgetary allocation to ensure a regular supply of chicks and meet local demand."

Power outage hits rural areas

Remal hit the coastal areas. One of the country's two floating storage and regasification units (FSRU) was damaged, reducing the LNG regasification capacity to 600 million cubic feet per day (mmcf) from 1,100 mmcf.

The affected Summit-run FSRU was repaired later from abroad, but it is yet to start operations due to technical glitches in the subsea landing pad in Cox's Bazar's Moheshkhali area. It was supposed to be completed by July 15, as per the then government announcement. But still the Summit Group said it will take more time.

Summit Corporation International in a statement told The Daily Star that it may take up to September to resume ship-to-ship transfer.

"Assuming favourable

weather and sea conditions, Summit anticipates completing the repositioning and the reconnection of the DTM (Disconnectable Turret Mooring) plug by the end of August 2024 and for the ship-to-ship transfer to be ready in September 2024."

Due to adverse weather conditions at sea and almost zero underwater visibility, the damage identified by the internationally licensed subsea diving team has posed significant obstacles to rectify the issue in July, Summit noted.

"We have contracted 'Oriental Dragon', a Diving Support Vessel (DSV) for a stronger and higher capacity crane to move the DTM, which is expected to reach Moheshkhali from Singapore on August 22," it added.

Besides, the highest

single power producer - 1,500MW Adani Power Plant, located in India's Jharkhand, has shut one of two units due to fresh technical glitches, according to PDB officials.

Khandaker Mokammel Hossain, PDB member (generation), said Adani power plant was shut once due to a leak in a valve of the boiler circulating pump last month.

"It was repaired later and the production increased. But a new leakage was identified on August 13, leaving half of its unit shut," he said.

Contacted, Adani Group shared a statement through a PR agency in Bangladesh, saying, "Adani Power supplied 769MW to Bangladesh today [yesterday] from an alternate unit, as one unit of the Adani Power plant had to be shut down on

August 13 for a technical issue."

"We regret any inconvenience caused by this technical fault. We are working hard to fix the issue at the earliest and restore the full capacity of power generation," reads the statement.

Besides, Hossain said the Matarbari power plant, which was under trial run, but providing great support amid the gas shortage, has also stopped production recently. Also, one out of two units of Chattogram's SS power plant is also under maintenance.

The PDB data shows that currently around 2,300MW - or one third of total coal power capacity of 6,604MW - remain idle.

The country's total power generation capacity is 26,947MW.

were destroyed. The scene was chaotic; you can't imagine the fear we felt."

A CULTURAL AND HISTORICAL LOSS

The destruction is not just physical but also cultural.

Nikhil Krishna Majumdar, a renowned flute player and instrument maker, lost his collection of musical instruments, which had been housed in a museum at the station.

"I've been making and playing instruments for Khulna Betar since 1985. The loss of those instruments and documents is

heartbreaking. They were not just tools but symbols of our cultural heritage," he said.

Prof Anwarul Kadir, a prominent educationist and civic leader in Khulna, condemned the attack.

"This was not a random act. Many documents and artefacts related to our folk music and history were destroyed. This loss is irreplaceable and deeply disturbing."

THE ROAD AHEAD

The attack has left over 200 staff members, including 16 officers, in disarray. The centre's infrastructure, equipment, and archived data are irreparably

damaged, and broadcasts have been suspended for over a week.

Bangladesh Betar Director General Rabindrashri Barua visited the site on August 13, vowing to restore operations as soon as possible. "We are committed to resuming broadcasting, either by renovating the damaged building or setting up operations elsewhere," Barua said.

Netai Kumar Bhattacharje, its regional director, said, "Everything in the centre was reduced to ashes. Our immediate goal is to clean and repair

the facility, but it will take time."

Khulna Betar, which began with a modest 10 kW transmitter on December 4, 1970, and expanded to 100 kW by 1981, had earned the affection of listeners not only in Bangladesh but also in West Bengal, India.

It started its journey in the administrative building of Khulna University in Gollamari, a suburb in Khulna city.

Its programmes were a lifeline, offering everything from news to entertainment, and its loss is deeply felt by the community.

Golam Rabbani, a private sector employee shopping at Mirpur-1 kitchen market, said the prices of many essential items have remained high for over a year, as the previous government failed to curb the high prices.

"I am forced to buy less than what we need, as there's no other option," he said.

On Wednesday, Salehuddin Ahmed, finance and planning adviser to the interim government, stated that inflation in Bangladesh is expected to decline within a reasonable timeframe.

On the same day, newly appointed Bangladesh Bank Governor Ahsan H Mansur said the burden of rising prices may be reduced to tolerable levels within the next five to six months.

The government will focus on improving supply and production to curb inflation, he said after a meeting at the Secretariat.

power project can continue without being hampered.

"I said we will definitely continue it. A big investment has been made there. If it is not completed, we will not get its result," Tuhid Hossain said.

Mantyskiy also handed over a letter from Russian Foreign Minister Sergey Lavrov to Tuhid Hossain, congratulating him on his appointment as foreign adviser.

Meanwhile, the Japanese ambassador told Hossain that under the "Strategic Partnership," Japan will continue its support for Bangladesh's development and prosperity, and stand by its side during the transition process.

He said Japan will keep up with the existing projects related to the Rohingya refugees.

The UN resident coordinator told the media that a UN team of

independent experts would visit Dhaka next week to investigate the killings during the students' protest.

"They will assist us so that we can rightly probe the killings and punish those responsible," Hossain told the media.

They also discussed economic cooperation, LDC graduation, climate change, and the ongoing UN humanitarian operations concerning Bangladesh.

"During its tenure, the Awami League did not have the courage to allow any other party to legitimately win 50 seats in Bangladesh. Like thieves and robbers, they have placed their members or candidates in all 300 seats, without any actual election in every constituency. Additionally, they have placed their patrons in the 50 reserved seats as well."

"Those who occupied these 350 seats are fascists and nurturers of a fascist ideology," he said, adding that the AL, Jubo League, and Chhatra League

members involved in wrongdoing will also be held accountable.

"They need to answer for the torture inflicted on the people over these 16 years. They must face punishment. Then the people will decide whether AL can vie in the next election or not," he added.

Another key coordinator, Hasnat Abdullah, said members of the AL-led government and its associated bodies have smuggled thousands of crores of taka abroad over the last 16 years, with some portion of the money being used to spread propaganda.

"You [Sajeb Wazed Joy] don't have the right to make decisions about the country while sitting in the US. Your boat [electoral symbol of the Awami League] leaked a long time ago. You no longer have a boat, so there is no point in finding a baitha [a wooden stick used to steer a boat]. Do not expect that you will run the boat of Bangladesh through Modi's baitha," he added.

about opening the Mohakhali entrance ramp within a week. Tolls will be collected manually, he added.

He, however, could not say when the exit ramp at the FDC gate (Karwan Bazar) could be opened as one of the pillars there was torched.

Miscrants torched the Banani toll booth on July 18 and the Mohakhali toll booth the following day amid unrest centring the quota reform movement, causing the suspension of its service.

The authority resumed the operation of the expressway, except for the three ramps, from August 11.

Before the suspension, over 50,000 vehicles used the flyover daily on average, and the number of users remains almost the same now, he said.
