passed away
yesterday
afternoon
at the Bangabandhu Sheikh
Muhib Medical University
(BSMMU). He was 58.

Aghore left behind his wife, two daughters and a lot of well-wishers.

He had been suffering from kidney and coronary diseases for a long time and underwent treatment at the BSMMU for the past two months. He was released from the hospital early this month but was again admitted to the same hospital after he was diagnosed with dengue fever on September 5.

He was on life support for more than a week since then as his condition deteriorated.

Aghore was involved in journalism for the past three decades. He started his career at the Daily Bhorer Kagoj before working for channel-i, ATN News, and Dipta TV, respectively.

He lastly served as the news editor of ATN News. Aghore was also the acting president of Bangladesh Sports Journalists Association.

CCC's conservancy workers have been spraying mosquito repellents and larvicide in areas under 41 wards of CCC, said Sheikh Muhammad Tauhidul Islam, its CEO.

HEAVY RAINFALL IN BAGERHAT Fish from over 7,000 enclosures washed away

Incessant rainfall over the past few days caused severe waterlogging in low-lying areas of Bagerhat, inundating at least 7,000 fish enclosures across the district.

Local fish farmers are facing huge losses as fish worth hundreds of crores of taka were washed away from the enclosures, ponds and canals following the inundation since September 16.

Even with the odds stacked against them, many fish farmers were seen trying to salvage their remaining fish using nets and natural barriers like water hyacinths.

The worst hit areas include Fakirhat, Chitalmari, and Mollahat upazilas, which are renowned for prawn cultivation, while fish farmers in Mongla, Rampal and Morrelganj upazilas also suffered substantial losses, according to the district fisheries department.

"My three ghers (fish enclosures) are entirely submerged under knee-deep water. Fish worth around Tk 10 lakh, that were ready to be harvested, have been swept away, while the vegetables I cultivated within the enclosures have also been damaged," said Mirajul Islam, a farmer from Faltita village in Fakirhat.

Nasir Sheikh, a farmer from Kahalhat village in Mollahat, shared similar plight. Tulu Haque, a farmer from Chitalmari, said, "Many of us had borrowed from banks and NGOs for fish farming and growing vegetables in and around the enclosures. How are we going to pay back the loans and reinvest to resume cultivation?"



The affected farmers called upon the government to provide financial assistance to help them grapple with the loss.

Contacted, ASM Russel, district fisheries officer in Bagerhat, said, "We are working on to assess the damages, while affected farmers are being advised on preventing fish from getting washed away."

Buet cancels dorm seats

Amin Siddique, director of Buet's Directorate of Student's Welfare, told The Daily Star, "The seat allotment of the students was cancelled as there were complaints against them regarding their political involvement. There were also protests from other students centring the issue. To maintain the discipline and peace of the dormitories, the seat allotments of the accused students were cancelled."

He said the authorities do not know the total number of such students as they are yet to receive the names from the hall authorities.

However, Buet students alleged that they submitted the names of 55 students to the administration, but the residential facilities were also cancelled for some other students, against whom they did not submit any complaints.

and a society that is run in their interests," she said in the letter.

She emphasised that corruption has severely impacted Bangladesh's living standards, workplace rights, and democratic freedoms.

"Given that Bangladesh's ACC is seeking international cooperation to recover any misappropriated funds, I would be most grateful if you can clarify what steps have been taken to investigate and freeze all UK-based assets owned by Mr Chowdhury and others subject to these corruption investigations," she added.

She further said freezing and repatriating relevant funds is not only critical for justice and the future of people's rights in Bangladesh but essential in relation to the UK's reputation and international record.

Kamrun Hasan Numan, an environmental activist, said several iconic indigenous species like Magur, Ritha, and Chital are on the brink of extinction, alongside many aquatic plants such as lotus and water lily.

"There were over 25 fish sanctuaries in Hakaluki Haor 15 years back, but only 11 of those now remain along with only three designated protected areas," said Touhidur Rahman, a project officer of Centre for Natural Resource Studies.

Contacted, Abu Masud, senior fisheries officer in Kulaura upazila, said the upazila fisheries office has been conducting drives regularly alongside continued monitoring and enforcement of laws.

Around 5,000 meters of banned nets were seized and destroyed during a drive on September 22, he added.

Shah Zahurul Haque, assistant commissioner (land) in Kulaura upazila, said the drives will continue.

Local communities, authorities, and environmental organisations must collaborate to develop and implement conservation strategies to preserve the fisheries resources of Hakaluki Haor ecosystem, he added.

The tourists said there were eight abductors and all of them were Bangladeshis.

Khagrachhari SP Arfin Jewel told The Daily Star that the three tourists had gone to Sajek on Friday.

"Following the violence that broke out in the hill district, they were trapped there. While returning in their private car this Tuesday, unknown abductors intercepted them at Dighinala area and held them hostage," Jewel said.

Later, the abductors phoned their family, demanding ransom of Tk 50 lakh, said the police official.

Nahiduzzaman told the journalists that the Khagrachhari SP made several calls to his cellphone number.

As the miscreants confirmed through Truecaller that the calls were coming from the SP's number, they released the victims sensing a possible rescue operation by law enforcers.

A case was filed with Dighinala Police Station, said the SP.


