Tourism and Peace

There exists a profound and inseparable relationship between tourism and peace. Tourism is not only crucial for the economic development of a country, but it also plays a significant role in fostering global peace and harmony. In the context of Bangladesh and the world, tourism can be seen as a bridge to peace. Peace is necessary for the development of tourism and peace is possible through tourism. Sometimes situations arise in a country or region centered on local or international issues that make violence inevitable. This violence stopped the movement of people, hindered tourism. A peaceful environment is essential for people to travel and roam. Tourism means going outside one's natural environment. To go outside one's natural environment requires mental and physical peace, requires safe and peaceful arrangements and conditions along the way. Safe transportation, comfortable accommodation and delicious-safe food are essential for tourism. If this is disrupted, if the peace required for tourism development is absent, tourism will not develop and we will not be able to achieve the economic prosperity that we dream of through tourism.

Tourism Industry: Tourism has already been recognized as an industry in different countries of the world. In Bangladesh National Industrial Policy 2022, 12 sub-sectors have been included as tourism industry. Among the 17 priority industries of the country, the tourism industry ranks third. Among the 34 service industries, tourism service is ranked ninth. A large number of people are associated with tourism as a service sector supporting the economy. As a result, employment opportunities for a significant number of people have been created in this industry. It will increase in future. Bangladesh has a potential of employment of 72 lakh 85 thousand people in the tourism industry by the year 2030. These industries include transport systems like airplanes, tourist coaches, taxis; Hospitality services including accommodation like hotels, resorts, restaurants, bars; Amusements and Entertainment places like amusement parks, shopping malls, casinos, theatres, stage music etc. Bangladesh, with its natural beauty, rich cultural heritage, and hospitality, is an attractive destination for international tourists. The Sundarbans, Cox's Bazar beaches, the Chittagong Hill Tracts, and the historic sites of Rajshahi and other places of the country captivate tourists. However, these natural and cultural treasures not only just enrich the country's economy; they also strengthen social stability and peaceful coexistence. When foreign tourists visit our country, they interact with our culture and people, fostering intercultural understanding and friendships.

Tourism and Peace: The logic behind the saying that peace building through tourism is possible deserves to be analyzed. Tourists are not an organized class. Tourists are sometimes an individual, sometimes one or more family members, sometimes friends, sometimes office colleagues and sometimes groups of senior citizens women or men. They cannot play any role in calming the turbulent situation. That is why it is said that tourism is not a producer of peace but a "peace taker". Tourism is possible only where peace prevails; It is absent in war zones and tourism is greatly reduced in areas of high conflict and tension. So how is it possible to establish peace through tourism? Certainly, it is possible because tourism is an important industry. The tourism industry has grown rapidly over the last six decades as one of the world's largest industries. It is contributing significantly to reducing unemployment, increasing economic growth, conservation of natural resources and cultural exchange. Tourism contributes to the income generation of economically backward yet culturally rich communities. Many people are associated with this industry in various ways. They can influence the Government, influence other sections of the society; especially in countries where a large part of their GDP comes from tourism. Sri Lanka is a watershed example. The turbulent Sri Lanka of the recent past is now a safe destination for tourists. However, "direct prevention" or "operational prevention" of conflict through tourism is not possible, involving activities such as mediation, negotiation, arbitration, early warning and early response, etc. Rather, tourism can play an effective role in structural prevention of conflict. Structural prevention means identifying and eliminating the underlying causes of conflict and always working to prevent these causes from re-emerging in the future. Research on how tourism can contribute to maintaining positive peace in all parts of the world requires a redesign of the way the tourism industry progresses by UN Tourism.

Approaches to Build Peace through Tourism: Tourism is a powerful tool that unites people across nations, religions, races, cultures, and countries. Through tourism, individuals can learn about new cultures, traditions, and ways of life, which enhances international understanding and tolerance. This understanding is crucial for building peace, as it fosters mutual respect and admiration. Firstly, tourism encourages cultural exchange among people of different countries. When tourists visit various nations, they interact with local populations and learn about their way of life. This exchange process creates bonds of friendship and empathy, which contribute to peace building. Secondly, tourism accelerates economic development, which can ensure stability and peace. The growth of the tourism industry provides employment opportunities for local people, improving their standard of living. Economic stability reduces social unrest and conflicts, which are critical steps toward peace. Thirdly, tourism helps in the preservation of natural and cultural heritage. When a nation can preserve its heritage and culture, it fosters a sense of pride and respect. This respect leads to mutual admiration among nations, which helps maintain peace at both the national and international levels.

International Day of Peace: 21 September is the International Day of Peace. On this occasion, the United Nations organizes its annual Peace Bell Ringing Ceremony. In 1981, the United Nations General Assembly declared 21st September every year as the International Day of Peace. These 24 hours demonstrate the vision of world peace by calling on all countries to stop violence and war. Amid global conflict, the United Nations holds the tolling of the bell each year on or before its scheduled time. As per tradition, the event is held at the Peace Garden of the United Nations Headquarters in New York, USA.

World Tourism Day: Every year, September 27th is celebrated globally as World Tourism Day, dedicated to raising awareness about the importance of tourism and its multifaceted impact.
