# 'Interim govt to decide its term'

**Yunus tells Voice of America** 

#### STAR REPORT

The interim government will specify the length of its tenure, Chief Adviser Muhammad Yunus said in an interview with Voice of America.

Speaking about the army chief's recent comment that a transition to democracy should be made within 18 months, Prof Yunus said, "If you want, you can suppose that this is

the term of the interim government, but that is not the government's opinion. The government will determine how long its term will be. Unless the government says so, it cannot be considered the term of the government.

"When you hear it from us, that will be the actual date. The advisory council has discussed the term, but no decision has been made yet."

Voice of America (VOA) is an international radio broadcasting state media network funded by the United States of America. It produces content in over 48 languages, targeting people outside US borders. The VOA interview with Yunus, conducted in Bangla, took place during his recent visit to the US and was uploaded on the VOABangla.com website on Monday.

Citing the law and order situation of the country, Yunus explained the government gave magistracy power to the army for a limited time of two months, and hoped that the police could return to serving the people within this time.

As of filing this report around 10:00pm, the town was tense and police using loudspeakers were asking people to stay calm. Police, border guards and army personnel patrolled different neighbourhoods. Abdul Baten

Mridha, officer-in-charge of Khagrachhari Police Station, said "I was also beaten while trying to calm the situation."

The incidents happened less than two weeks after a Bangalee man, who was injured after crashing a motorcycle he had allegedly stolen, was beaten to death by locals. Racial violence flared up in the district at the time and it spilled over to Rangamati. The violence left at least four people, including a 17-year-old, from the indigenous communities dead.

Murshedy was held at Bashundhara in Dhaka, Ékramul in Chattogram, and Gini was arrested at Dhanmondi. A DB team arrested former EXIM Bank chairman Nazrul Islam Mazumder at Gulshan.

Later, police rescued him and took him to Khagrachhari Sadar Hospital.

Ripple Bappi Chakma, resident medical officer, said Rana was dead on arrival around 2:10pm.

The hospital was vet to make a list of the injured people, he added. Rana

Officials said previously went to jail on charges of trying to rape a 10th grader student of his. A case was filed against him regarding this on February 25, 2021.

After he was released on bail and returned to work, students marched on September 5 with a banner that read, "Fire rapist teacher Sohel Rana."

Prior to that, Rana was a teacher of Hosenabad Technical School Govt and College in Doulatpur, Kushita. He was transferred from that school after an investigation found that he molested a student, according to media reports.

Yesterday morning, when Rana was kept confined to a room, UNO Sujan, an additional superintendent of police and officer-incharge of the police station tried to bring the situation under control, but to no avail, said Sujan.

Sujan said he and a few police officials suffered injuries.

Marma, Ukanyu а witness, said some students saw Rana taking a girl to a room around 9:00am.

"When they [the students] informed us, we went to the college and rescued her from the teacher's room," he said.

"The girl said the teacher had raped her," he said, adding that people were outraged after hearing that.

update the national database immediately after a patient is detected and actions are then taken based on the data.

"Public health teams go to the patient's house, check the surroundings for Aedes breeding grounds, and destroy [them] if found. They also check for others who may be infected."

The teams then make a follow-up visit after a week and take legal action against residents if Aedes breeding grounds are found, he said.

The chief of Sri Lanka's dengue management committee is the president, while the army chief, ministers and top law enforcement officials are also involved.

"Bangladesh's anti mosquito programmes aren't as coordinated as theirs,' Nazmul added.

He further said many of the patients being admitted to hospital this year are already in a critical condition.

In many cases, he said, testing kits gave false results. "And so, patients ended up coming to hospital after their condition was already dire."

He urged immediate consultation after a fever and getting a Complete Blood Count test done on the third and fourth days of fever, even if the NS1 test (done to detect dengue) comes negative.

#### **DENGUE CONTROL** COMMITTEES

Meanwhile, the government on Monday formed two six-member committees comprising experts to control the dengue outbreak.

Administrators of Dhaka's two city corporations were made convenors of the committees, while their executive officers were made member secretaries.
