Options for India, China to resolve border stand-off

Says Indian army chief

Talks between Indian and Chinese diplomats have opened options for the rivals to resolve conflict on their Himalayan frontier, India's army chief said yesterday.

Ties between the neighbours have been strained since clashes between their troops on the frontier left 20 Indian and four Chinese soldiers dead in 2020.

Diplomatic and military talks to end the standoff have made slow progress and hurt business relations between the world's two most populous nations with New Delhi tightening scrutiny of investments from Chinese firms and halting major projects.

"The positive signalling is coming from the diplomatic side," General Upendra Dwivedi said at a defence think tank event. "But when it comes to the execution on ground ... it's dependent on the military commanders on both the sides to take those decisions.'

US ELECTIONS NYT endorses Harris as 'only patriotic choice' for president

The New York Times editorial board on Monday endorsed Kamala Harris, calling the Democrat "the only patriotic choice for president" in the race against Trump.

But the paper did not even mention the vice president's name until the fourth paragraph of its written endorsement instead focusing attention on Trump's unworthiness for the presidency, calling him morally and temperamentally "unfit."

"This unequivocal, dispiriting truth -Donald Trump is not fit to be president should be enough for any voter who cares about the health of our country and stability of our democracy to deny him re-election."

It's an "anyone but Trump" approach that The New Yorker took one day prior, with editors at the magazine saying the Republican represents the "ongoing assault on the stability, the nerves, and the nature of the United States." The Times acknowledged Harris "may not be the perfect candidate for every voter, especially those who are frustrated and angry about our government's failures to fix what's broken.

However, the advance further raises the risk of a wider escalation in the fight with the Iran-backed armed group or even across the region, and the United Arab Emirates, Qatar, Russia, Spain and Japan have all been quick to express deep concern.

US Defense Secretary Lloyd Austin said that attacks over recent weeks.

he had told Israeli counterpart Yoav Gallant that Washington agrees on the need for a ground offensive to rid Lebanon's southern border area of Hezbollah weapons and other means it can use to carry out attacks across the border.

> "I made it clear that the United States supports Israel's defend to right itself," Austin said. The White House National Security Council made a similar statement yesterday, justifying "limited operations", reports Al Jazeera online.

It also added that it remains against the expansion of the ground assault and that a diplomatic solution is the only way to achieve lasting stability along Israel's border with Lebanon.

Lebanon's caretaker Prime Minister Najib Mikati warned that his country is facing "one of the most dangerous phases of its history" and urged the United Nations to provide aid for one million people displaced by Israel's

DOCTOR'S MURDER Jr doctors in West Bengal resume strike

Junior doctors in India's West Bengal state resumed their full strike yesterday, complaining that the country's judiciary has not made adequate efforts to restore justice after the rape and murder of a trainee doctor in August.

Doctors from the West Bengal Junior Doctors' Front, which represents 7,000 physicians, reinstated partial services last month, citing flood situation.

The rape and murder of the 31-year-old female doctor in Kolkata set off a wave of protests by doctors demanding greater workplace safety for women and justice for their slain colleague, prompting Supreme Court to create a hospital safety task force.

The doctors, however, said they were disappointed with the court's decisions and were "compelled to return to a full ceasework".

'I chose freedom over justice'

Says Assange in first comments after detention

Julian Assange, the founder of whistleblower media group WikiLeaks, told European lawmakers yesterday his guilty plea to US espionage accusations was necessary because legal and political efforts to protect his freedom were not sufficient.

"I eventually chose freedom over an unrealisable justice," Assange said, in his first public comments since his release from prison, addressing a committee at the Council of Europe, the international body best known for its human rights convention.

Assange, 53, returned to his home country Australia in June after a deal was struck for his release which saw him plead guilty to violating US espionage law, ending a 14-year British legal odyssey.

"I am free today after years of incarceration because I pleaded guilty to journalism, pleaded guilty to seeking information from a source, I pleaded guilty to obtaining information from a source and I pleaded guilty to informing the public what that information was," he said.

WikiLeaks in 2010 released hundreds of thousands of classified US military documents on Washington's wars in Afghanistan and Iraq along with swaths of diplomatic cables.

School bus fire in Thailand kills 23

At least 23 people died in Thailand when a school bus carrying more than 40 students and teachers on a field trip caught fire in the outskirts of the capital Bangkok, police said yesterday. Twenty-three bodies have

been identified, Trairong Phiwpan, forensic science commissioner reporters, with an investigation on the causes underway.

students Sixteen and three teachers were sent to a hospital, Transport Minister Juangroongruangkit said. Images posted on social media showed thick

grey smoke pouring out of the bus, parts of which were still on fire. The blaze was later extinguished.

A Reuters photographer saw fire trucks, police and rescue vehicles parked around the blackened vehicle, with a cluster of firefighters at the entrance. "Teachers told us that the fire ignited very quickly," police chief Kittirat Phanphet said. "From speaking to witnesses, we believe the explosion was caused by a spark from the tyre that lit the gas cylinder that was powering the vehicle," he said, adding that some students escaped through the window.
