DEFAMATION CASE
Journalist
Golam Sarwar
demands its
withdrawal

Standing in a human chain with his wife and two children, along with a host of well wishers, journalist Golam Sarwar was describing his ordeals over the past four years following a defamation case filed against him by an influential family of the port city.

"The case was filed by a brother of the then Minister for Land Saifuzzaman Chowdhury over publishing a report," he said.

The programme was held in front of Chattogram Press Club yesterday morning.

"I have been suffering physically, financially and mentally while dealing with the case for the last four years," he said.

"I had to leave my rented house in the port city and send my family to the village home due to financial and security problems," he said. "My only fault was I have written a report about their misdeed."

Barishal drowns after downpour

Almost all areas across Barishal city experienced severe waterlogging yesterday after heavy downpour since Friday.

It rained at least 153mm between 9:00pm on Friday and 9:00am yesterday, according to Bangladesh Meteorological Department in Barishal.

The inclement weather and waterlogging affected the lives and livelihoods of residents, especially the daily wage earners. Many labourers were seen waiting for long hours looking to be hired for work, in vain.

Visiting different areas of the city, this correspondent found most of the important thoroughfares, including Battala Road, Amanatganj Road, College Road, College Avenue, and Baptist Mission Road, among others, submerged under ankle to knee deep water, making movement of pedestrians and vehicles difficult.

Sparse presence of vehicles was seen on the roads. Water entered many roadside shops and ground floors of numerous houses, especially those located in the low-lying areas.

City dwellers alleged that crores of taka have been spent for excavation of seven canals and renovation of the city's drainage network, but the projects hardly brought any benefit as waterlogging still remains a menace.

"The city corporation does not clean the drains regularly, leaving those clogged with debris inside, which further exacerbated the situation," said Enayet Hossain Chowdhury, a resident of the city.

Water Development Board sources said they could not excavate the canals as planned due to numerous reasons. As such, around half of the allocated for the project has been returned.

Contacted, Khalid bin Walid, BWDB executive engineer in Barishal, said numerous structures, including multi-storied buildings, have been constructed encroaching upon the canals.

"To excavate the canals properly, these illegal structures need to be evicted first. Also, many structures have been constructed by filling up reservoirs in low-lying areas, due to which rainwater cannot be drained away properly, leading to waterlogging," he added.

Reduce number of banks to 30

Says economist Moinul Islam as part of reforms

The number of banks in Bangladesh should be reduced from 61 to 30 as part of reforms in the sector, said Professor Dr Moinul Islam yesterday.

He termed Rooppur Power Plant as Awami League's "white elephant" and criticised the involvement of Adani Group in energy sector, citing these projects as examples of large-scale corruption.

Moinul made these remarks at the "Dialogue for Democratic Reconstruction", organised by the Centre for Governance Studies (CGS) at a hotel in the port city. He said Sheikh Hasina's relatives

and supporters had engaged in massive looting, particularly in the banking sector. He questioned why controversial figures, such as those associated with S Alam Group, had been allowed to control multiple banks.

"We don't need so many banks in the country. The number must be reduced to 30," he said, adding that corruption in Bangladesh has been a long-standing issue, not limited to the AL regime, with similar problems during the BNP's 2001-2006 tenure.

297 killed by lightning in eight months

At least 297 people have been killed and 73 injured in incidents of lightning strikes across the country between February and September this year, according to Save the Society and Thunderstorm Awareness Forum (SSTAF).

In the eight months, lightning strikes killed 152 people while they were doing agricultural works, SSTAF said in a media release yesterday.

Of the total deceased, highest 96 people died in May followed by 77 people in June and 47 in September, it said.

District-wise, the highest casualties were recorded in Brahmanbaria, Joypurhat, and Habiganj (13 people each), followed by 12 in Feni and 10 in Cox's Bazar and Gaibandha.

SSTAF called for the inclusion of a chapter on lightning strike-related awareness in textbooks.
