BNP to help ensure safe Durga Puja celebrations

Forms committees for all mandaps across country

The BNP has taken steps to help the authorities ensure a peaceful celebration of Durga Puja across the country, amid concerns over security among the minority community.

Leaders said the party has formed committees for every Puja mandap across Bangladesh so that the Hindus can celebrate their biggest religious festival in a safe, peaceful and festive manner.

BNP acting chairman Tarique Rahman has instructed party leaders to visit the Puja mandaps to ensure a hassle-free celebration.

Following his instructions, the BNP has tasked its organising secretaries with monitoring the work to ensure security in each division during the Puja, party leaders said.

Their resignation letters were sent President Mohammed Shahabuddin yesterday afternoon, confirmed PSC's spokesperson Matiur Rahman.

A PSC member, wishing anonymity, said, "The advisers' panel has asked all members to resign from our posts immediately. We have no other option but to step down."

Former minister Saber Chowdhury Hossain walked out of jail yesterday, hours after being granted bail in six cases.

Later, police released the Awami League leader from the lockup of the Chief Metropolitan Magistrate's Court (CMM) of Dhaka around 6:30pm, said court sources.

Earlier in the day, Dhaka Additional Chief Metropolitan Magistrate Ziadur Rahman granted bail to Saber, exenvironment, forest, and climate change minister and former Awami League lawmaker from Dhaka-9, in two cases filed with Paltan Model Police Station, including one filed over the death of BNP activist Mokbul on December 7, 2022.

The deputy leader of Hezbollah said vesterday the Iran-backed group had moved beyond "painful blows" inflicted by Israel as Israeli forces began ground operations in the southwest of Lebanon, expanding its

Naim Qassem said the conflict between Hezbollah and Israel was a war about who cries first, and that Hezbollah would not cry first. He said its capabilities are still intact after a year of fighting.

"We support the political efforts that (Lebanese parliament Minister Abbas Araqchi said, warning speaker) Nabih Berri is undertaking towards a ceasefire," he said.

Israel's defence minister, meanwhile, said it appeared the replacement for slain Hezbollah leader Sayyed Hassan Nasrallah had been "eliminated", in what would be another big blow for the Iran-backed group in Lebanon.

Defence Minister Yoav Gallant made the announcement about Hashem Safieddine, who has not been heard from publicly since an Israeli airstrike late last week.

INDIA STATE POLLS Congress-NC alliance wins in J&K BJP to form govt in Haryana

The National Conference (NC)-Congress alliance yesterday stormed back to power in Jammu and Kashmir (J&K), India's only Muslim-majority region.

The NC-Congress alliance secured 48 of the 90 seats in J&K assembly and nearest challenger BJP bagged 29 seats in an election held for the first time after the removal of Articles 370 which gave the state a special status under the Constitution.

Congress could manage to win just six seats. The People's Democratic Party. led by former chief minister Mehbooba Mufti, won just three seats.

MACHINE LEARNING WORK Hopfield, Hinton win Nobel Prize in Physics

US scientist John Hopfield and British-Canadian Geoffrey Hinton won the 2024 Nobel Prize in Physics yesterday for discoveries and inventions in machine learning that paved the way for the artificial intelligence boom.

Heralded for its revolutionary potential areas ranging cuttingfrom edge scientific discovery to more efficient admin, emerging

technology on which the duo worked has also raised fears humankind may soon be outsmarted and outcompeted by its own creation.

Hinton has been widely credited as a godfather of AI and made headlines when he guit his job at Google last year to be able to more easily speak about the dangers of the technology he had pioneered.

"We have no experience of what it's like to have things smarter than us," Hinton said over the phone to the Nobel press conference, speaking from a hotel in California.
