

No playground at most primary schools in Pabna

Raihan, a third grader at Alia Madrasa Government Primary School in Pabna municipality, often ventures outside the school compound during recess, defying his teachers' instructions.

The school, housed in a three-storey building on a mere five decimals of land, offers no play area for its students. While most pupils spend their breaks wandering the corridors, a few, like Raihan, sneak outside for some fresh air.

The 34 government primary schools in Pabna town serve 8,000 to 10,000 students, yet all are built on less than 20 decimals of land.

"We lack space for a playground. Since our school is near the road, with traffic constantly moving, we do not allow students outside during breaks for safety," said Fahmida Khatun, the headteacher.

Students at Adarsha Primary School in Radhanagar are slightly more fortunate, as the school has a one decimal area for play. However, this is barely sufficient for the 208 students enrolled in the three-storey school.

"Most of us spend our break times in the classrooms or corridors," said Isha Khatun, a third grader.

Fourth-grader Mostakin added, "There's hardly enough space to run or play properly."

"It's not ideal, but the students have adapted as there's no other option," said Hosne Ara, the headteacher.

Rajbari roads need repair

Most of the roads across Rajbari Municipality have long been in a sorry state due to lack of repair works for years, causing sufferings to residents.



Established in 1913, the municipality with 11.66 sq km area now has a population of 65,410.

Talking to this correspondent, many residents said despite paying all kinds of

taxes regularly, they are being deprived of different civic amenities, including proper road network.

Some of the roads are no longer fit for vehicular movement, but are still being used

by people and vehicles for commute amid risk of accidents, they said. The situation turns worse in monsoon, they added.

They alleged that the municipality authorities neither took accountability for the situation, nor took any steps to ease public sufferings.

Visiting different areas of the town recently, this correspondent observed that the roads have become dilapidated in absence of repairs for a long time, with numerous potholes having formed here and there, while the bitumen surface has worn off in most places.

The condition of some roads is so poor that even a slight rain leaves them filled with puddles and mud, making it difficult for people to walk.

"The roads in the town are in a sorry state. Plying vehicles on these roads has become very risky," said Md Arif Hossain, 29, a battery-run auto-rickshaw driver from Ramkantapur village.

Echoing him, Md Mintu Mondal, 42, another easy-bike driver, said, "Transporting critical patients to hospital has become very difficult due to the dilapidated state of the roads."

A city stuck in gridlock

Barishal's traffic woes deepen as illegal vehicles overrun roads

The rising number of illegal vehicles has become a growing menace in Barishal city, with no enforcement drives conducted against them in the past two months.

As such, all roads and lanes across the city's 58 square km area have been witnessing severe gridlocks.

City dwellers have called upon authorities for immediate steps to increase traffic vigilance and drive against such vehicles.

According to the Transport Division of Barishal City

Corporation, around 5,000 battery-run three-wheelers were issued licenses, alongside 12,000 paddle-rickshaws and 2,500 easy-bikes already plying the city roads.

Sources at Traffic Division of Barishal Metropolitan Police informed 1,594 illegal vehicles were seized and 2,379 cases were lodged in June and July alone.

However, the number of these battery-run three-wheelers is far more than those issued licenses, said Kazi Mizanur Rahman, a city dweller.

Once trials begin, all doubts will be resolved

Says Asif Nazrul

Law Adviser Asif Nazrul yesterday said the prosecution team has gathered substantial evidence of the brutal killings that took place in July and August amid the student-led mass uprising.



He said this while talking to journalists after attending an event at the Sree Sree Mahaprabhu's Akhra Durga Puja Mandap in Sirajganj municipal town in the afternoon.

"Once the trials begin, all doubts and questions will be resolved," he added.

"The International Crimes Tribunal will be formed within a week. However, its work has already begun. Our prosecution team was formed almost a month ago, and the investigation team was set up two weeks ago," Nazrul said.

He said, "In this country, none of us are minorities, and none of us are majorities. We are all citizens of Bangladesh. All of us will enjoy equal dignity and equal rights. We will respect each other's religion. We will all live in peace."

2 die in Netrakona boat capsizing

A woman and her seven-year-old nephew died as their boat capsized in floodwaters in Kalmakanda upazila of Netrakona yesterday morning.

The deceased were identified as Writu Talukder, 20, a first-year student of Kalmakanda Govt College, and her nephew Amit Talukder, a third grader at Horindhara Govt Primary School.

Both were from Horindhara village, police said. Md Firoz Hossain, officer-in-charge of Kalmakanda Police Station, said Writu, Amit, and four other children were on their way to a nearby puja mandap to offer Anjali when their boat capsized. Locals rescued the passengers, but Writu and Amit were pronounced dead after being taken to Kalmakanda Upazila Health Complex in critical condition.

Police recovered the bodies and handed them over to their families. An unnatural death case has been filed in this regard, said the OC.

Fisherman killed by lightning

A fisherman was killed and two others injured in lightning strike in Netrakona's Khaliajuri upazila early yesterday.

The victim was identified as Tanvir Mia, 19, of Gochhikhai village in Khaliajuri.

Quoting locals, Md Mukbul Hossain, officer-in-charge of Khaliajuri Police Station, said Tanvir along with two other fishermen sustained critical wounds as lightning struck them while they were fishing at Yarabaz haor.
