LPG importers demand probe into 2 vessels

The ships alleged to have brought LPG from sanctioned Iran

Two vessels anchored in Chattogram port last week to unload about 70,000 tonnes of liquefied petroleum gas by misreporting the country of origin of the product, said the LPG Operators Association of Bangladesh (LOAB).

The product might be from Iran, a heavily-sanctioned country by the West and international entities, LOAB said.

Subsequently, the industry body requested the Chattogram Port Authority (CPA) and the customs to conduct a thorough investigation of the two vessels.

On October 3, Gaz GMS anchored at the Bay of Bengal and three days later, MT Captain Nikolas. Gaz GMS arrived from the UAE's Sharjah and Captain Nikolas from Oman's Sohar, according to data provided to the

LOAB demanded the port authorities detain the two vessels and their crews, ask for the Certificate of Origin and independently verify

Disclosing the country of origin (COO) of the products is mandatory to get customs clearance and some companies tend to bypass the rule by loading the cargo from another ship, commonly referred to as shipto-ship transfer (STS), and reporting the location of transfer as the source of the products, according to LPG importers.

This misleads the customs and the port authorities.

Data from Kpler, a globally used ship tracker, shows Gaz GMS was loaded ship-to-ship from Sharjah on September 8 and Captain Nikolas from Iran on September 16.

In the letter, LOAB said they will not take responsibility for such "unlawful" activities that violate international sanctions and undermine the integrity of Bangladesh's LPG market.

The organisation also sought intervention from the ministry of power, energy and mineral resources to stop the "malpractice".

Bangladesh likely to keep power deal with Adani

Say sources

Bangladesh is likely to set aside pricing concerns and retain a power purchase pact with India's Adani Power, in the face of supply worries and gloomy prospects for a legal challenge, said two sources with direct knowledge of the matter.

The new government has set up a panel to gauge whether its predecessor's contracts adequately protected the nation's interests, particularly projects faulted for lack of transparency that

were initiated under a special expediting law.

contract being scrutinised over price concerns

is a 2017 deal to buy electricity for 25 years from Adani's \$2-billion, 1,600-MW power plant in India's eastern state of Jharkhand that exclusively supplies Bangladesh.

The project meets nearly a tenth of Bangladesh's demand for power, so cancelling the Adani deal outright would be difficult, however, said one of the sources. Both spoke on condition of anonymity as the matter is a sensitive

Israeli forces fire at UN position in south Lebanon

2 peacekeepers injured; UN chief, France, UK condemn attack; 22 killed in Beirut strike

Israeli forces fired at a watchtower used by UN peacekeepers in southern Lebanon yesterday, injuring two, a UN source said, the third day in a row peacekeepers have reported Israeli fire at their positions as İsrael wages war on Hezbollah.

A separate Israeli strike late on Thursday in the heart of Beirut killed 22 people and injured

more than 100. The target was a senior Hezbollah official - Wafiq Safa - who survived, according to three security sources.

In northern Israel, a Thai worker was killed when Hezbollah fired an anti-tank missile at a farming area, the national ambulance service said. The Israeli air force killed a Hezbollah commander responsible for attacks with anti-tank missiles into the area of Ramot Naftali in northern Israel, the military said.

Hezbollah, however, issued no immediate comment on that claim. The UN source said the UNIFIL peacekeeper tower which came under Israeli fire yesterday is located at the force's main base in Naqoura. Israeli forces yesterday also breached the perimeter of another UNIFIL position which they had fired at on Thursday UN Secretary-General Antonio Guterres, France and

condemned the Israeli attacks that wounded the UN personnel. In New York on Thursday, Israel's UN Ambassador Danny Danon said Israel recommends UNIFIL relocate 5 km (3 miles) north "to avoid danger as fighting intensifies". Israel's military said in a statement on Thursday that its troops operated in the Naqoura area, "next to a UNIFIL base."

Man hurls 'molotov cocktail' at puja mandap

Say locals; he stabs 5 while fleeing; cops claim it's a case of mugging

An unidentified man threw what locals said was a molotov cocktail at idols of a puja mandap in the capital's Tanti Bazar last night.

In a security camera footage the puja organisers showed reporters, a man in a white shirt is seen throwing an object at the mandap and running away. It is not clear in the video what had been hurled by the man.

Puja organisers said the incident happened around 8:00pm.

Bijov Saha, general secretary of Tanti Bazar Puja Udjapon Committee, said, "An unidentified man threw a molotov cocktail at the stage. Thankfully, the idols remain unharmed."

Chandan Kumar Dey, president of the Puja Udjapan Committee, said the man in a white shirt threw a bottle at the mandap. "Some of our volunteers pursued him and caught him. But he stabbed them with a sharp weapon and

He added that there was probably kerosene in the bottle.

The injured, Jhontu Dhar, 45, Shagor Ghosh, 38, Khokon Dhar, 35, Dipto Dey, 26, and Ramijuddin, were admitted to

Obama blasts 'crazy' Trump in 1st rally for Harris

Former US president Barack Obama on Thursday lashed out at "crazy" Donald Trump and urged voters to back Kamala Harris as he brought his star power to the 2024 election campaign trail for the first time.







As he hit the stump in the must-win state of Pennsylvania, Obama also chided Black male voters for what he called hesitancy in supporting Democrat Harris because they "just aren't feeling the idea of having a woman as president.'

Obama trained his fire on Trump during a pumped up rally in Pittsburgh, comparing the Republican's long speeches to late Cuban communist leader Fidel Castro's and calling the billionaire out of touch with ordinary people.

America's first Black president admitted that "this election's going to be tight" as many voters were still struggling with high prices.

But he told the crowd that "what I cannot understand is why anybody would think that Donald Trump will shake things up,", adding: "You think Donald Trump ever changed a diaper?"
