Journos involved with AL govt to face music: Nahid

Journalists who were directly involved with the "fascist" Awami League government and supported and instigated mass killing during the July-August uprising will be brought to justice, Information Adviser Nahid Islam said yesterday.

The adviser said this while briefing reporters at the Dhaka Medical College Hospital after handing over donation checks to the protesters injured in the uprising.

Nahid, however, said a committee has been formed under the Information and Broadcasting Ministry to look into whether cases were filed against any journalist in an unjust manner.

"If any journalist or any member of his family thinks that they are being harassed through the cases, we will assist them if they reach us," added Nahid.

Responding to a question on the allegation of cases being filed against the protesters, Youth and Sports Adviser Asif Mahmud said instructions would be issued from the home ministry shortly so that no action is taken against them.

He also said the police officials who were involved in the killing of the protesters will not be spared, no matter how powerful they are.

Dengue cases surge outside Dhaka

Lack of anti-mosquito drives, public awareness to blame; death toll still higher in capital

The number of dengue cases outside Dhaka has exceeded those within the capital, according to the Directorate General of Health Services.

However, the death toll remains higher in Dhaka.

As of yesterday morning, the total number of dengue cases this year is 42,470, with 24,169 reported outside Dhaka. However, of the 214 deaths, 67 were from outside Dhaka.

Chattogram division leads with 8,203 cases, followed by 6,027 in Dhaka, 3,656 in Barishal, and 3,373 in Khulna, all from non-city corporation areas.

Among the districts, Cox's Bazar has the highest number of cases with 3,536, followed by Narsingdi with 1,265 cases, Chattogram with 1,128, and Barguna with 1,034 cases.

In terms of fatalities, the highest number of deaths occurred at Dhaka Medical College Hospital with 43 deaths, followed by Mugda

Prof Kabirul Bashar, an entomologist from Jahangirnagar University, attributed this shift to several factors.

"The lack of adequate anti-mosquito drives, limited public awareness, and the possibility of infection by all dengue serotypes have contributed to the surge in cases outside Dhaka," he said.

While the mosquito control efforts in Dhaka have been insufficient, Prof Bashar said the situation outside the capital is worse.

"Residents of Dhaka are more aware of dengue than those living in other areas, which is another reason for the rise in cases outside the capital," he added.

Prof Bashar also mentioned that approximately 50 percent of Dhaka's population has been infected by different serotypes of the dengue virus since 2000, providing some level of immunity.

Man duped of Tk 17 lakh in insurance scam

A man in Dhaka was recently cheated out of Tk 17.67 lakh by a group of scammers who lured him with the promise of a \$5 million payout from a fake insurance claim involving a deceased individual in the US.

Following the victim's case filed with New Market Police Station on Saturday, law enforcers arrested Aziz Molla, one of the fraudsters, from an office called "Model Agency" in Banasree yesterday, said Talebur Rahman, Deputy Commissioner (Media) of Dhaka Metropolitan Police.

Primary registration for hajj by Oct 23

The religious affairs ministry yesterday advised prospective hajj pilgrims to complete primary registration for next year's Hajj by October 23.

The hajj division of the ministry issued a notice in this regard.

The notice highlights that, as per the roadmap outlined by the Saudi government, the process for allocating tents at Mina and Arafat and signing contracts with service companies will begin on October 23.

The notice said tent allocation will be conducted on a "first come, first serve" basis. Failure to complete registration by the deadline will result in pilgrims being unable to secure tents in preferred zones at Mina and Arafat.

Legal experts have praised the appointments as a recognition of the vital contributions women are making to the legal profession.

They believe that the inclusion of five women in the High Court Division will serve as an inspiration for future generations, encouraging more women to pursue careers in law.

Nazmun Ara Sultana, Bangladesh's first female justice in both the High Court and

Appellate Division, welcomed the move.

"Five out of 23 judges being women is certainly great news. It's a hopeful sign, but we must continue to increase the number of women in the judiciary. I would have been even happier if it were more than 10," she said.

Sultana further said women are excelling in the legal field, often outperforming their male colleagues.

Barrister Jyotirmoy Barua also praised the decision, noting that it reflects a shift from past

tokenism toward merit-based appointments of women.

He added that more women are entering the legal profession, breaking barriers, and excelling despite challenges. At universities, female students are performing as well as their male counterparts, and with specialised law studies, the chance of producing quality lawyers is growing.

"If senior lawyers create opportunities, we will get good lawyers, and good lawyers lead to good judges," he said.
