The government has appointed Salahuddin Noman Chowdhury as the new ambassador and permanent representative of Bangladesh to the United Nations in New York. This order was issued in this regard yesterday.



Current Ambassador and Permanent Representative of Bangladesh to the UN in New York Muhammad Abdul Muhith is set to go on retirement in December this year.

Ambassador Chowdhury joined the Bangladesh Embassy in Kathmandu on 11 November 2020.

After graduating from the Bangladesh University of Engineering and Technology in 1993, he worked in the private sector for five years until joining the Bangladesh Foreign Service in 1998.

In his diplomatic career, he worked in the Bangladesh embassies in New Delhi, Islamabad and New York in various capacities. In the headquarters, he held positions in departments like Administration, External Publicity, Multilateral Economic Affairs, Protocol, United Nations, South East Asia and Foreign Service Academy.

health. It also conducted a nationwide study which gathered insights from over 150 organisations and educational institutions, alongside consultations at divisional and district levels. The findings revealed that students have been exposed to violent protests, arson, and even shootings, leading to school closures and curfews. This forced them to stay home, resulting in a range of psychological issues, including fear, anxiety, sleep disturbances, depression, and even violent tendencies.

The floods further disrupted education, causing health problems and school absenteeism, they said in the study.

Kazi Faruk Ahmed, a member of the National Education Policy 2010 formulation committee, pointed out that the curriculum reform before Covid-19 did not adequately

incorporate stakeholders' feedback, which negatively affected students. He called for greater collaboration among teachers, students, parents, and education stakeholders.

Prof MA Mohit Kamal, senior chief consultant at Labaid Cardiac Hospital, urged parents and teachers to prioritise the mental health of primary students, adding that the ongoing protests have left a deep emotional impact on them. Prof M Nazmul Haque, director of the Teacher Development Institute, said trauma comes from family environments in the first place. Children are mostly affected by their parents' stress.

Rasheda K Choudhury, executive director of CAMPE, said the meeting's recommendations would be submitted to the government for consideration.

lifelong advocate for human rights, highlighting his efforts against extrajudicial killings, enforced disappearances, and torture. The organisation said he has faced backlash for speaking out against violence and repression. Panna was always a staunch defender of freedom of expression and the rights of religious and ethnic minorities.

Similarly, the Bangladesh Legal Aid and Services Trust demanded the immediate withdrawal of Panna's name from the case and an inquiry into why he was implicated. BLAST also recalled that Panna had previously faced harassment in court during the student movement, where state counsel insulted him for his role, calling him a "traitor".

The organisation warned that such "harassing" cases obstruct justice for the real victims of the July-August student movement. BLAST urged high-level action to ensure justice for the July massacre victims, provide legal aid to the injured, and halt the ongoing

MSF accused authorities of trying to malign prominent rights defenders, thereby hindering freedom of expression. It said filing indiscriminate cases undermines the justice system and erodes public trust.

Human Rights Forum Bangladesh (HRFB) also condemned the lawsuit, saying it obstructs justice and suppresses dissent. HRFB described the case as a disgraceful attempt to silence civil society and stifle freedom of thought and expression.

Besides, Communist Party of Bangladesh also condemned the case.

Md Baker, 52, filed the case with Khilgaon Police Station accusing 180 persons including Panna on charge of shooting his son Ahadul Islam on July 19.

a commission to develop a "Business Integrity Strategy" aimed at enhancing transparency within the private sector.

TIB referred to media reports stating that the government plans to establish four reform commissions focused on health, media, labour, and women's rights in the second phase of its reform initiatives.

While welcoming these efforts, TIB Executive Director Iftekharuzzaman cautioned against the risk of corporate power being captured by a subset of the private sector, leading to corruption, money laundering, and collusion with political and bureaucratic actors.

"It is impossible to achieve meaningful results without the involvement of the private sector. Excluding them undermines efforts to build a fair and discrimination-free Bangladesh," he said.

Complications with land acquisition and perimeter wall construction have stalled development, as per sources. According to the university's engineering department, four companies were initially contracted for various works under this project. Starlight Service Limited and RS Limited got a Tk 61.89 crore contract for constructing a five-storey engineering building, while Kingdom Builders was given the tender for boundary wall construction at the expense of Tk 33 crore.

RN Enterprise was allocated Tk 3.28 crore for pond renovation.

Meanwhile, a company named UADL was given Tk 32 crore in two phases for excavating the lake.

Despite the initial payment being made to these entities, work is progressing at a sluggish pace. The authorities cited incomplete land acquisition as the reason for delays. But students attributed the prolonged delay to apathy and corruption.

"In the last six years, the lack of visible development has been fuelled by bureaucratic delays, corruption, land acquisition problems, and construction setbacks," said Toukir Ahmed, a student of journalism.

Project Director Syed Ali Ahmed said land acquisition is managed by registrar's office. "Land development and building construction are ongoing, and we have not encountered any obstacles so far," he said.

Chief Engineer Helal Uddin Patwari declined to comment on corruption allegations. JnU VC Prof Rezaul Karim acknowledged the concerns and vowed to expedite the completion of the new campus.
