## Start process of holding free, fair election

BNP urges govt, warns of plot to destabilise country

Stating that conspiracies are afoot to destabilise the country, senior BNP leader Zainul Abdin Farroque yesterday called upon the interim government to promptly initiate the process of a fair election without delaying reforms.

"A conspiracy is afoot to weaken the interim government, and it is disrupting the reform process. I urge Chief Adviser Dr Muhammad Yunus to stay vigilant to this," he said.

Speaking at a sit-in programme, the BNP chairperson's advisory council member also said the government should complete reforms to the Election Commission urgently based on the opinions of the political parties to start the election process.

The Senbagh Forum in Dhaka arranged the programme in front of the Jatiya Press Club, demanding the withdrawal of all cases filed against BNP acting chairman Tarique Rahman.

Farroque also demanded that former prime minister Sheikh Hasina, who fled to India on August 5, be brought back home immediately.

# TV channels up in arms over govt's TRP system

The state-run mechanism keeps generating unreliable ratings, says owners' platform

On August 5 and 6, several TV channels including ATN News, Asian TV and Bijov TV went off air as an angry mob vandalised its broadcasting

And yet, the Bangladesh Satellite Company's (BSCL) Television Rating Point (TRP) system showed ATN News had 2.84 lakh viewers. Similarly, Asian TV and Bijoy TV also generated ratings.

It was this anomaly that made the TV channel owners lose their patience with the unreliable TRP system, which cost the state about Tk 5.7 crore, and call for

abandoning it entirely, The Daily Star has learnt from stakeholders, who spoke on the condition of anonymity.

The TRP system measures the viewership of different channels, enabling advertisers to allocate more ad money to support popular programmes. In other words, good quality programmes would be rewarded with more ads

TV channels call for scrapping the system

Before the BSCL-built TRP system began commercial operation in April this year, the service was provided by one of the multinational market research firms, as is practice globally.

But on the request of Hasan Mahmud, the former minister, information BSCL took up the project to develop a homegrown TRP system, with some of the purchases for the project made on 'personal connection'.

The episode is yet another instance of how the previous Awami League regime misused public funds at will,

disregarding business case for a project. During the project, BSCL said it will generate

revenues of Tk 50 lakh to Tk 70 lakh per month. However, it is now earning only about Tk 45.1 lakh per month from 32 TV channels and two advertising agencies, while incurring expenses of approximately Tk 28 lakh per month.

### DU official dies falling down lift shaft

An official of Dhaka University died yesterday morning after falling down a lift shaft from the seventh floor at the Centre for Advanced Research in Sciences (CARS) building.

Critically Abdulllah, Mohammad senior assistant director (accounts) of the Fine Arts Faculty, died while undergoing treatment at Dhaka Medical College Hospital.

According to campus sources, admission tests for Bangladesh Agricultural University (BAU) were being held at the CARS building in the morning.

Abdullah had gone to the dean's office on the seventh floor of the CARS building to collect honorariums to be given to the invigilators.

## Israeli strike kills 3 journos in Lebanon

Beirut terms the strike a 'war crime'

An Israeli strike killed at least three journalists and wounded several others as they slept in guesthouses in southern Lebanon yesterday, Lebanon's health ministry said, in what Beirut declared a "war

US Secretary of State Antony Blinken said there was an urgency to get a diplomatic resolution to the conflict in Lebanon, a day after he said Washington did not want to see a protracted campaign there by its ally Israel.

Beirut authorities say the offensive has killed more than 2,500 people and displaced more than 1.2 million people, the majority of them over the last month. creating a humanitarian

"We have a sense of real urgency in getting to a diplomatic resolution and the full implementation of UN Security Council Resolution 1701, such that there can be real security along border between Israel

and Lebanon," Blinken said in London.

He said it was important so "people at both sides of the border can have the confidence to ... return to their homes".

The journalists killed were camera operator Ghassan Najjar and engineer Mohamed Reda of the pro-Iranian news outlet Al-Mayadeen and camera operator Wissam Qassem, who worked for Hezbollah's Al-Manar, the outlets said in separate statements.


