'A GREAT MOMENT'

This was only the second time that India were whitewashed in a home Test series, the only other instance coming back in 2000 when South Africa won 2-0 against India.

This, however, is the first time that India have been whitewashed in a home series of three or more Tests.

New Zealand became the fourth side to whitewash India in a series of 3+ Tests after England (4), Australia (3), and West Indies (1).

It is also the first time that New Zealand won three Tests in a series home or away and the first instance of the Kiwis winning three successive away Tests.

New Zealand defended 147 to win the third Test -- the second-lowest total ever defended by the Kiwis in Tests.

Coming in after a harrowing 2-0 Test loss in Sri Lanka, New Zealand defied all expectations on Sunday to whitewash a strong India, a side that had won each of their last 18 series at home since 2012 when England won 2-1.

Chasing 147 for victory in the third and final Test, India were bowled out for 121 in 29.1 overs on day three, and it was Mumbai-born spinner Ajaz Patel who took six wickets to help New Zealand to a thrilling 25-run win at Mumbai's Wankhede Stadium.

New Zealand's Tom Latham, who was appointed as the new Test captain after the outing in Sri Lanka, cherished the win that came on the back of their eightwicket win in first Test and a 113-run victory in the second.

"It's obviously a great moment for New Zealand cricket, probably one of New Zealand cricket's greatest series wins I

think," said Kiwis' skipper Latham.
"Again, all we can do is keep playing cricket and keep playing our brand of cricket. We've felt a lot of support over the last couple of weeks, which is really

In a tricky chase on a turning pitch, New Zealand reduced India to 29-5, before the left-hander Rishabh Pant (64 off 57) counter-attacked with his half-century.

Ajaz, after lunch, had Pant caught by wicketkeeper Tom Blundell, a decision denied by the on-field umpire but successfully reviewed by New Zealand. An unconvinced Pant trudged back.

"If we say something, it will not go down well. If the decision is not conclusive then the decision has to stand with what the on-field umpire calls," said India skipper Rohit Sharma.

"I don't know how that decision was overturned."

Rohit also took the blame for India hitting the nadir.

"This will be a very low point in my career, having lost three games at home," Rohit told reporters. "I fully take responsibility for that."

Meanwhile, India legend Sachin Tendulkar called for "introspection" following a humiliating series loss which he said was "a tough pill to swallow".

City, Arsenal slip as Liverpool go top

Manchester City suffered their first Premier League loss since December as Bournemouth stunned the champions, while Arsenal were rocked by Newcastle and Liverpool seized top spot on Saturday.

City were unbeaten in their previous 32 league games, dating back to a defeat at Aston Villa last year. But Pep Guardiola's second-placed side saw that streak come to an unexpected end in a 2-1 loss on England's south coast.

Bournemouth recently damaged Arsenal's title hopes with a 2-0 win at the Vitality Stadium and they inflicted pain on City.

City were rocked in the ninth minute when Bournemouth winger Antoine Semenyo drilled one home. Evanilson doubled Bournemouth's lead in the 64th minute with a composed finish. Josko Gvardiol's header reduced the deficit in the 82nd minute, but it was too late to save City from a second defeat in four days.

Meanwhile, Newcastle put a huge dent in fourth placed Arsenal's title aspirations with a 1-0 win at St James' Park.

Alexander Isak scored a 12th-minute header as Mikel Arteta's Arsenal, runners-up to City for the past two years, have taken just one point from their last three games and are seven points adrift of first place. At Anfield, Liverpool were in danger of a surprise loss of their own before regrouping to take advantage of their rivals' stumbles with a 2-1 win over Brighton.

Ferdi Kadioglu gave Brighton the lead in the 14th minute with a fierce strike but Cody Gakpo bagged the equaliser in the 69th minute before Mohamed Salah put Liverpool ahead three minutes later.

"We don't have shortage of effort to develop women's football. We also asked the previous government for financial and infrastructural support. Without the support, we will not be able to take football to the next level. We also make the same demands to the interim government," said Kiron, who returned from an AFC Congress on Saturday.

Profession Chief Adviser Muhammad Yunus on Saturday accorded a reception to the SAFF winning team at the State Guest House, Jamuna, and asked the players to present their individual

demands in written. Thanking the chief adviser Asia," Kiron told reporters at the for the reception and financial

incentive for the footballers, Kiron said, "We know the Chief Adviser promised to address the players' individual demands but we, the BFF, also want to place a development proposal before the interim government after discussing the matter with the newly elected executive committee. "We can't roll competitions for

women's football regularly for the lack of the grounds, so we want a dedicated ground for women footballers," Kiron said. "If the government provides us with a BKSP-like academy and a training ground, it will be useful towards the development of women's football."

Kiron also said that they would seek financial help for the coaching staff including foreign coaches and help for arranging FIFA friendly matches.

"The women's team don't often get opportunity to play FIFA friendly matches due to shortage of fund, so if the government supports us to play at least five to six friendly matches in the FIFA window every year, it is possible to go beyond the South Asian level," said Kiron.
