Malaysia asked to extradite 2 businessmen

The duo allegedly involved in human trafficking, money laundering, extortion

The Bangladesh police has asked Malaysian authorities to arrest and extradite two businessmen as part of an ongoing investigation into allegations of money laundering, extortion and migrant trafficking against the

The two businessmen are Aminul Islam, a Bangladeshborn Malaysian citizen, and Ruhul Amin Swapan, owner of a Bangladeshi recruiting agency named Catharsis International.

The Daily Star reviewed the letter sent by the National Central Bureau (NCB) of Interpol in Bangladesh to the Malaysia NCB on October 24.

It requested the Malaysian authorities to temporarily halt the operation of Foreign Workers Centralized Management System (FWCMS), a software provided to the Malaysian home ministry by Bestinet – an information technology organisation founded by Aminul.

The communication is part of an investigation in connection with a case filed on September 3 by Altaf Khan, a recruiting agent, who accused 103 individuals, including former expatriates' welfare minister Imran Ahmad and SEE PAGE 10 COL 5

DEATH IN 'MOB BEATING' Locals, family contradict police version

A day after police claimed former state minister Monnujan Sufian's nephew was killed by a mob in Khulna's Daulatpur, locals and a family member yesterday said there was no incident of mob violence in the area that day.

Sheikh Arifuzzaman Rupam, 34, was declared dead on arrival at Khulna Medical College Hospital, where the joint forces took him after a mob beat him up on Monday, said Inspector Shahidul Islam of Daulatpur Police Station.

He said the incident took place on Anjuman Masjid Road in Amtala area

But four residents of the neighbourhood vesterday said the joint forces detained Rupam, and then took him to his home and tortured him. When he fell sick, they took him to the hospital, but it was

They saw several vehicles belonging to the joint forces arrive in their neighbourhood early in the morning and remain there for a while.

They added there was no mob violence in the area that day.

Israel's military issued new evacuation orders in the north of the Gaza Strip yesterday after carrying out strikes across the enclave which Palestinian media and medics said had killed at least 35 people.

An air strike damaged two houses in the town

of Beit Lahiya in northern Gaza, where the army has carried out new operations since October 5, and killed at least 20 people late on Monday, the Palestinian official news agency WAFA and Hamas media said.

Four other people were killed in the central Gazan town of Al-Zawayda around midnight on medics said.

Palestinian health officials said six people had

also been killed in two separate Israeli airstrikes the United Arab Emirates, said Rik Peeperkorn, in Gaza City and Deir Al-Balah in the central area of the narrow enclave.

The Israel Defense Forces (IDF) said without giving details, that its forces had "eliminated terrorists" in the central Gaza Strip and Jabalia area. Israeli troops had also located weapons and explosives over the past day in the southern Rafah area, where "terrorist infrastructure sites"

had been eliminated, it said.

Later yesterday, Israeli planes dropped leaflets over Beit Lahiya ordering residents who have not yet left their homes and shelters housing displaced families to quit the town completely. At least 43,391 Palestinians have been killed

in more than a year of offensive in Gaza, the authorities in Gaza said yesterday, and much

of the territory has been reduced to ruins.

Announcing a rare transfer of patients out of Gaza, a World Health Organization official said more than 100 people would be evacuated from including today, children suffering from trauma injuries and chronic diseases.

They will travel via the Kerem Shalom crossing with Israel before flying to

WHO representative for the Occupied Palestinian Territory.

Some will then go on to Romania, he said, adding that 12,000 people were awaiting transfer. In the Israeli-occupied West Bank, the Palestinian health ministry said at least four

Govt revokes accreditation of 29 more journalists

The government has revoked the permanent and temporary press accreditation cards of 29 more journalists, including reporters, newspaper editors, and television chief executive officers.

An order dated November 3 was issued in this regard, signed by Md Nizamul Kabir, chief information officer of the Press Information Department under the Ministry of Information and Broadcasting.

According to the notification, the move was made as per sections 6.9, 6.10, 9.5, and 9.6 of the Press Accreditation Principle-2022. On October 29, 20 journalists had lost their accreditation in a similar fashion.

Among those whose accreditations were scrapped in the second phase are TV Today Editor-in-Chief Monjurul Ahsan Bulbul; Kaler Kantho Editor Emdadul Haque Milon; News24 Head of News Rahul Raha; ATN News's Head of News Nurul Amin Probhas; Daily Destiny's Sohel Haider Chowdhury; Somoy TV's Ahmed Zobayer; News24's Joydev Chandra Das; BSS's Md Omar Faruque; Kaler Kantho's Haider Ali; Soma Islam of Channel I; Daily Purbakon's Kuddus Afrad; Baishakhi TV's Saiful Islam; Freelancer Nadim Kadir; BSS's Madhusudhan Mondal; Independent TV's Ashish Ghosh Saikat, Dainik Bangla's Zafarullah Sharafat; Dainik Anandabazar's Kishore Kumar Sarker; Daily Bangladesh Bulletin's Rafiqul Islam Ratan; MyTV's Nasir Uddin; Ekushey TV's Akhil Kumar Podder; Gazi TV's Anjan Roy; RTV's CEO Ashiqur Rahman; and Daily Bhorer Kagaj's news editor Ikhtiar Uddin.

The Committee to Protect Journalists (CPJ) has voiced alarm over the revocation of press accreditation of these journalists "perceived to be in support of the Awami League". In a post on social media platform 'X' vesterday, the CPJ said the interim authorities must not target journalists for their work, thereby risking media censorship.

There should be reconciliation among parties

German envoy says it'll ensure peaceful transition to democracy

German Ambassador to Bangladesh Achim Tröster has advocated for reconciliation between and within the political parties for a peaceful

transition to democracy. "This is an idea that has worked well in the recent past in countries like South Africa or Rwanda, but equally in Europe. I don't see any reason why this should not be the case in Bangladesh and contribute to a much better communal life," he said at an event marking the German Unity Day at the Franco-German Embassy in the capital Monday evening.

The comment comes as the interim government has undertaken various reforms following the fall of Awami League regime on August 5 amid a mass uprising. Political rivalries, lack of democratic practices, and accountability created a wide array of problems over the years.

The envoy said large parts of the society in Bangladesh were willing to assume enormous personal sacrifices, up to the ultimate, for freedom, participatory democracy, and more SEE PAGE 10 COL 1

'Why was Hasina given refuge in India?' Jharkhand CM hits back at BJP for accusing JMM of fostering infiltration

India's Jharkhand Chief Minister Hemant Soren on Sunday fired back at the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) for accusing his party, Jharkhand Mukti Morcha (JMM), of fostering Bangladeshi infiltration in the state.

Soren questioned the central government's decision to provide refuge to ousted Bangladeshi prime minister Sheikh Hasina, pressing for clarity on the BJP's



stance on relations with Bangladesh. He also criticised the supply of electricity from Jharkhand's Godda power plant to Bangladesh "while locals bear the environmental cost".

Speaking at a rally in Ranka, Garhwa, the CM challenged the BJP's infiltration claims, saying, "I would like to know whether the BJP has some sort of internal understanding with Bangladesh," while demanding an explanation for Hasina's stay in India.
