students, and villagers alike. "If it collapses entirely, it will cause major disruptions for us all," he said.

Contacted, Ferdous, one of the fish farmers involved, said he was in Dhaka and claimed, "I'm collecting what I'm owed from Sani, so I went ahead with the fish harvest. But I don't know if this is what's causing the road to collapse."

Sani, however, disagreed, saying, "I advised against draining the canal, but Ferdous ignored me and continued. He is responsible for this damage." Kalapara Upazila Assistant Commissioner (Land), Kaushik Ahmed, visited the site after being informed of the situation.

He confirmed that the canal soil was indeed excavated illegally last year, and that water removal from the canal this year has further weakened the road's structure.

"We estimate the damage to the road at Tk 50 crore. We are initiating legal action against those responsible for these unlawful activities," he said.

Other recommendations included ending the surveillance and harassment of journalists, implementing journalist protection legislation, and reforming the Bangladesh Press Council to establish it as an independent entity.

CPJ also advocated for improved press accreditation processes, unrestricted visas for foreign journalists, and unimpeded access to media outlets and internet services.

It said these reforms are crucial for safeguarding press freedom and ensuring a robust, independent press in Bangladesh amid growing threats to media rights.

Railway cancels lease of 24 privately-run trains

BR, amid a huge crisis of manpower, started a private sector association of its commercial and other activities in 1997.

Under the arrangement, a private company, through competitive bidding, will earn the job of selling train tickets as fixed by BR and checking those on board.

The company will give a fixed amount to BR yearly and take the rest of the money they will earn from selling tickets to passengers.

Currently, 37 trains are now being operated by private operators, with

most of them operated by four companies - LR Trading, TM Trading, SR Trading, and NL Trading - reportedly owned by Ripan and his family, sources said.

In the letter, the ministry also said the railway authority in April 2019 decided not to lease out any more trains on private operation due to different complexities.

As per the contracts, the authority can cancel the contract for violations of conditions like carrying people on the trains' rooftops and overcharging passengers.

The letter, however, did

not mention any particular reason behind the cancellation of the lease of 24 trains.

BR sources, however, said Ripan has established a monopoly in private operators of railways by opening several companies.

He managed some previous ministers and top officials to continue the jobs without any fresh bidding, they said.

However, the BR DG could not give details on the fate of the rest of the 13 trains that are also operated by private operators.

Meanwhile, a BR official

said several petitions are now pending with the High Court over the 13 trains, and that's why the ministry did not take any decision about them.

The ministry, however, asked a joint secretary of the ministry to talk with the Attorney General's Office so that petitions could be disposed of soon, he said, wishing anonymity.

Both zones have already started the process to cancel the contracts and initiate a fresh bidding process soon, BR sources said.

The Daily Star could not reach Ripan over the phone for comments.

democratic '72 constitution to famine, laundering of billions [of takas], and extrajudicial killings of thousands of dissidents and opponents (1972-75, 2009-2024). Then, we can talk about pre-'71 Sheikh Mujib. Without apologies and trials of fascists, there won't be any kind of reconciliation."

When contacted, the president's press secretary, Joyal Abedin, did not respond.

However, a press wing official said the photo of Bangabandhu was present on Sunday night when three new advisers took their oath in Darbar Hall.

"They went home after the oath programme; I have no knowledge about the

incident," he added. According to Article 4A of Bangladesh's Constitution, "The Portrait of the Father of the Nation, Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman shall be preserved and displayed" in key government offices, including those of the president, prime minister, Speaker, and chief justice, as well as in government and semi-government offices, educational institutions, and embassies.

In 2000, the Awami League government passed a law making it obligatory for all government offices to display Bangabandhu's portrait. However, this law was repealed in 2001 when the BNP-led government took office.

During COP15 in Copenhagen, a global fund was promised, in which developed countries were supposed to deposit \$100 billion a year to help underdeveloped nations battle climate change. Even though COP29 is about to start, the first \$100 billion for the fund has yet to be raised.

Civil society groups said 300 million people are suffering from food insecurity around the world and need to adapt to climate change impacts. "The existing climate financing system is

extremely unfair and debt-driven. So, the New Collective Quantified Goal on Climate Change [NCQG] must be designed through ensuring a percentage of Gross National Income of developed countries," said Aminul Hoque, who represents Bangladeshi NGO EquityBD.

Thaikk Kariyawasan, from Sri Lanka, said to get global temperatures back to pre-industrial levels, the global annual greenhouse gas emissions gap must be narrowed, and this will be possible by relentlessly strengthening mitigation action for this decade.

"So, COP29 must deliver a clear timeline for transitioning away from fossil fuels, leading to complete phase out," he said.

Tetet Neura Lauron, of from Philippines and representing the Rosa Luxemburg Foundation, said international financial institutions and the industrialised countries must stop their overreliance on private sector and plan in a participatory manner.

"We urgently need public finance policies, priorities, and governance to push a 1.5-degree aligned, just transition, rooted in collective wellbeing

following global and local equity," she added.

Soumya Datta of India said Azerbaijan has an opportunity to show genuine climate leadership, learning from previous COP events by focusing the debate on the decarbonisation dilemmas of Petro-states.

and election commissioners. If they are not qualified, there would be many obstacles in the way of holding fair elections," he said.

Abu Hena said the political parties need to pick qualified persons as their candidates for the elections.

"The selection process of the party's candidates should be fairer. The candidates should be selected by the grassroots, not the high-ups, he said.

In response to a question over the amendment of the Representation of People Order (RPO), he stressed enforcement of laws rather than bringing amendments to these.

Noting that it is the Election Commission that enforces the laws, the former CEC said, "If there

are qualified people, they can conduct good elections even during the regime of political governments."

Meanwhile, Electoral System Reform Commission's chief Dr Badiul Alam Majumdar said they are reviewing all laws and rules and have identified many issues.

"We hope that we will place our proposals in time," he said.

Dr Majumdar said they have received many proposals from political parties, formally and informally.

"Hopefully we will receive more proposals. I will present recommendations based on everyone's opinions. We hope it will pave the way for fair and impartial elections," said the chief of the electoral system reform commission.
