The mirror often reflects only surface beauty, but true beauty lies within-resilience and spirit define a person. A Rising Lioness: In Search of Beauty, a powerful dance drama directed and choreographed by Adity Roy, founder of Adity Dance CIC, a UK-registered organisation, challenges conventional notions of beauty. Inspired by the extraordinary life of Jannatul Ferdous Ivy—a burn survivor, writer, filmmaker, and human rights activist—the production is a moving exploration of inner strength.

Sponsored Hamlets, Tower Queen Mary University, Arts Council England and Stonebridge Legal Solutions, the two-day show took place at Rich Mix Centre in the UK on November 15 and 16, paying a tribute to Ivy's remarkable journey of hope and perseverance.

Named one the BBC's 100 most inspirational and powerful women in 2023, Ivy has emerged as a beacon of strength-

not just for marginalised

individuals or trauma survivors but for anyone hesitant to live their life in full spirit. She has transformed 28 years of pain into a source of strength, dedicating herself to empowering burn survivors and women with disabilities since 2019. Through her work, she inspires positive perspectives and self-help skills within these communities.

Reflecting on the performance, Ivy shared, "It was surreal to witness the artistes portray my journey through dance. The language of the performance, expressed through various dance forms, was tremendous. I'm so grateful to

Adity and her team. Adity is a true patriot and a beautiful human being, who brings voice to those often unheard through her dance."

The production narrates a story of perseverance and transformation. It begins with a young woman enjoying a love-filled life, tragically altered by a devastating burn accident that scars 60% of her body. Abandoned by her romantic partner and burdened by trauma, she endures numerous surgeries and countless societal rejections. Yet, she rises

> above adversity, pursuing higher education, writing, filmmaking, and mountain hiking- all while inspiring others to build a more inclusive society.

of Beauty, we fused Bharatanatyam's rich tradition, ballet's elegance, and contemporary dance's emotive fluidity to create a transformative narrative."

Through intricate choreography and emotive expressions, Adity captured the protagonist's pain, resilience, and triumph, leaving audiences deeply moved. The smooth integration of diverse dance forms reflected the story's complexity, forging a profound connection with viewers from all walks of life.

"This drama is more than just a performance; it is a celebration of the human spirit's capacity to rise above adversity," Ivy remarked. "Adity's choreography breathes life into the narrative, showcasing how art can communicate complex emotions that transcend language. The devotion and dedication in the dance create a spiritual and emotional experience that lingers long after the curtain falls.'

Adity was joined on stage by the talented cast members Urmee Mazher, Sneha Shill, Sarah Lowe, Emma Clandon, Emma Levene, Athena Fairchild, Dr Suha Priyadarshini Chakravorty and Daniel Jarvis, and assistant producer Tazminah Edoo, who brought Ivy's story to life. ROAD CONSTRUCTION WORK

Sand lifting threatens Kuakata reserve forest

A contractor of Patuakhali Local Government Engineering Department (LGED) is extracting sand from Kuakata reserve forest for construction of a paved road, affecting trees under the green belt of the

Large and small ditches inside the forest area, caused by the sand lifting, not only posing threat to the reserve forest, but also destroying numerous trees of the plantation project.

Locals said despite repeated complaints to the authorities concerned nothing has been done so far to stop the heinous act.

Patuakhali LGED is constructing a 10-kilometrelong and 16-feet-wide road on both sides of Kuakata Zero Point to facilitate movement of tourists in Kuakata beach area.

Local contraction firm Younus and Brothers got the work order and conducting the construction work of the road at a cost of Tk 22.27 crore.

In the first phase, sand filling work to build a five kilometre portion of the paved road, stretching from Kuakata Zero Point to Gangamati area, is going on.

Sub-contractor Kabir Hossain, who was given the task of earth filling, was supposed to buy sand from local markets and use it in the road work, but extracting sand from inside the reserved forest area by installing dredger machines and using it in the road construction work.

As a result, numerous trees are dying due to creation of large ditches in the forest area, caused by

the illegal sand extraction. While talking to this correspondent, Kalapara Upazila Nirbahi Officer (UNO) Rabiul Islam said after learning about the matter he sent the assistant commissioner (Land) and stopped the sand extraction.

However, the upazila administration's statement does not match the reality as sand lifting is still going on in full swing.

Local resident Dulal Fakir said the areas from where the sand is being extracted should be filled up immediately, otherwise it will surely damage the nearby flood control dyke.

Another local Babul Munshi said the coastal flood control dyke basically protect us from various natural disasters including cyclones.

Despite repeated attempts sub-contractor Kabir Hossain refused to make any comment in this regard and said sand is being supplied as per the rules. Mahipur Range Officer Abul Kalam said an influential gang is extracting sand from the reserved forest to build a road and the matter has been already reported to the upazila administration.

The National Committee on Air Pollution Control, in its second meeting last year, made a similar decision to prevent water, air, and sound pollution, said officials.

Moinul told The Daily Star yesterday that they usually carry out EIA based on the project size. Now, they will make EIA and ECC mandatory for every project. He added that some of

the DPPs are now at the preliminary stage and some at the advance stage.

Responding to a question, Moinul said, "Yes. It would take time to carry out the assessments, but we will do as per the directive."

Another top RHD official said some of the pending DPPs may not be moved forward for now given the changed situation.

But it will take time to do EIAs for the other proposed projects in the approval process and thus the number of RHD projects will decrease in the coming days, the official said, wishing not to be named.
