

## Aviation officials slam

Novoair Managing Director Mofizur Rahman said, "Biman can be given the responsibility of the ground handling operations of the third terminal if it considered eligible compared to other operators."

He questioned how the Tk 7,000 crore third terminal project escalated to Tk 22,000 crore in just a few years, eventually reaching Tk 25,000 crore, insinuating possible corruption.

"The second terminal of Kempegowda International Airport in Bengaluru came into full operation in 2022 at a cost of only Tk 7,000 crore and the area of this terminal is three times bigger than the HSA third terminal," he said.

He also stressed the need for the construction of a second runway to tap into the prospect of the third terminal.

In response to dissatisfaction, Civil Aviation Adviser AF Hassan Arif said the government is evaluating Biman's capacity for ground handling. He said the ministry will sit with all

stakeholders to hear their concerns about appointing Biman as the ground handling service provider and will work accordingly.

Arif also noted that the third terminal is expected to become operational within a year.

Arif emphasised that measures are being taken to address customer complaints about ticketing and service quality, ensuring accountability through transparent oversight.

Former Biman board member Kazi Wahidul Alam also lambasted Biman and Civil Aviation Authority of Bangladesh for their failure in ensuring quality services at HSA.

Air Vice Marshal Monjur Kabir Bhuiyan, chairman, CAAB; ATJFB President Tanzim Anwar; Imran Asif, CEO of Air Astra; Air Commodore Abu Sayeed Mehboob, a member, CAAB; Group Captain Kamrul Islam, executive director, HSA; Suhed Ahmed Chowdhury, cargo manager, Qatar Airways and KM Mozibul Hoque, chairman, Shah Group, also spoke.

Speakers also emphasised the need for recognition of indigenous rights and greater political consensus.

Bazlur Rashid Firoz, general secretary of Bangladesh Samajtantrik Dal, said, "The CHT crisis requires political solutions. The interim government must include the accord's implementation in its reform plans."

Saiful Haque, general secretary of Biplobi Workers' Party, called for a high-powered reform commission to evaluate unimplemented provisions. "Demographic changes in the region will not resolve the crisis," he said.

The discussion was presided over by Dhaka University Prof Khairul Islam Chowdhury, a joint coordinator of the movement, and moderated by Dipayan Khisa, central committee member of the PCJSS.

Mein Thain Promila, treasurer of the Bangladesh Indigenous Peoples Forum, also spoke at the event.

## Frustration high in the hills

**KS Mong:** So-called regional political parties that did not emerge from genuine aspirations of the people but were formed by vested quarters for particular objectives should not exist once the peace accord is fully implemented.

When the accord was signed, all hill communities unitedly supported it. Not only the hill people but also progressive and democratic-minded individuals across the country backed its full implementation. Therefore, we are indeed united. The question of why the hill communities cannot remain united is irrelevant in this context.

**TDS:** The current government is promising reforms in different areas. However, the hill people have expressed concerns that their representation was not ensured in the reform commissions. How do the hill communities perceive this issue?

**KS Mong:** The indigenous communities of CHT have consistently advocated for an inclusive Bangladesh. We have neither talked about separatism nor demanded it. After the uprising, the government pledged reforms and promised a "new Bangladesh." This is seen as a positive step by the hill people.

The hill communities believe that if their representation and inclusion in all spheres are ensured, they will benefit from this new vision. Since there is still time, we hope the government will avoid repeating past mistakes.

**TDS:** It has been nearly 27 years since the peace accord was signed, yet the hill

population claims that its core issues – rehabilitation of repatriated and internally displaced indigenous people, demilitarisation, activation of regional and district councils, and operationalisation of the land commission – remain unaddressed. Why?

**KS Mong:** Beyond the issues you mentioned, several other critical matters remain unresolved. For example, the transfer of administration and law enforcement to the district councils and the regional council, as stipulated in the accord, has not been implemented.

The three district councils in the CHT were established to ensure self-governance and preserve the indigenous population's unique characteristics and identity. However, the necessary amendments to relative laws to enhance their authority have not been made.

Additionally, a local police force has not been established. Police from outside the CHT cannot fully understand the region's distinctiveness. A set of regulations defining the roles and responsibilities of all stakeholders needs to be finalised to operationalise the land commission. But this has yet to happen.

Elections for the three district councils and the regional council require a voter list comprising permanent residents of CHT. Without this, the elections cannot take place.

**TDS:** The Land Commission was formed in 2001 in line with the accord, yet it hasn't resolved a single land-related dispute. Why?

**KS Mong:** A regulation

outlining its operational framework must be formulated to make the commission effective. This has not been done.

After the current government came to power, we met with advisers for law, land, and CHT affairs. Both the law and CHT advisers agreed that the CHT Affairs ministry should take the initiative to draft these regulations. This is a positive step.

**TDS:** What immediate steps should the interim government take to fully implement the accord?

**KS Mong:** Apart from the above-mentioned issues, the Land Commission and the CHT Accord Implementation and Monitoring Committee must be restructured. Additionally, the advisory committee under the Ministry of CHT Affairs should be reconstituted.

Furthermore, the government must take swift action to rebuild trust among the hill people.

earning Tk 35,000 to Tk 40,000 a month, Shaon is now overwhelmed by financial hardships.

"I haven't paid rent in four months. The landlord is pressuring me, and I've sold my bed, fridge, and TV just to get by," he said.

"Hospitals are providing free treatment, but I can't sleep at night worrying about how I'll support my family."

The Health Central Sub-Committee reported that 685 people sustained serious eye injuries during the protests, with 92 losing sight in both eyes permanently.

Among them is 15-year-old Fahad Hossain, a ninth-grader from Badda who was hit by pellets on July 18.

The pellets remain lodged in his left eye and head, causing persistent headaches and sleepless nights. Despite that, Fahad remains steadfast in his dreams of achieving a peaceful Bangladesh.

"I dream of a peaceful Bangladesh, free from violence and political conflict," Fahad said. **LONG-TERM SOLUTIONS** Abdul Hamid, professor at the Institute of Health Economics at Dhaka University, highlighted the devastating financial impact of such disabilities.

"Many of those injured were sole breadwinners. They now face a lifetime of financial struggles, often relying on loans for treatment. This creates a vicious cycle of poverty," he said.

While some injured

individuals are receiving artificial limbs, Abdul Hamid stressed that comprehensive rehabilitation is essential.

He called on the government to take responsibility for those disabled in the July movement.

"Those who have lost limbs should receive training tailored to their interests and skills, enabling them to return to the workforce. Similarly, individuals with vision loss require specialised training," he said.

**A GLOBAL PERSPECTIVE** The challenges faced by the victims resonate with this year's International Day of Persons with Disabilities, which is set to be observed today.

The theme, "Amplifying the Leadership of Persons with Disabilities for an Inclusive and Sustainable Future," highlights the importance of promoting the rights and well-being of persons with disabilities across all aspects of life. According to the World Health Organisation, around 1.3 billion people globally – 16 percent of the population – experience significant disability, a figure expected to rise due to ageing populations and non-communicable diseases.
