

Mujgunni Highway crumbles within a year

Tk 20 crore renovation sparks outrage

Merely a year after being renovated, the 5.5-kilometre-long Mujgunni Highway between Sonadanga Bus Terminal and Notun Rasta Intersection in Khulna has become rundown yet again.

The road earlier remained in a dilapidated state for long 12 years, before the Khulna City Corporation initiated to renovate in 2021, and completed the work in May 2023, spending Tk 20 crore.

While the city dwellers became hopeful that the newly renovated road would turn the route smooth and accessible for their commutes, their hope faded away soon afterwards as it turned impassable within a year.

Visiting the road recently, this correspondent observed that its bitumen surface has worn off and paved the way for the formation of numerous small and large potholes, making it an arduous task for vehicles to ply the road safely.

Vehicles – including easy bikes, rickshaws, and pickup trucks – were seen using only one side of the road, avoiding the damaged parts to prevent accidents.

Numerous important landmarks of the city are located on both sides of Mujgunni Highway, including the 500-bed Khulna Medical College Hospital, Khulna Specialised Hospital, several education institutions, Indian Visa Application Centre, around 50 public and private

offices, and three residential areas under Khulna Development Authority. As such, the road is a vital one for the city dwellers for their daily commute.

Also, most people from the western suburbs – including Khalishpur and Daulatpur areas – use the road to go to the central city.

City dwellers alleged that the authorities concerned were negligent in properly implementing the renovation work. They claim that contractors used low-quality materials for road construction and got away with it, resulting in a complete waste of public money.

KCC officials, however, claimed that heavy traffic and persistent waterlogging on the road during the monsoon led to its rapid deterioration.

KCC had also spent around Tk 33 crore to construct drains on both sides of the road. However, considering its claim that waterlogging caused damage to the road, it is apparent that the drains did not serve their purpose well.

According to KCC documents, one Kohinur Enterprise got the Tk 9.5 crore work order to renovate the first 2.758km of the road from Sonadanga Bus Terminal to Police Lines, while Mozahar Enterprises and Shaheed Enterprises jointly renovated the rest 2.545km till Notun Rasta intersection for Tk 10.68 crore.

MYMENSINGH REGION Aman harvest brings smiles to farmers' faces

Smiles have returned to the faces of farmers in the Mymensingh region with the good harvests of Aman paddy this season, followed by fair market prices.

Around 40 percent of paddy has already been harvested so far, said Dr Salma Laizoo, additional director of the Department of Agricultural Extension in the Mymensingh division.

"Even though hundreds of farmers incurred losses due to recent flash floods and torrential rainfall in Mymensingh, Netrakona, and Sherpur districts,



there will not be any major reduction to the total production of Aman paddy, which in turn will help the affected farmers recover their losses," she added.

Mizan Ali, a farmer of Char Gobindapur village under Mymensingh Sadar upazila, said he got a good profit from his harvest.

"It cost me Tk 3,000 to cultivate Aman paddy on every 10 decimal land. I harvested an average of four maunds of paddy from every 10 decimal land, and it

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Seven die of dengue

At least seven died of dengue fever in the last 24 hours while 596 patients were hospitalised till yesterday morning.

Of the deaths, four were reported in Dhaka city, and one each in Dhaka, Mymensingh, and Rajshahi divisions.

According to the Directorate General of Health Services, with the new deaths and cases, the death toll rose to 529 while the total number of cases rose to 96,228.

Currently, 905 dengue patients are undergoing treatment in different hospitals in the capital and 1,327 across the country.

Eggs, shoes hurled at prison van carrying ex-mayor Kiran

An agitated crowd pelted eggs, shoes, and brooms at the police van carrying former Gazipur acting mayor and Tongi councillor Asadur Rahman Kiran to court yesterday.

The incident took place near Gazipur court's prison cell, said Shahiduzzaman, former president of Gazipur Bar Association, adding that no lawyer at the court wanted to represent the accused.

He was quickly removed from the premises amid a lack of security after the court sent him to jail, he added.

According to police, a BGB team detained Kiran while he was trying to flee to India through the Jashore border on November 18.

Kiran has been named in seven cases filed with various police stations, including in Tongi, Gazipur, and Dhaka's Uttara.

He has been accused of attacking, injuring, and killing protesters during the Anti-Discrimination Student Movement, alongside allegations of corruption.

'JOY BANGLA' SLOGAN SC to hear petition this week

The Appellate Division of the Supreme Court will hold hearing this week on a leave-to-appeal petition filed by the government seeking a stay on the High Court verdict that had declared "Joy Bangla" as the country's national slogan.

A bench of the Appellate Division headed by Justice Md Ashfaqul Islam said this after Additional Attorney General Aneek R Haque yesterday mentioned the matter for a hearing.

Earlier, the government filed the petition with the SC seeking a stay on the HC verdict that on March 10, 2020 had declared "Joy Bangla" as the country's national slogan, and also ordered the government to take necessary steps so that the slogan is used at all state functions and academic institutions' assemblies.

Man put on remand for 'hurting religious sentiments'

A Sunamganj court yesterday placed a man on a five-day remand in a case filed over allegedly hurting religious sentiments through a Facebook comment.

Akash Das, 21, was arrested from Dowarabazar upazila on Tuesday night, hours after violence broke out following his comment.

Sunamganj's Senior Judicial Magistrate Nirjon Kumar Mitra granted the remand after hearing a petition in the CSA case filed by police, said Akbar Hossain, court inspector of Sunamganj District Police.

According to police, on Tuesday night, at least two temples were ransacked, and homes and shops of Hindu people were vandalised in Dowarabazar upazila town and Manglargaon village near the town.

The mob attacked after local Muslims said Akash, a Hindu man, posted an image on a Facebook comment that hurt their religious feelings.

While people started gathering, police rushed to find Akash and detained him. While returning to the police station, a mob tried to snatch him. However, the police saved him.

Hours later, the temples, houses, and shops were vandalised.

Later, army personnel arrived at the spot, and they, along with local, political, and Islamist leaders, calmed the situation.
