

Jatra Pala, a tradition rooted in rural winters

On a chilly December evening in Hatbati village, under the open sky, the air was filled with a sense of nostalgia and excitement. Wrapped in warm shawls and blankets, villagers from Batiaghata upazila in Khulna gathered at the District Satsang Ashram Centre to witness something that many thought was slowly fading away: a Jatra Pala performance.

For decades, Jatra Pala -- an elaborate blend of storytelling, music, and dance -- had been a cornerstone of rural Bangladesh's winter celebrations. After the autumn harvest, entire communities would come together to enjoy nightlong performances, losing themselves in tales of history, folklore, and social values. But in

recent years, this vibrant tradition had been overshadowed by the rapid rise of technology and changing cultural preferences.

This year, however, a glimmer of hope emerged. The Bangladesh Shilpakala Academy, in collaboration with its Khulna District branch, organised a seven-day Jatra Festival to breathe new life into this nearly forgotten art form.

Starting on December 19, the festival transformed Hatbati village into a hub of activity. Each night till December 25, hundreds of spectators, young and old, flocked to the stage. Some brought makeshift stools, while others simply sat on the ground, huddled together to ward off the cold.

The performances were nothing short of mesmerising. With expressive dialogues, stirring music, and vibrant costumes, the troupes transported the audience to another world -- one where tradition and creativity thrived hand in hand.

"I hadn't seen a Jatra in years," said Tripti Bairagi, a resident of Chak Soilmari village. "People stayed until the SEE PAGE 4 COL 5

Save 5 canals from encroachment

Residents urge authorities

Residents of Bagerhat municipality have called upon the authorities concerned to take prompt steps for saving five canals from indiscriminate pollution and rampant illegal encroachment.

They are Basabati, Nagerbazar, Bailer, Sarui, and Harikhali canals in the municipality.

Once vibrant waterways, the canals have lost their natural flow and navigability due to dumping of wastes and encroachment over the years.

At present, the canals are barely clinging to life, with stagnant water that emanates stench and serves as mosquito breeding ground. In monsoon, the canals cause waterlogging in adjoining areas as those are no longer able to drain away

excess water.

Locals blamed neglect and lack of monitoring by the authorities concerned behind the unregulated waste disposal and encroachments.

"The Harikhali canal was once a lifeline for farmers as it provided much needed water for irrigation to hundreds of acres of paddy fields. Over the past two decades, much of the canal's land has been encroached upon for constructing structures, while it dried up and lost its flow due to siltation and dumping of wastes. As a result, agricultural activities in the neighbouring areas could no longer be continued," said Habib Sheikh, a resident of the Harikhali area.

Hasan Sheikh, who lives near Nagerbazar canal, echoed him.

Farmer killed 'by nephew' over land in Jamalpur

A 58-year-old farmer was killed allegedly by his nephew over a land dispute in Jamalpur yesterday.

The incident occurred at Teghria village in Madarganj upazila around 10:00am, said police.

The deceased identified as Abdul Kalam, son of late Hossain Ali of the village.

JCD leader beaten to death 'by BNP men'

A Jatiyatabadi Chhatra Dal (JCD) leader was beaten to death allegedly by some BNP men during a clash in Narayanganj's Rupganj upazila on Tuesday night.

The deceased, Pavel Mia, was the former convener of JCD's Kanchan municipality unit.

He was assaulted around 10:30pm by a group of BNP men, following a dispute, said Mehedi Islam, senior assistant superintendent of police in Narayanganj.

According to police and locals, an argument broke out between Shuvo, a Swechchhasebak League activist, and Aminul Islam, member secretary of the Swechchhasebak Dal's Kanchan unit.

Later, Md Bayejid, general secretary of a BNP ward unit, intervened on Shuvo's behalf.

Bayejid, along with local BNP activist Jahangir and their followers, set out to find Aminul. On their way, they encountered Pavel and attacked him, said police.

Pavel was taken to a local private hospital, where doctors declared him dead.

Following Pavel's death, his followers set fire to three tin-shed houses belonging to members of the opposing faction.

'We're on alert to prevent Rohingya infiltration' Says DG of Coast Guard

Rohingyas attempt to infiltrate into Bangladesh daily, and the Coast Guard pushes them back, said Director General of the Bangladesh Coast Guard Rear Admiral Ziaul Haque yesterday.

He mentioned that Rohingyas are now using routes other than the Naf river to enter the country, often with the help of some locals.

He urged locals to assist the forces in preventing such infiltration more effectively.

He made the remarks while visiting the Myanmar border areas in Teknaf and Saint Martin's Island in Cox's Bazar.

"Teknaf and Saint Martin's are close to the Myanmar border, so the Coast Guard works around the clock to ensure security. The ongoing conflict between Myanmar's junta and the Arakan Army has intensified, with the junta forces facing defeats. While shelling across the border has
