

32 bhoris of stolen gold recovered, two held

Police have recovered 32 bhoris (11.66 grammes per bhoris) of gold stolen from a house in Dhaka's Adabor and arrested two individuals in connection with the theft that took place late last month.

They were held early yesterday, according to SM Jahangir, officer-in-charge of Adabor Police Station.

The theft occurred between December 28 and 30, during which 45 bhoris were stolen from a locker.

The thieves gained access to the residence while the family members were away, he added.

The residents filed a case on January 3, prompting Adabor police to launch an investigation. This led to the arrest and recovery.

"The arrested individuals are currently under interrogation, and efforts are underway to recover the remaining gold," the OC said.
