
Kaavish to headline 'Dhaka Dreams' concert today

The much-anticipated *Dhaka Dreams* concert is set to take place today at Senapranjan. The event will feature a lineup of artistes, including Level Five, Ghashphoring Choir, Shunno, and Arnob alongside singer Sunidhi Nayak, and the celebrated Pakistani band Kaavish as the headliner.

Kaavish landed in Dhaka last Wednesday and shared their excitement with fans through their verified Facebook page. They posted a photo taken at the Dhaka airport and captioned it, "See you on January 24."

The organiser, Blue Brick Communications, offered refunds for this rescheduled event, with requests closing on January 23 at 1:30pm.

Initially, a two-day occasion scheduled for January 10 and 11, *Dhaka Dreams* was postponed due to technical issues and has been lessened to a one-day event.



Uma Thurman joins Michael C Hall in 'Dexter: Resurrection'

Hollywood veteran Uma Thurman has joined the cast of *Dexter: Resurrection*, starring Michael C Hall. She will play Charley, head of security for billionaire Leon Prater, and a former Special Operations officer.

Hall reprises his role as Dexter Morgan, the notorious serial killer. Returning cast members include David Zayas as Detective Angel Batista, James Remar as Harry Morgan, and Jack Alcott as Harrison Morgan. *Dexter: Resurrection* is a continuation of 2021's *Dexter: New Blood* and is set to premiere this summer. The franchise also includes a prequel, *Dexter: Original Sin*, which explores Dexter's early life, connecting the overall franchise's timelines.



DiCaprio, Scorsese to adapt 'The Devil in the White City' for the screen

Leonardo DiCaprio and Martin Scorsese are set to reunite as the iconic star-director duo, to adapt Erik Larson's book *The Devil in the White City* for the silver screen under 20th Century Studios.

The true crime story follows serial killer HH Holmes and his "Murder Castle" in Chicago's 1893 World's Columbian Exposition. DiCaprio has held the rights since 2010, but the project faced several unforeseen delays.

The movie adaptation, yet to have a script, is gaining traction with 20th Century's support under David Greenbaum and Steve Asbell. DiCaprio and Scorsese will produce the project, joined by Stacey Sher, Rick Yorn, and Jennifer Davisson from Appian Way.

result in disruption of irrigation when cultivation of paddy begins, they added.

"This can even make food security uncertain," Imran said at the event at a hotel in the capital.

BIPPA President David Hasanat said, "We met government high-ups several times and asked for arrears, but found no solution yet. It will not be possible to meet the national demand during the summer if the payments are not cleared."

Do not portray power generators as villains then, he told reporters, adding that the summer was likely to be very hot this year.

The government owes independent power producers around Tk 16,000

crore.

BIPPA estimates that power demand will reach 18,000MW on hot days and heavy fuel oil-based plants will generate up to 4,149MW if the fuel is available.

In a presentation, Imran Karim said, they have been getting delayed payments since the last quarter of 2022, and currently they do not have the means to import fuel oil to generate electricity.

As per the contracts between power plants and Bangladesh Power Development Board (PDB), the IPPs have rights to suspend power generation.

When the interim government has been planning on how to reduce power generation costs, saying the

ousted Awami League government has increased the cost illogically, the BIPPA recommends increasing electricity prices at retail level.

Comparing the pricing data of four countries, including India, Pakistan, Sri Lanka and Vietnam, Imran said, the price in Bangladesh is the lowest and the subsidy the highest.

"We want a logical price here as the lower price left the PDB to depend on the government subsidies which is why they are not able to pay the power producers."

David Hasanat said they also want investigation into who made excessive profit from the power sector with the help of unsolicited contracts with the PDB.

accused him in two separate cases while his wife Nusrat Jahan faces charges of acquiring illegal assets worth Tk 41 crore.

Her accounts in 12 bank accounts saw transactions totalling Tk 342.5 crore, anti-corruption officers said.

The family acquired citizenship of Antigua and Barbuda, a tax haven, in 2017. On their behalf, \$200,000 was paid by Martil Consulting, Malaysia Berhad to C&C Consultancy and Management Services.

Investigators found that Ziaul had transactions of approximately 6 million dirhams, around Tk 20 crore, in his accounts with First Abu Dhabi Bank, approximately 23 million dirhams, around Tk 75 crore,

with Abu Dhabi Commercial Bank, and approximately 7 million ringgit, around Tk 75 crore, with Alfin Bank Berhad, Malaysia.

Additionally, he has an account in the Bank of America. The ACC has evidence that he laundered a significant amount of money using that account, officers said.

Ziaul owns a farmhouse, an eight-storey building in Dhaka, an eight-storey building in Barishal, a house in Jhalakathi, three flats and 3333.51 decimals of land in Dhaka. He has an investment of Tk 5 crore in the stock market and Tk 1 crore in savings bond, officers said.

According to the cases, Ziaul acquired assets worth Tk 22.27 crore which is inconsistent with his known sources of income.

There were suspicious transactions of approximately Tk 120 crore in eight of his bank accounts. He deposited \$ 55,000 into an account, violating the Guidelines for Foreign Exchange Transactions 2018 and the FEOD Circular 6 dated February 3, 2020.

The complaint filed against Ziaul's wife, Nusrat Jahan, said she acquired assets worth Tk 18.59 crore that are inconsistent with her known sources of income.

There were unusual transactions of approximately Tk 222.50 crore in four of her accounts.

Ziaul was arrested on August 15.

Currently, three factories are in operation.

Since September last year, the government has disbursed Tk 223.43 crore as financial assistance to Beximco Group so that it may pay dues to its laid-off workers and face the crisis.

The government is now preparing to pay the salary for January.

Meanwhile, the adviser also said the vandalism and road blockades carried out by protesting workers were unacceptable and that action would be taken against them.

The laid-off workers and employees of Beximco textile and garment units at a press conference yesterday morning urged the government to reopen the factories and reinstate their jobs.

The employees demanded that the government facilitate the opening of letters of credit so that the mills could import raw materials, operate the factories, and repay bank loans.
