

Poetry event halted in Ctg Reciter 'harassed'

A recitation program in Chattogram's Nandan Kanan area was abruptly stopped yesterday after a poem mentioned Sheikh Mujibur Rahman.

Organisers and eyewitnesses said the event, arranged by the Chattogram Recitation Association to commemorate International Mother Language Day, was interrupted around 10:45am by activists of Jatiyatabadi Samajik Sangskritik Sangstha (JASAS), a cultural organisation.

The disruption took place during the recitation of a poem referencing Bangabandhu, the Liberation War, and the March 7 speech.

Mishfaq Rasel, a co-organiser of the event, said upon hearing the recitation, JASAS members objected and allegedly forced the reciter to apologise.

Some organisers also claimed the reciter was harassed.

Mamunur Rashid, general secretary of JASAS Chattogram city, confirmed the incident. "The programme was carrying out 'anti-state' activities, so we protested. The administration intervened and stopped the event," he said. He, however, denied any allegations of harassment.

Abdul Karim, officer-in-charge of Kotwali Police Station, said they were informed about the incident, but the event had already ended before police arrived.

Woman raped in Munshiganj, three held

A 22-year-old woman has been raped by her husband's friend and associates on Domrakhali Char in the Padma River, Munshiganj, said police.

The incident occurred between 6:30pm and 9:00pm on February 16, said Zakir Hossain, officer-in-charge of Padma Bridge (North) Police Station.

On Thursday night, Munshiganj District Police said in a press briefing that the woman filed a written complaint the following day, naming four suspects.

Based on an initial investigation, police found evidence supporting her claims and filed a case on February 18.

Three accused -- Md Jamal Molla, 23, Yamin Munshi, 19, and Jabbar Sheikh, 18 -- were arrested and produced before a court, where they gave confessional statements under Section 164. The court then sent them to jail.

The other suspect, Abu Bakar Siddique, 22, remains at large.

According to police, the woman had been waiting for a boat at the old Mawa ferry ghat to travel to her husband's home, when her husband's friend Abu Bakar and Jamal offered her a ride in a trawler.

The two other suspects boarded the vessel on the way, and the four men allegedly raped her on the char. Police seized two smartphones from the arrestees, which have been sent to the CID forensic lab for examination.

The trawler used in the crime has also been seized.

The victim underwent medical examination, and efforts are ongoing to arrest Abu Bakar, the OC added.

SHARSHA UPAZILA OF JASHORE Snail collection a lifeline for 700 families

Around 700 low-income families in Jashore's Sharsha upazila make a living by collecting snails from local water bodies.

With a severe shortage of jobs in rural areas, these families, from Dihli, Laxmipur, Bahadurpur, Sharsha Sadar, and Nizampur unions, rely on harvesting snails from rivers, canals, swamps, and ponds, they said.

Their work begins early in the morning and continues until noon.

Each person collects between 20 and 50 kilogrammes of snails daily, which they sell to traders at a rate of Tk 6 per kg. The snails are then processed and used as feed in fish farms.

Despite facing harsh conditions, including polluted waters, the collectors have little choice but to continue.

"The local water bodies have turned toxic due to pollution this year, causing a lot of irritation and itching to us. Despite this, we continue to collect snails from the waters as we have no other means to make a living," said Asim Tarafdar of Potapara in Nizampur union.

Echoing him, Pawan Biswas, a snail collector in Nizampur union, said, "For us, snail collection remains one of the few viable sources of income. However, the increasing pollution of local water bodies continues to pose serious health risks, making an already difficult livelihood even more challenging."

Others, including Alo Biswas, Milan Rani, Nolita Rani, and Swarup, shared similar concerns.



Traders Sohag, Ibrahim, and Akram Hossain from Wapda Khalpara in Swarupdaha union purchase around 3,000 to 4,000 kilogrammes of snails daily from the collectors. These are then sold to fish farm owners, who process them using machines to produce fish feed, they said.

a severe shortage of third- and fourth-class employees. While 28 positions are sanctioned for third-class employees, 18 are filled.

The situation is even worse for fourth-class employees, with six staff members managing 36 designated positions, including office assistants, cleaners, stretcher bearers, and lab attendants. As a result, the hospital premises often remain unclean.

Doctors are struggling to cope with the increasing patient load.

A doctor, speaking anonymously, said the shortage forces them to work extended hours even after official duty, making it extremely exhausting.

The shortage has also affected

The hospital has also been facing a severe medicine crisis since August due to a halt in new tenders. The situation has worsened over the past two months. Previously, the hospital provided 27 to 30 types of medicines, but now only six or seven varieties are available.

The hospital's only X-ray machine has been out of order for two years, and the technician position remains vacant.

Dr Partha Pratim Biswas, acting residential medical officer and upazila health and family planning officer, said the hospital has been struggling with various issues for a long time.

He said they have reported the situation to the higher authorities, who are working towards a solution.
