Hamas rejects Israeli PM's 'threats'

Says it will release six hostages today; Israel to release 602 Palestinian prisoners in Gaza swap

Hamas yesterday rejected Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu's "threats" to make the Palestinian group pay after he accused it of violating the ceasefire by not returning the hostage Shiri Bibas.

"We reject the threats issued by Benjamin Netanyahu as part of his

attempts to improve his image," Hamas said in a statement and called on Israeli authorities to return the body of a Gaza woman that the group had handed over on Thursday, claiming it was that of Bibas.

The movement affirmed its "seriousness and full commitment" to its responsibilities under the ceasefire, and said it had "no interest in failing to

comply or holding on to any bodies." However, it admitted "the possibility of an error or mix-up of bodies," which it attributed to Israeli bombing of the area where the Bibas family was located along with other Palestinians.

Hamas said it would inform mediators of the results of its "investigation and examination" into the circumstances of the body's return.

The armed wing of Hamas also said yesterday it will release Israeli hostages Elia Cohen, Omer Shem Tov, Tal Shoham, Omer Wenkert, Hisham al Sayed and Avera Mengisto today. Hisham al Sayed and Avera Mengisto are civilians, who entered Gaza a decade ago and have been held there since.

Israel will free 602 inmates from jails today as part of a hostage-prisoner swap with Hamas under an ongoing Gaza ceasefire deal, according to the Palestinian Prisoners' Club advocacy group.

REGIONAL CONFLAGRATION

42,000 people fled eastern DRC to Burundi in two weeks: UN

Around 42,000 people have fled the conflict raging in eastern Democratic Republic of Congo and crossed into Burundi in the past two weeks, the United Nations said yesterday.

Rwandan-backed M23 fighters have made big gains in the eastern DR Congo, seizing the cities of Goma and Bukavu and stoking fears of a regional conflagration.

The UN refugee agency UNHCR had expected that the violence would send people fleeing into Burundi, making plans to help up to 58,000 people over three months, said Brigitte Mukanga-Eno, agency's



representative in Burundi.

But "just in first two weeks, we have received ... around 42,000 people already seeking asylum", she said as she addressed reporters in Geneva via a video link from Bujumbura.

She said that more than 36,000 people had crossed the Rusizi river, near Rugombo, while another 6,000 had crossed directly to a transit centre close to the largest city Bujumbura.

India's ED levies penalty of Rs 3.44 crore on BBC India

India's anti-money laundering agency Enforcement Directorate (ED) has imposed a penalty of more than Rs 3.44 crore on BBC World Service India for alleged contravention of foreign direct investment (FDI) regulations, PTI reported yesterday quoting the agency officials.

The ED also fined three of its directors more than Rs 1.14 crore each and issued an adjudication order against the British broadcaster under stringent Foreign Exchange Management Act (FEMA).

The adjudication proceedings were initiated after a showcause notice was issued on August 4, 2023, to BBC World Service India, its three directors, and the finance head for various "contraventions" under the law.

SURGE IN VIOLENCE

France to deploy cops at schools for spot bag searches

French police will start random searches for knives and other weapons concealed in bags at and around schools in a bid to fight an increase in violent attacks, the education minister said yesterday.

The spot searches will begin in the spring, Elisabeth Borne told the BFMTV/RMC broadcaster.

"I want us to be able to organise, together with the prefect, the prosecutor and the representative of the education system, regular bag searches at the entrance of schools," she said.
