



Southeast Univ holds 8th convocation

The 8th convocation of Southeast University (SEU) took place at the Bangladesh China Friendship Exhibition Centre in Purbachal yesterday, said a press release.

Foreign Adviser Touhid Hossain chaired the ceremony as the representative of the President and conferred degrees on the graduates.

Prof SMA Faiz, chairman of the University Grants Commission, delivered the convocation speech. A total of 1,922 students

attended the event.

Five students who achieved a perfect CGPA of 4.0 and received the Chancellor's Gold Medal are Chandrima Chakraborty, Ariful Karim, Rema Rani Paul, Sumaiya Aktar, and Habiba Khanom Lubna.

Besides, 27 graduates received the Vice Chancellor's Gold Medal.

Rezaul Karim, chairman of SEU's Board of Trustees; Prof Yusuf Mahbubul Islam, vice chancellor; and Prof Mofazzal Hossain, pro VC, also spoke. The event was conducted by SEU Registrar Maj Gen (retd) Md Anwarul Islam.

They will also get a monthly allowance of Tk 20,000.

The government has divided those injured in the uprising into three categories.

Those who were critically injured are placed in Category A. They will get Tk 5 lakh -- Tk 2 lakh will be provided in this fiscal year and Tk 3 lakh in the next -- in the form of savings certificates.

They will get Tk 20,000 as monthly allowance. The government placed 493 injured in Category A.

In Category B, injured will get Tk 3 lakh in the form of savings certificates and monthly allowance of Tk 15,000.

The government put 908 injured under Category B.

The Category C includes people who sustained minor injuries or have totally recovered. They will get Tk 1 lakh and monthly allowance of Tk 10,000. The government put 10,648 injured under Category C.

Meanwhile, a group of injured protesters continued their sit-in in front of the Chief Advisor's Office

in Tejgaon yesterday for the second consecutive day. They started their demonstration at 11:00am on Wednesday.

They are pushing forward three-point demand including changes to the government's category system for compensating the injured, calling for the abolition of Category C.

About 30 protesters held the sit-in surrounded by law enforcers. Masud Rana Sourav, one of the protesters, said they reject the government's category, because it is discriminatory.

profitable, it leads to serious social issues."

Prof M Shamsul Alam, energy adviser to the Consumers' Association of Bangladesh, criticised the presentation for omitting the 2006 Phulbari movement, in which three protesters were killed and hundreds injured while opposing Asia Energy's open-pit mining project.

"There is an agreement between the government and Phulbari's people that open-pit mining will not be pursued. What will happen to that agreement?" he asked.

He did not directly answer a question from Energy Adviser Muhammad Fouzul Kabir Khan

on whether he supported coal extraction, saying, "That can only be determined after discussions with all stakeholders."

Prof Shamsul also condemned the high cost of locally mined coal, pointing out that coal from Barapukuria costs \$176 per tonne, while imported coal is available at \$100 per tonne. "This is due to corruption. A Chinese firm was awarded the mining contract without a competitive bidding process," he alleged.

He also questioned the feasibility of reinstating topsoil after mining. "This is merely a rehashed version of old proposals," he said.

Dhaka University's Dean of Earth and Environmental Sciences,

Kazi Matin Uddin Ahmed, called for a clear roadmap to mitigate environmental and social damage through community involvement and technological improvements.

Mohammad Saiful Islam, secretary to the energy and mineral resources division, said, "At times, we've struggled to pay coal import bills due to the foreign currency crisis. We must decide whether to use our own coal for power generation."

Fouzul Kabir Khan said the government is preparing a roadmap for the next political administration to determine whether to proceed with coal extraction.

"We aim to present various options," he said.

According to BMP sources, CCTV footage helped identify 264 criminal incidents in 2021 alone.

The BMP operates through an Integrated Command and Control Section to manage crime and traffic. However, due to the lack of city corporation cameras, Metropolitan Police Commissioner Md Shafiqul Islam expressed concern over potential criminal activities during the upcoming Ramadan.

He said during a law and order meeting on Thursday, the importance of CCTV cameras was discussed. It was noted that over 3,000 privately owned CCTV

cameras are currently in use, but more effective initiatives are needed to enhance crime control.

Professor Zahid Hossain, president of the Sacheton Nagarik Committee, highlighted the crucial role of CCTV in crime prevention in the city. He urged the authorities to swiftly reinstall the cameras to restore security and peace.

Accreditation gets difficult

To obtain or renew accreditation cards, media organisations must submit a recommendation signed and stamped by a designated official of the organisation.

This recommendation must be submitted to the Principal Information Officer on the organisation's official letterhead, specifying the names and designations of the recommended journalists.

If a journalist is denied accreditation, they have the right to appeal. The

appeal board will include representatives from various sectors, including national newspaper editors and judges.

Additionally, a system will be introduced to issue accreditation cards at the district level for journalists working outside the capital.

Instead of the previous two types of accreditation cards -- permanent and temporary -- the new policy introduces a single accreditation card with a validity of three years.

Under the new policy, an accreditation card will not

be cancelled solely due to a criminal case unless a final verdict is issued against the journalist.

However, if a final charge sheet is submitted, the committee may suspend the card.

Azad Majumder, deputy press secretary of the Chief Adviser's Office, announced that the government will soon issue new accreditation cards under the revised policy.

Until then, existing accreditation cards will remain valid, he said during a press briefing at the Foreign Service Academy.

Mazharul Islam, CEO of Anya Prakash, said, "The fair is being held in a different political situation this time, so


