"If every recruitment letter has to be attested separately, it takes a lot of time. If we revert to the previous process, sending workers will be much easier," he added.

Former BAIRA joint secretary Fakhru Islam said for a long time, demand letters for up to 24 workers required only attestation from the Bureau of Manpower, Employment and Training (BMET), not the embassy.

"The embassy cannot verify all recruitment requests. This sudden rule change has resulted in a decline in worker deployment. If this rule remains, the number of workers sent abroad will decrease further," he said.

BAIRA members explained that 85 percent of workers travelling from Bangladesh to Saudi Arabia are recruited through small-scale demand letters, typically for one to 24 workers.

Due to the attestation requirement, visa processing has been disrupted, they said.

On February 5, BAIRA members staged a human chain in front of the expatriates welfare ministry to demand the reinstatement of the previous attestation process.

Later, they submitted a memorandum to the ministry, alleging that a Malaysian citizen and his Bangladeshi associate extorted Tk 1,07,000 from each worker through illegal means.

They demanded strict legal action against them to prevent the formation of any new syndicate.

According to BMET sources, in September last year, 44,229 workers travelled to Saudi Arabia. The number surged to 83,582 in October and remained steady for three months.

In January, it slightly decreased to 76,618. However, in February, the number of workers sent to Saudi Arabia dropped to 44,258.

Bangladesh and Islam negatively on the global stage. The government must take a firm stance against terrorism and extremism, and we must also reinforce this position through social and political platforms," Nahid added.

He urged all political parties to unite in support of democracy and national harmony while opposing corruption and "Mujibism".

"The dangers facing Bangladesh have not yet subsided. Anti-Bangladesh forces are still conspiring. "Military and civilian bureaucracies, mafia business groups, and foreign powers could exploit disunity among politicians and mass uprising forces," he said.

Nahid also demanded swift and visible trials against "fascists". "Through this justice, we aim to

politically address the Awami League's actions," he said.

He stressed that the National Consensus Commission must expedite the implementation of the July Charter. He added that the interim government could quickly implement recommendations from public administration and the police through ordinances.

NCP Member Secretary Akter Hossen urged all political parties to unite in demanding the trial of Sheikh Hasina and the Awami League, accusing them of genocide and mass killings.

Hasnat Abdullah, NCP's chief organiser for the southern region, called for unity to ensure a democratic transition.

The iftar event was attended by BNP standing committee member Salahuddin Ahmed, Joint

He noted that children in urban slums have inadequate water and sanitation, leading to a 30 percent higher health risk than rural children.

Poor sanitation triggers a cycle – diseases like diarrhoea worsen malnutrition, leading to stunted growth, cognitive delays, and hindered education, ultimately affecting economic prospects and the nation's future potential, he added.

"Challenges related to WASH conditions include stress and sexual harassment, with young girls being particularly vulnerable," he said.

Falguni Tripura, a member of the Bangladesh Adivasi Forum, stressed the need for inclusive access to public toilets, particularly for indigenous and gender-diverse individuals.

She highlighted severe water shortages in the Chittagong Hill Tracts and the lack of toilets in schools and colleges.

"If these issues remain unaddressed, girls will continue facing risks of harassment and assault while travelling," she warned.

Shireen Pervin Huq, chief of the Women's Affairs Reform Commission, urged speakers to submit recommendations for improving WASH facilities, as their final report is set for release next week.

Shamim Ara Shammii, program manager of BRAC's Ultra-Poor Graduation Program, and Mostafizur Rahman, national program officer at the Embassy of Sweden, were also present, among others.

Retired teacher, son assaulted

Talking to this correspondent, Mira Sarkar, 75, wife of Nani Gopal Sarkar, said Nayon is claiming ownership of 61.5 decimals of their 3.5 acre land.

"Nayon attacked my husband and son with a spade," she said.

"I am now living amid fear that Nayon may launch an attack again," Mira added.

Nani Gopal's daughter Khuku Moni said her father had sold 15 decimals of land to Nayon's father.

"Previously, Nayon made false documents and claimed ownership of more of our land. During arbitrations arranged by police and local representatives, Nayon, however, could not show valid documents to prove his

claim," she said.

"Recently, Section 144 was imposed over the disputed portion of our land. However, Nayon has been trying to prevent us from using the rest of our properties. He also demanded Tk 5 lakh from my brother and threatened my father to register the land in his favour," Khuku added.

Asked, Nayon claimed his father had purchased the 61.5 decimals of land from Nani Gopal.

"As Shambhu was trying to sell trees from the disputed land, I protested him. This led to an altercation and a fight between us," he added.

He refuted allegations of demanding Tk 5 lakh from Shambhu and assaulting Nani Gopal.

Nayon's younger brother, Al Amin Ferdous Shimul, however, said their father late Gazi Hafizur Rahman never told them anything about buying the 61.5 decimals of Nani Gopal's land.

"If my father had bought more than the 15 decimals of land, he would have told us about it," he said.

Rubel Gazi, a member of local Samudoykathi union, said he was unsure if Nayon's claim of the land was true.

Contacted, Boni Amin, officer-in-charge of Nesarabad Police Station, said they are trying to arrest Nayon in a case filed by Nani Gopal Sarkar for assaulting him and his son.

Nayon is also accused in several criminal cases, the OC added.

Malnutrition reaches alarming

worsened sanitation and led to severe diarrhoea, cholera, and dengue outbreaks. Additionally, intermittent food ration cuts over the past two years and a growing influx of families fleeing violence have worsened conditions.

"For now, we can provide the services that Rohingya mothers seek and the sick children need, but as needs rise and funding declines, families are terrified of what will

happen if food rations are cut further and nutrition treatment services stop," said Rana Flowers, Unicef representative in Bangladesh.

At the beginning of 2025, Unicef estimated that 14,200 children in the camps would suffer from severe acute malnutrition this year.

Declining food rations, poor diets, and limited access to safe water and healthcare could push this number even higher. Children with severe

malnutrition are 11 times more likely to die than their well-nourished peers without timely treatment, the statement also said.

"These families cannot safely return home, and they have no legal right to work, so sustained humanitarian support is not optional – it is essential," Flowers said.

"Unicef is committed to delivering for these children, but without guaranteed funding, critical services will be at risk," she warned.

2024 survey showing that 99 percent of respondents support China-Bangladesh friendly relations.

Positive perceptions of China rose to 66.7 percent in 2024 from 60.1 percent in 2022, he said.

Referring to the data, Yao Wen said Bangladeshis view Chinese investment and bilateral cooperation positively, boosting China's confidence in strengthening strategic partnership between the countries.

On the Rohingya crisis, Yao Wen said China mediated, but efforts stalled due to Myanmar's worsening security situation. Then Prof Intiaz Ahmed said China should initiate a development plan for Rakhine State to create conditions for the repatriation.

DU Prof Dr Rashed Al Mahmud Titumir said China's poverty reduction model could be a case study for Bangladesh.

Retired Prof Amena Mohsin and independent researcher Syed Shahnzaw Mohsin also spoke at the event.

and proposals regarding the control of prices for essential goods, the market system, and the production system, there should also be debates among political parties on how to ensure primary healthcare for people.

"Why aren't we talking about these issues? Isn't reform necessary to

change the market system, boost production, and improve the healthcare and education systems?" he questioned.

The BNP leader said as political parties are meant to serve people, they should also focus on critical issues related to public's interests.

Tarique said political parties should present plans on how they will keep

commodity prices within the purchasing power of the common people.

He said reform is also essential for overhauling the country's education system.

"If we fail to establish a proper education system for future generations, how can we possibly move this country forward?" Tarique also said.
