Chinmoy shown arrested in Saiful murder case

(voluntary) basis. The SC chamber judge may hear the state’s petition today. Chinmoy remains in jail in connection with the sedition case.

Saiful was killed on November 26 during a clash between police, lawyers, and Chinmoy’s followers near the Chattogram Court Building, after the court sent Chinmoy, who was arrested a day earlier near Hazrat Shahjalal International Airport, to jail, rejecting his bail plea in the sedition case filed on October 31.

According to police, Chinmoy’s supporters blocked the prison van carrying him, prompting police to charge with batons, which triggered the clash. During the violence, Advocate Alif was beaten and hacked to death.

The sedition case was filed by Firoz Khan, former general secretary of Chattogram’s Mohora ward BNP, accusing Chinmoy and 18 others.

In connection with the killing, police filed three separate cases for attacking police, vandalism, and obstructing law enforcement, naming 79 individuals and accusing about 1,400 unidentified others.

Alif’s father later filed a murder case against 31 individuals, while his brother, Khan-e-Alam, filed another case with Kotwali Police Station, naming 115 accused, including 70 lawyers, over vandalism. Another person, Mohammad Ullah Chowdhury, filed a case accusing 69 individuals of attacking him during the clashes.

So far, police have arrested 40 individuals in connection with the cases. Of them, 11 people – mostly cleaners – were held for their alleged involvement in Alif’s murder, based on CCTV footage analysis.

On January 12, Bhattacharjee submitted Chinmoy’s bail petition to the HC. On February 4, the HC bench issued a rule asking the state to explain within two weeks why Chinmoy should not be granted bail.

EU for fair polls, has no say on its timing

He stressed that the elections need to be free, fair and credible.

“We want to be part of that success story. Because it [the election] will be, if you like, a very significant milestone in your political transition.”

Miller said the EU is in the process of contacting the entities that will work with the Election Commission to create awareness among citizens on the importance of democratic elections.

The EU is also working to make sure that disinformation cannot undermine the free and fair conduct of the polls.

“This is what we have in the pipeline at the moment,” he said.

Miller said the judicial process for trying those involved in the July uprising and prior human rights abuses must be transparent, fair, and respectful of legal rights.

Referring to a UN report that found security forces of the former government killed around 1,400 people and arbitrarily detained over

11,700 during the 2024 student-led protests, he said judicial authorities must now hold the accused accountable based on clear evidence and timely trials.

“We want each and every perpetrator to be held accountable, but the trial process has to be fair and transparent,” he said.

“If an individual is accused of a serious crime, there should be evidence. If there is evidence, then those individuals should be brought to trial. If there is a trial, it should not be delayed and should not be on the basis of imprecise charges,” Miller said.

The International Crimes Tribunal (ICT) is currently trying cases related to crimes against humanity during the July uprising and the previous 15-year Awami League regime. Over 300 complaints have been filed so far.

Referring to some EU member states’ transition history from authoritarianism to democracy, Miller said the bloc is ready to share its knowledge and provide financial and

political support for Bangladesh’s reform efforts.

“We are waiting for political parties and the interim government to agree on a prioritised list of reforms,” he said.

Miller also expressed the EU’s desire to deepen cooperation with Bangladesh in areas including fundamental rights, security, climate change, trade, and investment.

On gender equality, he urged all political stakeholders to engage with the Women’s Affairs Reform Commission’s recommendations.

“We would like to see them translated into action, and we will contribute to the effort to promote greater equality,” he said, noting that gender equality is a universal value.

He reaffirmed EU support for a political solution to the Rohingya crisis and its continued humanitarian assistance in both Bangladesh and Rakhine.

DCAB President AKM Moinuddin and General Secretary Arifuzzaman Mamun also spoke at the event.

welcoming individuals are also barred from staying on the streets with motorcycles and joining the motorcade of Khaleda with any vehicle, according to a DMP circular issued by its Commissioner Sheikh Md Sazzat Ali.

After four months of treatment in London, the former prime minister departed Heathrow Airport for Dhaka yesterday.

“The special air ambulance provided by Qatar’s Emir, Sheikh Tamim bin Hamad Al Thani, carrying BNP Chairperson Khaleda Zia and her entourage, took off around 9:35pm Bangladesh time,” said Sayrul Kabir Khan, BNP media cell member.

Earlier, the party’s acting chairman Tarique Rahman himself drove from his residence in Kingston, London, with his mother Khaleda seated next to him, and arrived at the airport at 7:40pm Bangladesh time.

Also in the car were Tarique’s wife Zubaida Rahman, his daughter Zaima Rahman, and his late brother Arafat Rahman Koko’s wife Syeda Sharmila Rahman.

At the VIP gate of Terminal 4 of the airport, Tarique bid farewell to his mother, accompanied by Zubaida, Sharmila, and physician AZM Zahid Hossain, said party sources.

A video posted by Tarique on his Facebook page shows him happily seeing his mother off and the entourage at the airport, saying “Allah Hafez”.

At the airport before her departure, Khaleda told Tarique, “How long will you stay here?”

Tarique replied, “Once you board the plane ... I will leave.”

Khaleda also urged the party members there to take care of Tarique.

Party sources said the air ambulance was scheduled to make a stopover at Hamad International Airport in Doha at 4:25am Bangladesh time. After a one-hour stopover in Doha, the flight was expected to resume its journey towards Dhaka.

Meanwhile, party sources said preparations have been fully made to receive her, with thousands of leaders and activists expected to greet her.

The BNP is making elaborate arrangements to ensure a smooth, hassle-free journey from the airport to her Gulshan residence while seeking to avoid public inconvenience.

According to the DMP directive, motorcycles are strictly prohibited on the streets from Gulshan and Banani to the airport, and motorcyclists will not be allowed to enter or pass the crowd.

Haji travellers, international passengers, and SSC candidates have been advised to leave their homes early, recommending that people avoid the streets from Gulshan, Banani and Uttara from this morning until noon and instead use alternative routes.

The BNP has held several meetings with senior leaders and affiliated organisations to coordinate the reception and ensure that party instructions are strictly followed.

Addressing party supporters, Secretary General Mirza Fakhrul Islam Alamgir told reporters yesterday, “Please don’t gather on the roads. Those wishing to welcome madam should stand on the sidewalks. We have instructed party members to greet her with national and party flags in hands.”

“There is an SSC examination tomorrow [today]. I request leaders of BNP and its affiliated organisations not to block roads or disrupt traffic. Ensure students can reach their exam centres without delay.”

“We are working to ensure that students don’t face any hassle due to the reception programme,” Fakhrul said, also calling on the police to keep the roads clear.

Party insiders said supporters will not be allowed to the airport or Khaleda’s residence, Firoza, in Gulshan. Instead, leaders and activists of BNP and its affiliated bodies will line up along 11 designated points from the airport to Firoza to welcome Khaleda.

Located at House 1, Road 80 in Gulshan, the residence has been thoroughly cleaned and decorated, said Sayrul Kabir.

On January 8, Khaleda flew to London in a special air ambulance sent by the Emir of Qatar.

Upon arrival, she was admitted to the London Clinic, a private hospital, where she remained for 17 days. Since 25 January, she had been receiving treatment at the residence of Tarique.

The BNP chief was imprisoned in 2018 under the then Sheikh Hasina-led government following a conviction in a corruption case filed by the Anti-Corruption Commission.

In March 2020, amid the Covid-19 pandemic, the government temporarily released her on an executive order, suspending her sentence on condition that she remain at her Gulshan residence and not leave the country.

After the fall of the Awami League government, Khaleda was fully freed by an order from President Mohammed Shahabuddin on August 6 last year.
