

Subrata Bain placed Patients suffer as clashes halt

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Fateh Ali, 61, and Abu Rasel Masud, alias Molla Masud, 53, were arrested in Kushtia on Tuesday. Based on information provided by them, their associates Arafat, 43, and Sharif, 25, were arrested in Hatirjheel.

“These individuals were involved in killings, extortion, and sabotage across the country. The operation was the result of prolonged surveillance and

was executed with precision without any casualties or confrontation,” said Lt Col Sami Ud Dowla Chowdhury, director of the ISPR.

Both Subrata and Masud are named on the list of the country’s top 23 most-wanted criminals and are believed to be masterminds of the infamous “Seven Star” gang, said the ISPR director in a press briefing at the Mess Alpha of Dhaka Cantonment.

Secretariat employees

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The cabinet secretary was briefed on the matter by a five-member committee of secretaries, led by Saleh Ahmed himself, following discussions with employee representatives on Tuesday.

The cabinet secretary will place the matter before the chief adviser once he returns on May 31.

Following those discussions, employees had suspended their protest

programme yesterday.

The previous round of demonstrations was held from Saturday to Tuesday.

The protest began after the advisory council approved the draft Government Service (Amendment) Ordinance, 2025 -- which amends the Public Service Act, 2018 -- last Thursday.

The ordinance was officially issued and came into effect on Sunday night.

The ordinance has sparked anger among Secretariat staff, who have since been organising processions and rallies within the Secretariat premises, demanding its immediate withdrawal.

We mourn the demise of Mr. S M Al-Husainy, Founder Trustee of Independent University, Bangladesh (IUB), who passed away on May 28, 2025.

Inna Lillahi Wa Inna Ilaihi Rajiun.

Born in 1930, Mr. Al-Husainy served as Chairman of the university’s former Governing Council and later as a member of the Board of Trustees. As a key member of the Education, Science, Technology and Cultural Development Trust (ESTCDT), he played an instrumental role in the establishment of IUB. He also served as Chairman of the Board of Trustees of Chittagong Independent University (CIU).

In his distinguished career in public service, Mr. Al-Husainy served as Secretary to the Government in several ministries, as a Member of the Planning Commission, and as Chairman of the Bangladesh Public Service Commission.

He held leadership roles in numerous national organizations, including Chairman of Micro Industries Development Assistance and Services (MIDAS), Chairman of Swanirvar Bangladesh, and Director of Micro Industries Finance Ltd. He was Chairman of the Bangladesh Chapter of the Society for International Development (SID), Vice President of the National Heart Foundation, and a Member of the Executive Committee of Dhaka Ahsania Mission.

Mr. Al-Husainy was also a Fellow of the Centre for Policy Dialogue (CPD), a leading policy think tank, and a former President of the Institution of Engineers, Bangladesh (IEB), where he served for three years.

The IUB community – including members of the Board of Trustees, ESTCDT, faculty, administration, students, and alumni – expresses deepest condolences to the bereaved family and prays for the salvation of his departed soul.

irregularities at the hospital and the authorities’ negligence in their treatment.

He said eight of their fellows were injured when police charged batons on them.

Asked about allegations of beating up hospital cooks, he denied the claim, saying the hospital authorities had failed to provide them with food since the afternoon.

The hospital director said the cook refused to come to the hospital due to security concerns.

Around 2:30pm, this

correspondent found the entrance and exit gates of the hospital locked, with many people waiting outside while protests continued inside.

Many of the patients’ attendants had to endure suffering.

Mousumi Akhter, one such attendant, said her mother underwent surgery yesterday morning, while her son was accompanying her mother at the hospital.

“I was bringing medicine and food for them, but I had to wait at the gate for about three hours before I was allowed in. Both my mother and son suffered a lot,” she

told this correspondent around 4:00pm.

Between 2:00pm and 3:30pm, this correspondent observed the injured July protesters continuing their protest inside the hospital, engaging in several chases and counter-chases with police.

A senior staff nurse, scheduled to join duty from 2:00pm, said she left the place after waiting for about an hour outside the gate.

Imaul Haque, officer-in-charge of Sher-e-Bangla Nagar Police Station, confirmed that several people were injured in the clash inside the hospital.

During the proceedings, ICT prosecutor Gazi Monawar Hossain Tamim told the tribunal new evidence and numerous complaints against Alep Uddin have surfaced, including rape and torture, and hence the agency needs three months’ time to investigate further.

The prosecution also informed the tribunal that the investigation agency requires additional time, as they are also investigating multiple cases of crimes against humanity committed during the July mass uprising.

The tribunal yesterday also set August 18 for

holding a hearing of a case filed against nine individuals over war crimes committed during the Liberation War in 1971.

Of the accused, eight were arrested, and the remaining one went into hiding. However, two of the arrestees died, while six others are currently out on bail.

demonstration for 12 weeks after receiving government assurances regarding their demand for promotion.

The Health Services Division on May 20 issued a circular creating 3,030 supernumerary posts -- 150 for professors, 850 for associate professors, and 2,030 for assistant professors.

On Tuesday, another circular was issued creating 2,059 more posts -- 201 for professors, 548 for associate professors, and 1,310 for assistant professors.

Contacted, an official from the division said they would now hold meetings and issue promotion letters to the selected individuals.

“The process will start soon,” he said, requesting anonymity.

He said the proposal for creating 1,853 more supernumerary posts is pending with the finance ministry and expressed hope it will be approved soon.

These posts have been created for a one-year tenure. If those

supernumerary post holders are not promoted to regular posts within that time, the government may extend the tenure, he said.

Officials at the health ministry and the Directorate General of Health Services (DGHS) said many of these doctors were denied promotion during the previous government for political reasons.

Since the political changeover in August last year, these doctors have been urging the ministry to grant their overdue promotions.

In response, the DGHS sought applications from eligible candidates for various posts and received many submissions.

Candidates were selected based on a set of criteria. As the number of vacant posts was insufficient, the authorities decided to create supernumerary posts, officials said.

Meanwhile, the promotion process for regular posts is also ongoing and expected to be completed soon, said a DGHS director.
