

Man found dead on roadside

Police recovered the body of an unidentified youth, aged around 35 years, from the roadside in Chashara area of Narayanganj city yesterday morning.

The body was found beside Bangabandhu Road, opposite the Narayanganj Press Club, said Md Nasir Ahmed, officer-in-charge of Sadar Model Police Station.

"Locals spotted the body on the roadside and informed us. We recovered the body and sent it to Narayanganj General Hospital for an autopsy," OC Nasir said.

"The body bore multiple injury marks. The cause of death will be confirmed after receiving the autopsy report. We are working to identify the deceased," he added.

left home early in the morning to attend private tutoring at a neighbour's house. After the lesson, he stopped by a nearby shop but never returned home. His family began searching for him, and eventually his body was found inside the slaughterhouse, located next to the shop.

"On information, police went to the spot and recovered the body. After preparing the inquest report, we sent the body to Netrokona Modern Sadar Hospital for autopsy. Further legal steps will be taken once a formal complaint is filed," said Naim Muhammad Nahid Hasan, officer-in-charge of Madan Police Station.

Commissioner (CEC) Kazi Habibul Awal said, "Whether the national election is held in February or April, we must be prepared. Earlier, we were told the timeframe could be from December to June, and we are making preparations accordingly."

Preparations for the upcoming national election have made significant progress, he also said.

At the briefing, Election Commissioner Md Nasir Uddin said, "The timing will depend on discussions with the government and the readiness of all involved. Our responsibility is to prepare thoroughly so we are ready whenever the decision is made."

The number of voters is expected to be around 12.5 crore, according to the EC.

In the last parliamentary election, held on January 7, 2024, there were over

42,000 polling centres and more than 260,000 polling booths.

Educational institutions are typically used as polling centres. On average, one polling centre is allocated for every 3,000 voters and one polling booth for approximately 500 male voters or 400 female voters.

The EC's directive was sent to the secretaries of the Secondary and Higher Education Division, Ministry of Local Government, Rural Development and Cooperatives; Technical and Madrasah Education Division, Ministry of Education; and Ministry of Primary and Mass Education, as well as to the chief engineers of the Local Government Engineering Department and the Education Engineering Department.

"A letter has been sent to the authorities concerned requesting information about establishments used as polling centres in the past and those that could potentially be used in the upcoming election," said Election Commissioner Md Anwarul Islam Sarkar yesterday.

The letter, signed by EC Deputy Secretary Dewan Md Sarwar Jahan, noted that some educational institutions used in the previous national election or considered for use in the upcoming one lack boundary walls or have damaged doors and windows.

The letter further stated that these institutions should undergo minor renovations using funds from the respective ministries or divisions.

The EC Secretariat has requested updated information on the renovation progress of these institutions. The information is to be submitted by July 17.

Maldah river

The Maldah is a small but mighty river that flows along the Bangladesh-India border before passing through Kaliganj and Aditmari upazilas of Lalmonirhat. It stretches around 36 kilometres with an average width of 18 metres. Its meandering nature and strong currents during monsoon often leave the riverbank areas prone to erosion.

Shunil Kumar, executive engineer of BWDB in Lalmonirhat, said, "We visited the erosion-affected site on June 4. The situation has been reported to higher authorities. Once funds are allocated, we will take immediate preventive measures."

390 killed, 1,182 injured during Eid travel

The report shows that motorcycles once again topped the list. At least 134 motorcycle-related crashes led to 147 deaths and 148 injuries -- accounting for 35.35 percent of total road crashes.

The victims also included 61 drivers, 50 transport workers, and 58 pedestrians, the

organisation said.

Overcharging and harassment of passengers were rampant during this Eid as well, Mozammel said.

Due to fare chaos, poor people were forced to travel on the roofs of buses and trains, in open trucks, or on goods-laden vehicles -- risking their lives to return home for Eid, he added.

Mozammel said at least

four days of government holidays before Eid are necessary to reduce road crashes and ease travel-related suffering.

He emphasised the need for long-term planning to improve Eid travel and called for enhancing public transport capacity and removing small vehicles from highways.

He also stressed the

importance of trained drivers, fit vehicles, quality roads, and proper enforcement of laws.

hospitalisation, which is why these cases often go unrecorded," he also said.

He explained that joint pain from chikungunya typically lasts more than a week, making it difficult for patients to stand straight, while dengue-related muscle pain usually eases within a week.

Prof Nazmul advised everyone to use mosquito nets and wear masks to prevent infection.

He also recommended getting an NSI test immediately after the onset of fever to detect dengue. Since chikungunya testing is not widely available, patients who test negative for NSI are observed for a few days before being treated for suspected chikungunya.

He also advised anyone with a fever to consult a doctor and stay hydrated with fluids like coconut water, saline, and fruit juices.

After the rally, protesters submitted a memorandum to the adviser of the Ministry of Housing and Public Works and concluded the day's programme.

Before Eid, the government formed a committee led by Law Adviser Asif Nazrul to review the ordinance.

The ordinance, issued on May 25 amid protests at the Secretariat, allows dismissal of public servants for administrative disruptions within 14 days and without departmental proceedings.

The tribunal took cognisance of the charges and set yesterday as the next date of hearing, asking the trio to be produced before it.

Mamun is already in custody and was produced before the court yesterday.

The ICT also allowed its investigation agency to interrogate former DNCC

mayor Atiquil Islam, former officer-in-charge of Uttara East Police Station Mojibur Rahman, and four others in the agency's office over alleged crimes against humanity during the uprising.

They will be interrogated between June 22 and 25.

The three-member tribunal, led by Justice

Md Golam Mortuza Mozumder, granted permission to the agency after a petition was filed from the prosecution regarding this matter.

Meanwhile, two crude bombs were hurled from a moving vehicle on the road between Curzon Hall and the tribunal building around 5:45am yesterday, said Shahbagh Police

Station Officer in Charge Khalid Munsur.

He said one of the bombs detonated, while a police bomb disposal unit later recovered the other unexploded device from the scene.

No casualties were reported as of filing this report. Law enforcement officials are investigating the incident.
