

Dhaka ignored 2 sisters among 3 killed

In 2017, about 750,000 Rohingyas fled a military campaign in Rakhine State and sheltered in Cox's Bazar. Since then, no repatriation took place despite several attempts. Current number of Rohingya is more than a million and has created environmental, financial, security and diplomatic challenges.

"We provided specific information from the embassy. The first attack on the Rohingyas occurred on August 25, 2017. I had sent a letter to Dhaka on August 11, 2017. The title of the letter was 'A New Phase of Volatility in Rakhine and Its Possible Implications,'" said Sufiur Rahman, now a senior research fellow at the South Asia Institute of Peace and Governance, NSU.

He wrote that Bangladesh might face another wave of Rohingya influx from Buthidaung and Rathedaung of Myanmar's Rakhine State and had recommended that Myanmar be urged -- through the international community -- to reduce tensions in Northern Rakhine.

"At the same time, I suggested taking all necessary steps to prevent a Rohingya influx....," he said.

He shared that on August 25, he attended a meeting with UN officials and proposed the declaration of a safe zone in Rakhine. Due to opposition from Russia and China, a safe zone could not be declared internationally. However, Bangladesh did incorporate the safe zone concept into its state policy at the time.

According to Sufiur Rahman, the decision-making process in Bangladesh in 2017 was flawed and there was no national consensus. Sadly, this lack of consensus still persists in the country.

Addressing the seminar, political scientist Dr Dilara Chowdhury said the previous governments did not make efforts to establish communication with the Arakan Army. Without engaging with them, Rohingya repatriation is not possible, she added.

However, things escalated when Rofiq Mithu, Shah Ali unit convener, lost his temper and physically assaulted Amirul, said Refatul.

The group said Rofiq reacted after discovering Amirul had exchanged sensitive political information on WhatsApp with Awami League leaders and spread rumours targeting various groups.

"This was a spontaneous and personal act. Rofiq apologised, and the situation was defused," Refatul said.

They also claimed a TV report falsely framed the incident as politically motivated extortion, using a video recorded by Jamil Taj to tarnish SAD's image. "The matter ended peacefully with Rofiq's apology," the statement added.

On May 26, SAD suspended Refatul and Parvez for "moral misconduct".

Meanwhile, Amirul Islam filed a case on May 28 with Mirpur Police against 19 individuals, including Refatul and Sadman, over the incident, which took place on May 13.

According to the case, on May 13 around 1:30pm, 6-7 youths claiming to be officers from Mirpur Model Police Station intercepted him, accused him of 41 cases, and forced him onto a motorcycle. He was taken

both domestic and international tourists. Many of them now place orders online, and his furniture even gets shipped to countries including Qatar, Saudi Arabia, the UK, and the US.

"In recent years, the demand has increased considerably. I am now selling furniture worth 35-40 lakh takas annually. We send furniture through courier services, and some buyers even arrange for international shipments themselves," said Siraj.

He also built a two-story house using bamboo, showcasing the material's versatility and durability. Siraj's success has inspired many local youths to learn bamboo craftsmanship from him and thereby engage in this cottage industry professionally to leave behind unemployment.

Workers at his workshop explained the labour-intensive process involved in this trade. The bamboo must be thoroughly dried,

Officer-in-Charge Md Moshfekur Rahman of Pakshey Highway Police Station said the accident took place around 10:30am, when Belal and his family were traveling to Pabna on a motorcycle.

When they reached the Kalikapur area of the highway, a pickup truck hit the motorbike, leaving Belal dead on the spot, while his wife Rupali Khatun, son Tanjil Hossain,

to the rooftop of a 10-storey building in South Bishil under Darussalam Police Station.

There, 20-25 people were present. Inside a room, he was allegedly detained and tortured. Refatul, Sadman, and Parvez allegedly snatched his phone, wallet, and two blank cheques. Others tied him to a chair and beat him with rods, pipes, and bamboo sticks until he lost consciousness, Amirul alleged.

Upon regaining consciousness, he was allegedly forced to issue a bank cheque, sign blank stamp papers, and record a video promising to pay Tk 5 crore within seven days or hand over his assets, the case stated.

Speaking to The Daily Star, Amirul denied all claims made by SAD.

"I received a contract through another contractor to construct a road in Rajbari and assigned the work to a man named Golam Mostofa. Amzad was brought in as a sub-contractor to supply sand. Later, he showed interest in completing the rest of the construction of the road but failed to do so. Despite that, he later demanded payment," he claimed.

Amirul expressed little hope for justice, saying none of the accused had been arrested.

Sajjad Rumon, officer-

and daughter Bushra were injured.

Police and firefighters rushed to the spot and rescued the victims, he added.

The injured were taken to Pabna General Hospital in critical condition.

Police seized the pickup truck and detained its driver from the scene. A case will be filed with the highway police station, he added.

in-charge of Mirpur Police Station, said some accused have secured High Court bail and their documents are being verified, while others are on the run.

ALLEGATION OF LOOTING FREEDOM FIGHTER'S HOUSE

In a separate incident on February 6, around 35 to 40 men identifying as students attacked the Mirpur residence of freedom fighter Kazi Abdul Haque around 2:30am.

The family claimed the attackers looted 22 bhoris of gold ornaments, Tk 8 lakh in cash, two televisions, watches, and important documents.

The family blamed SAD members for the attack.

SAD denied involvement, saying they arrived after the incident to calm the situation.

"We were there to control the mob and immediately informed the police," Refatul said yesterday.

As of yesterday, no case had been filed, and the family alleged police refused to record their complaint.

At the press conference, SAD leaders said media reports were part of a campaign to discredit their role in last year's anti-discrimination movement.

The Daily Star attempted to reach SAD spokesperson Umama Fatema for comment, but she did not respond.

"If this disrupts all activities of the building, we will not take responsibility," he added.

He urged the government to withdraw the ordinance within 48 hours and create the conditions for employees to return to their duties.

Issued on May 25, the ordinance allows authorities to dismiss public servants for administrative disruptions within 14 days and without departmental proceedings or formal investigations.

Since its issuance, the Secretariat staff have been staging continuous protests, calling for the ordinance to be revoked.

In response, on June 4, the government formed a review committee headed by the law adviser.

The committee held its first meeting on Monday and reportedly agreed to engage in dialogue with employee representatives.

However, employee leaders yesterday claimed that they had yet to receive any formal invitation from the government for such discussions.

ICT appoints defence counsel for Hasina

Prosecutor Gazi Monawar Hossain Tamim cited Section 41 of the International Crimes (Tribunals) Act, which allows the tribunal to appoint one or more amicus curiae.

The tribunal then appointed Masihuzzaman as amicus curiae and set June 25 for the next hearing.

Later, at a press briefing, Tamim said the amicus curiae will provide legal opinions and assist the tribunal in interpreting the law.

He added that investigators had verified the leaked audio clip and, based on its authenticity, the prosecution moved to file the contempt petition

under Section 11(4) of the Act.

He said the tribunal had earlier ordered both accused -- Hasina and former Gobindaganj Upazila Parishad Chairman Shakil Akanda Bulbul -- to appear in court. When they failed to comply, the tribunal, in the interest of fairness, directed that public notices be published in two national newspapers, asking them to appear and respond.

The contempt petition stems from a leaked phone call that circulated on social media last year and was later reported by mainstream media.

In the audio, Hasina was allegedly heard telling Bulbul, "I have had 227 cases filed against me, so I

have received a licence to kill 227 people."

The tribunal considers the remark contemptuous. The petition was filed on April 30 this year.

Meanwhile, Toby Cadman, special prosecutorial adviser to ICT Chief Prosecutor Tajul Islam, said reforms are still needed to align the tribunal more closely with international standards.

Speaking to reporters, he acknowledged progress in bringing the tribunal's rules in line with global norms, but added that further amendments are necessary. "The details are for the government to decide," he said.

Cadman also stressed the need for additional judicial appointments

with the establishment of a second tribunal. "This process is too important, not just for Bangladesh but for international criminal justice," he said.

Regarding the contempt case, he said it is separate from the tribunal's core charges and that Hasina had the right to boycott the proceedings. "However, the tribunal must ensure the rights of any accused are fully protected," he said.
