

World must adapt to rising heat
Says WMO as Europe roasts in high temperatures

The world will have to learn to live with heatwaves, the United Nations' weather and climate agency said yesterday, as much of Europe roasted in high summer temperatures.
The World Meteorological Organization said that in future, people could expect heatwaves to occur more often and be more intense because of human-induced climate change.
WMO spokeswoman Clare Nullis said July was traditionally the hottest month of the year in the northern hemisphere, but it was exceptional to have episodes of extreme heat this early in the summer.
She said extreme heat was "widely called the silent killer", with the death toll often under-reflected in statistics, compared to, for example, a tropical cyclone.





LEAKED HUN SEN CALL
Thai court suspends PM from duty

Thailand's Constitutional Court yesterday suspended Prime Minister Paetongtarn Shinawatra from duty pending a case seeking her dismissal, in a major setback for a government under fire on multiple fronts and fighting for its survival.
The court accepted a petition from 36 senators accusing Paetongtarn of dishonesty and breaching ethical standards, based on a leak of a sensitive telephone call with Cambodia's influential former leader Hun Sen that was intended to de-escalate a territorial row and tense troop buildup at their border.
The leaked June 15 call triggered domestic fury and has left Paetongtarn's coalition with a razor-thin majority after a big party abandoned the alliance and accused her of undermining sovereignty, as protest groups threaten more demonstrations to demand a new government.
Deputy PM Juangroongruangkit takes over as caretaker premier while court decides the case against Paetongtarn, who has 15 days to respond and will stay in the cabinet as the new culture minister following a reshuffle.

Iran's nuke site shows activity after US bombing

New satellite images show continuing work at Iran's Fordow nuclear enrichment plant, which was struck by US B-2 bombers just over a week ago.
The imagery was collected by Maxar Technologies on Sunday. Maxar said it "reveals ongoing activity at and near the ventilation shafts and holes caused by last week's airstrikes on the Fordow fuel enrichment complex."
The pictures show "an excavator and several personnel are positioned immediately next to the northern shaft on the ridge above the underground complex. The crane appears to be operating at the entrance to the shaft/hole."
According to Maxar, several additional vehicles are also seen



below the ridge and are parked along the path that was built to access the site.
Earlier this month, American B-2 bombers dropped more than a dozen bunker-buster bombs on Iran's Fordow and Natanz nuclear sites, while Tomahawk missiles launched from a US submarine hit the Isfahan site in central Iran.
The US Massive Ordnance Penetrator (MOP) bombs targeted the two ventilation shafts at Fordow,

according to the Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff Dan Caine.
He told a Pentagon briefing last week that most of the bombs dropped at Fordow "were tasked to enter the main shaft, move down into the complex at greater than 1,000 feet per second, and explode in the mission space."
Former nuclear inspector David Albright said that imagery from Fordow on Saturday showed "the Iranians are actively working at the two MOP impact sites penetrating the ventilation shafts" at the plant.
Albright assessed that the activity "may include backfilling the craters, as well as conducting engineering damage assessments and likely radiological sampling. The craters above the main shafts remain open."

Trump suggests slashing Tesla subsidies
Elon Musk says 'cut it all'

US President Donald Trump yesterday suggested the government efficiency department should review the subsidies to Tesla CEO Elon Musk's companies to save money, reigniting a war of words between the world's most powerful person and its richest.
Trump's remarks came after Musk, a Republican mega-donor, renewed his criticism of the sweeping tax-cut and spending bill and vowed to unseat lawmakers who supported it despite campaigning on limiting government spending.
"Elon may get more subsidy than any human being in history, by far, and without subsidies, Elon would probably have to close up shop and head back home to South Africa," Trump said in a Truth Social post, referring to the Department of Government Efficiency.
"No more Rocket launches, Satellites, or Electric Car Production, and our Country would save a FORTUNE. Perhaps we should have DOGE take a good, hard, look at this? BIG MONEY TO BE SAVED!!!"
In response, Musk said on his own social media platform X, "I am literally saying CUT IT ALL. Now."
Trump said Musk was upset because he lost the EV mandate in the recent tax and spending bill and warned the Tesla CEO "could lose a lot more than that".

TACKLING AIR POLLUTION
Delhi bans fuel for old cars

India's capital New Delhi banned fuel sales to ageing vehicles yesterday as authorities try to tackle the sprawling megacity's hazardous air pollution.
The city is regularly ranked one of the most polluted capitals globally with acrid smog blanketing its skyline every winter.
At the peak of the smog, levels of PM2.5 pollutants - dangerous cancer-causing microparticles small enough to enter the bloodstream through the lungs - surge to more than 60 times the World Health Organization's recommended daily maximum. Petrol cars older than 15 years, and diesel vehicles older than 10, were already banned from operating on New Delhi's roads by a 2018 Supreme Court ruling.

March to Rebuild the Nation".
The march that started with a visit to Abu Sayed's grave, is set to go through all 64 districts.
Nahid said, "Today, we have launched our July march. Martyrs like Abu Sayed continue to inspire our struggle to dismantle fascist systems. For generations to come, the people of Bangladesh will revere Abu Sayed, Mughda, Wasim, and all other martyrs and wounded fighters."
Yesterday marked the beginning of the first anniversary of the July uprising. Exactly one year ago, on this day, a movement began under the

banner of Students Against Discrimination.
"That quota reform movement transformed into a mass uprising and brought down the authoritarian fascist government. The death of Abu Sayed played a vital role in that downfall.
"We are calling the July march: 'A March to Build the Nation'."
While visiting Abu Sayed's grave, Nahid also paid tribute to all martyrs and injured fighters of July on behalf of the NCP, and all students and citizens who took part in the uprising.
"From here, we once again reiterate our three core demands: justice, reform, and a new

constitution. To build a new Bangladesh, we must pursue justice and reform and move towards a new constitution through an elected constituent assembly."
After visiting Abu Sayed's grave, the march moved on to Gaibandha town, where the NCP held another rally on the Shaheed Minar premises at the town's Municipal Park at 3:00pm.
Nahid said people did not take part in the mass uprising and shed their blood on the streets just so one party could replace another.
"The movement shattered fear and taught us to speak without hesitation. The movement

brought about a new country, but the nation has not yet been built. We've taken to the streets to build a new country where people of all religions and ethnicities can express their opinions and claim their rights without fear."
Nahid was accompanied by NCP Member Secretary Akhter Hossen, Senior Joint Convener Samanta Shermeen, Senior Joint Member Secretary Dr Tasnim Zara, Chief Coordinator Nasiruddin Patwari, and Chief Organiser (Southern Region) Hasnat Abdullah, among others.

Of the 103 incidents, the report attributed 48 to security forces, including operations in 34 villages, during which at least 125 individuals were allegedly subjected to rights violations. Nineteen people were detained temporarily, while nine were implicated in what the report described as false cases.
Among the documented violations were arbitrary arrests of 49 individuals, reported forced religious conversion of 30 children, and grabbing of at least 300 acres of land by influential outsiders and settlers.
While the government has reconstituted the three hill district councils, appointed a new chairperson to the CHI Development Board, and reformulated the Peace Accord Implementation and

Monitoring Committee, no sincere effort has been visible. Though six months have passed since the reconstitution of the committee, no meeting took place.
PCJSS alleged the government is pursuing a "fascist" approach to the CHI crisis through widespread deployment of security forces rather than implementing the peace accord.
The report further alleged that private entities and influential individuals initiated rubber plantation, horticulture, and tourism ventures in parts of Bandarban, including Lama, Alikadam, and Naikhongchhari, resulting in the eviction and harassment of local indigenous communities.
PCJSS also documented 21 incidents allegedly carried out by settler

and land-grabbing groups, involving 79 victims - including the aforementioned 30 children - and the seizure of approximately 300 acres of land.
Fifteen cases of violence against indigenous women and children were recorded during the same period.
According to the report, no justice has been delivered in these cases, and perpetrators are reportedly enjoying impunity. The organisation warned of a rise in sexual violence against indigenous women as a result.
The report called for urgent government action to reverse the deteriorating human rights situation and fully implement the peace accord.
The Daily Star could not independently verify the claims made in the report.

Trump signs order lifting sanctions on Syria
Says White House; rockets fired at Iraq airport

President Donald Trump on Monday formally dismantled US sanctions against Syria, hoping to reintegrate the war-battered country into the global economy as Israel eyes ties with its new leadership.
Trump lifted most sanctions against Syria in May, responding to appeals from Saudi Arabia and Turkey after former Islamist guerrilla Ahmed al-Sharaa ended a half-century of rule by the Assad family.
Meanwhile, two rockets struck the military section of Kirkuk airport in northern Iraq late on Monday, slightly wounding two security personnel, a senior security said.
