

Freeze war at current battle lines

Trump calls on Russia, Ukraine; Zelensky says Kyiv preparing contract to buy 25 Patriot systems

United States President Donald Trump has called for Russia and Ukraine to freeze the war along current battle lines – a proposal that would see Moscow keep large areas of Ukrainian territory.

Trump told reporters late on Sunday that the two sides should just stop fighting and resolve the “details” over territory at future talks. The current front line runs through the Donbas region, an industrial hub.

“What I say is they should stop right now at the battle lines, go home, stop killing people and be done,” the US president said, adding that it would be difficult to negotiate details of a final resolution.

Asked about what would happen to Donbas, which has seen most of the fighting, Trump said: “Let it be cut the way it is. It’s cut up right now – I think 78 percent of the land is already taken by Russia. You leave it the way it is right now. They can negotiate something later on down the line.”

Ukraine has previously insisted on reclaiming all of its



land. Trump himself asserted last month that Ukraine can win militarily and recapture all of the territories occupied by Russia, which also includes the Crimean Peninsula and other areas in eastern Ukraine, reports Al Jazeera online.

The US president, who had promised to swiftly end the war between Russia and Ukraine, is set to meet his Russian counterpart, Vladimir Putin, in Hungary in the coming weeks.

Zelensky has said he would be ready to join Putin and Trump at their summit in Hungary if he is invited.

Meanwhile, Ukraine is preparing a contract to buy 25 Patriot air defence systems, Volodymyr Zelensky said, in what would be a huge boost to Kyiv’s abilities to defend against Russia’s aerial bombardments.

In comments to media at a meeting on Sunday and cleared for use yesterday, Zelensky said the systems would be supplied every year for a number of years, and that Ukraine would seek for some European nations to give Kyiv priority in the queue for the systems.

Myanmar junta seizes 30 Starlink receivers

Myanmar’s junta raided one of the country’s most notorious cyberscams and seized Starlink satellite internet devices, it said yesterday, after an AFP investigation revealed an explosion in their use in the multibillion dollar illicit industry.

Internet sweatshops where workers scam unsuspecting foreigners with business or romance schemes have thrived in war-ravaged Myanmar’s lawless border regions.

Trump-Petro feud intensifies

Colombia yesterday said its ambassador to the United States had been recalled, as a public feud between the nations’ leaders heats up with President Donald Trump revoking aid and threatening punishing tariffs.

Trump on Sunday vowed to end aid to the South American nation, a historically close US partner, accusing his leftist Colombian counterpart Gustavo Petro of being an “illegal drug leader.”

He also said he would be making an announcement on tariffs targeting Colombia later yesterday.

The threats came as the United States announced it had struck another alleged drug running vessel in international waters, killing three people.

Looted Louvre treasures may never be found

The Louvre museum in Paris remained closed yesterday as investigations continue into Sunday’s extraordinary theft of historic jewelry – and experts say the prospects of recovering the treasures are slim.

In a post on X, the museum said it regretted yesterday’s closure, as France begins to digest the implications of the brazen heist in which robbers made off with artefacts from the French crown jewels, dating from the Napoleonic era.

French Justice Minister Gerald Darmanin admitted that the Louvre heist exposed security failings at the museum.

‘Keep dreaming’
Iran’s Khamenei tells Trump after claim of destroying Iran nuclear sites

Iran’s Supreme Leader Ayatollah Ali Khamenei yesterday rebuffed claims by US President Donald Trump that the Islamic republic’s nuclear sites had been destroyed by US strikes in June.

In a statement on his official website, Khamenei told Trump to “keep dreaming” over the comments on the sites’ destruction and questioned the US president’s right “to say what a country should or should not have if it possesses a nuclear industry”.

In mid-June, Israel launched an unprecedented bombing campaign on Iran. The US briefly joined in, striking key Iranian nuclear facilities.

Last week, during a speech at the Israeli Knesset, Trump reiterated that the US confirmed “obliterating” Iranian nuclear sites during the strikes.

“So we dropped 14 bombs on Iran’s key nuclear facilities. Totally as I said originally obliterating them and that’s been confirmed,” he said. In a Sunday interview with Fox News, Trump also said Iran “no longer became the

bully of the Middle East” after the US strikes which “destroyed their nuclear capability”.

He further called the strikes “the most beautiful military operation”.

The true impact of the US strikes remains unknown. The Pentagon has said that the strikes delayed Iran’s nuclear programme by between one and two years, contradicting an initial classified US intelligence report that according to American media found the setback was only by a few months.

Yesterday, Khamenei called Trump’s remarks “improper, wrong, and bullying”.

The June war with Israel took place two days ahead of a planned sixth round of nuclear negotiations between Tehran and Washington, which had begun in April.

Nuclear talks have been derailed since with Iran saying it was open to negotiations only if the US provided guarantees of no military action.

Western powers accuse Iran of covertly trying to develop a nuclear bomb through enrichment of uranium, and want it to cease such activity. Tehran denies seeking to weaponize enrichment.

Bolivia elects center-right president
Two decades of socialism end

Bolivians on Sunday elected a pro-business center-right senator as their new president, ending two decades of socialist rule that left the South American nation deep in economic crisis.

With 97.8 percent of ballots counted, Rodrigo Paz had 54.6 percent of the vote to 45.4 percent for his rival, right-wing former interim president Jorge “Tuto” Quiroga, the Supreme Electoral Tribunal said.

The news was greeted with joy, music and fireworks on the streets of La Paz.

“We came to celebrate the victory with great hope of a new direction for Bolivia,” Julio Andrey, a 40-year-old lawyer, told AFP.

Paz, the 58-year-old son of a former president, has vowed a “capitalism for all” approach to economic reform, with decentralization, lower taxes and fiscal discipline mixed with continued social spending.



In his victory address, Paz said Bolivia was “reclaiming its place on the international stage.”

Paz also said he had received a congratulatory message from US President Donald Trump, while Secretary of State Marco Rubio said Washington “stands ready to partner with Bolivia on shared priorities.”

“After two decades of mismanagement, President-elect Paz’s election marks a transformative opportunity for both nations,” Rubio said.

Under ex-president Evo Morales, Bolivia took a sharp turn to the left: nationalizing energy resources, breaking ties with Washington and making alliances with China, Russia and fellow leftists in Cuba, Venezuela and elsewhere in Latin America.

After the results were announced, Paz’s vice presidential running mate, Edmundo Lara, made a call for “unity and reconciliation” after a bitter campaign.

Colombia recalls ambassador to US

Trump-Petro feud intensifies

The boat was affiliated with a Colombian armed group, the National Liberation Army (ELN), US Defense Secretary Pete Hegseth said.

That strike came on the heels of another attack -- on a semi-submersible vessel -- that left two survivors, one of whom was Colombian.

Petro, who has clashed with Trump since the US leader returned to power in January, has fiercely criticized the deadly anti-drug campaign in the Caribbean.

He has accused Trump of murder and of violating Colombia’s sovereignty.

Colombia’s Ambassador Daniel García Pena has already returned to Bogota, the foreign ministry said yesterday in a statement, adding Petro’s government would be making further announcements during the day.
