Japan warns

Japan has warned its citizens in China to be careful of their surroundings and to avoid big crowds amid a diplomatic row over Prime Minister Sanae Takaichi's comments on Taiwan.

The escalating spat has already seen Beijing advise Chinese citizens to avoid travelling to Japan and hit Tokyo stocks. The screenings of at least two Japanese movies will also be postponed in China, state media reported.

"Pay attention to your surroundings and avoid as much as possible squares where large crowds gather, or places that are likely to be identified as being used by many Japanese people," the Japanese embassy in China said.

Beijing yesterday vowed to "protect the safety" of foreigners, but said it had reiterated a "strong protest" with Tokyo over Takaichi's comments.

Western aid cuts could
cause 22.6m deaths

Say researchers; WFP warns 318 million people will face crisis-level hunger or worse next year

Abrupt cuts to development aid by major donor countries could cause up to 22.6 million additional deaths in developing countries by 2030, including 5.4 million children under five, according to a new study by the Barcelona Institute for Global Health (ISGlobal) and other organizations.

The warning comes as the United States, Britain, Germany and France have each reduced development aid for the first time in nearly three decades and are planning further cuts in 2025. The ISGlobal study said continued cuts could reverse decades of progress in global health and poverty reduction.

The global health research centre's report, a copy of which was viewed by Reuters, examined data from 93 low- and middle-income countries to estimate the impact of further reductions in official development assistance (ODA) in 2025, on top of sharp cuts over the past five years.

It concluded that a severe reduction in that assistance would



lead to 22.6 million additional deaths, including 5.4 million children under five, by 2030, significantly higher than the research institute had estimated in a previous study that focused on US cuts.

The authors modeled both a severe and a mild scenario for future aid cuts, along with one that would have maintained 2023 funding levels.

Meanwhile, the United Nations World Food Programme (WFP) warned yesterday that the world is facing a deepening hunger crisis with resources falling far short of needs, citing sharp declines in humanitarian funding.

In its 2026 Global Outlook, the Rome-based WFP said 318 million people were expected to face crisis levels of hunger or worse next year, more than double the number in 2019.

Trump declines to rule
out troops in Venezuela
Floats talks with Maduro amid escalation

President Donald Trump said on Monday he has not ruled out putting American forces on the ground in Venezuela, while expressing a willingness to hear directly from Nicolas Maduro regarding the Venezuelan leader's proposals to avert further US military escalation.

Asked if he would rule out US troops on the ground in the South American country, Trump said: "No, I don't rule out that, I don't rule out anything."

Still, questioned if he would speak to Maduro directly, Trump told reporters at the White House: "I probably would talk to him, yeah. I talk to everybody."

Maduro, when asked about Trump's comments on Monday, said differences could be resolved through diplomacy and that he is willing to hold face-to-face talks with anyone interested.

"In the United States, whoever wants to talk with Venezuela will talk, face to face, without any problem," Maduro said.

The US has been waging a campaign of deadly strikes against suspected drug trafficking boats off the Venezuelan coast and the Pacific coast of Latin America.

Maduro has repeatedly alleged that a US military buildup in the Caribbean is designed to drive him from power.

Taken as a whole, Trump's comments suggest he is willing to dramatically escalate his administration's confrontation with Venezuela, even as he is open to seeking an off-ramp if presented with an interesting enough proposal from the Venezuelan government.

No company immune

Suspects may have ties
to underworld: cops

criminal activities in the area and maintain ties with top underworld figure Ibrahim and the Shahadat group.

Contacted by this newspaper, a close associate of Kibria, preferring anonymity, said three brothers, Zamil, Mamun and Moshir, have dominated drug trading, extortion and land grabbing in Pallabi for years. "During the Awami League government, a senior BGMEA leader reportedly gave them cover. All three of them have been abroad for long. Mamun is already accused in many cases.

"After the August 5 political changeover, the brothers tried to expand their control, especially over drugs, by establishing links with underworld figures Ibrahim and Shahadat."

The associate added, "Recently, acting on instructions from a senior BNP leader in North Dhaka, Kibria attempted to curb the spread of drugs. Mamun, once a close associate, did not take this well.

"Last Saturday, Kibria bhai called me and shared his concerns."

A Jubo Dal leader familiar with both men said Kibria intended to contest for the councillor post from Pallabi. "That's why he took steps to curb drug trading and extortion, which boosted his popularity.

"Mamun did not take it well and that is why he, his nephew Masum and his cohorts carried out the killing."

Kibria's wife Sabiha Akter Dina filed a murder case with Pallabi Police Station against five named and seven to eight unnamed individuals yesterday afternoon.

The named accused are Md Joni Bhuiyan, 25; Shohel alias Pata Shohel alias Monir Hossen, 30; Shohag alias Kallu, 27; Masum alias Bhaigna Masud, 28; and Rokon, 30.

Officer-in-Charge of Pallabi Police Station Mafizur Rahaman said

Joni, who was at the scene, has been arrested. "More individuals have been identified and efforts are underway to arrest others."

According to the case statement, Kibria was meeting associates at the Bikrampur Hardware and Sanitary Shop around 6:00pm on Monday.

Around 6:42pm, three of the accused, Joni, Sohag and Rokon, entered the shop to kill him under instructions from two other accused, Shohel and Masum, who were nearby.

The statement added that they opened fire on Kibria, hitting multiple parts of the upper body. He sustained bullet wounds to the cheek or jaw, both sides of the chest, the right side of the neck, both arms, the back of his neck and behind his left ear.

Kibria's body was taken to his parents' house yesterday afternoon at the "Dha" block, Lane-1, Pallabi, just 200-250 feet from where he was shot.

During a visit around 2:00pm yesterday, relatives and leaders and activists of the BNP and its affiliated organisations were seen at the lane.


Approached by The Daily Star, Kibria's younger brother Golam Kabir said, "....The motive behind the killing remains unclear.... My brother's political position was becoming stronger day by day. That could be a reason."

Kibria ran the hardware shop he was shot in, in partnership with Masud Rana at B Block, Road-5.

Yesterday, Masud Rana told The Daily Star, "He was at the shop since noon; I even brought lunch for him. Shortly after 6:30pm, unidentified assailants entered and shot him."

Police sources said several recent murders and shootings are linked to turf wars and personal feuds, tracing back to top figures in the underworld.

The killing took place just days after listed criminal Tariq Saif Mamun was shot dead in broad daylight, only yards from Dhaka's court area.


