
Want to help stray animals? Here's how you can make a real impact

Baitul Mamur Jam-e-Mosque:

A prayer space amidst the greenery of Lakshmipur

Located amidst a lush landscape, the Baitul Mamur Jam-e-Mosque is a captivating architectural landmark in Lakshmipur. The mosque stands as an iconic structure, as its unique arched roof catches the eye of passers-by. Since its completion, the mosque has garnered attention from local people, and it has become a popular spot for religious congregations.


“At first, the building sparked curiosity, as a vault-like form was a new sight in the region,” reflected Kazi Fida Islam, the principal architect of Kazi Fida Architects (KFA) and the lead architect of the mosque. “However, upon completion, it has been widely appreciated. Many were drawn to its distinctive presence in the village and gathered here to offer a prayer, eventually transforming it into a local landmark.”

“Choosing a simple rectangular block as



a form preserved the geometric purity as it stands out against the tranquil landscape of Lakshmipur,” commented Fida Islam.

Stepping inside, one finds the mosque to be a free-flowing space where devotees



of Mohadevpur village gather and find themselves in an ambient atmosphere. The column-free interior allows the space to unfold as one continuous volume, which inspires a contemplative state of mind for the worshippers.

“A continuous spatial flow evokes a sense of infiniteness and eternal faith,” added the architect.

The longstanding practice of praying in congregation is deeply embedded in Islam. Subtle features like round and edgeless corners make the space blend with the user’s psyche while effortlessly merging with the greenery of the surroundings. For many visitors, this openness feels refreshing and peaceful.

“To some extent, the experience of a moment is invariably shaped by architecture. A meditative space must be unconfined, avoiding any sense of claustrophobia,” Kazi Fida Islam reiterated. For him, religious architecture must create room for contemplation.

In his opinion, design and architecture should be tied to nature in all its functions. The connection with the surroundings, like the movement of the sun, the wind, and all elemental forces defining time and space, inspires users to engage in everyday activities with greater focus and meaning. This philosophy guided the spatial and environmental decisions behind the mosque, which was commissioned by

Farhad Chowdhury Nehal.

Architect Kazi Fida Islam is currently practising in Dhaka, and emphasises the use of raw materials like concrete, metal, and lightweight structures that embody simplicity and minimalism. The mosque also features concrete for its structural stability and durability.

“Ample daylight flows into the prayer hall and the openings in north-south directions,” he explained. This passive strategy reduces reliance on mechanical cooling.

One of the defining gestures of the mosque is the transparent east — west facade, allowing light to travel across the prayer hall and extending the sense of spatial continuity. For anyone offering prayer inside the hall, the openness gently establishes a feeling of infiniteness.

“The prayer space experiencing the openness in front, embodied as a facade, is the threshold symbolising transcendence of one’s inner journey,” observed Kazi Fida Islam. A pond along the west side helps temper heat from the afternoon sun, while new plantations of local species is planned so that they grow naturally and shade the mosque through the hotter months.

“Whether through natural elements or innovative architectural solutions, we wanted to create a seamless connection between nature and people,” remarked Fida Islam. “We believe the influence of nature can outweigh the technical barriers and enrich one’s spiritual experience,” concluded the architect.

Animal cruelty goes viral, then disappears. The problem doesn't.

The image is difficult to forget: A mother dog in Pabna roaming from corner to corner, searching desperately for her new-born pups. Videos show her sniffing the ground and pacing in circles — unaware that eight of her puppies had already been drowned in a pond by someone who decided their lives were disposable.

The footage has spread across social media, followed by outrage and calls for justice. But anyone familiar with how this unfolds in Bangladesh also knows what comes next: a few days of noise, followed by silence. Another case replaces it. Another video pushes it down the timeline.

We have become disturbingly familiar with videos like these. So, what has happened to our collective conscience?

The psychology of cruelty

According to Dr Helal Uddin Ahmed, a professor of Child, Adolescent and Family Psychiatry at Faridpur Medical College, violence against helpless animals often stems from deeper emotional dysfunction. "There is a projection of one's own suppressed anger, frustration, and helplessness onto creatures who cannot retaliate. It becomes a way to feel in control when someone feels powerless in their own lives," he notes.

Animal cruelty, he says, is frequently tied to unaddressed stress, low emotional intelligence, and the inability to regulate impulses. For some individuals, harming an animal becomes an outlet — a deeply warped one — through which, they release their own internal conflicts. But psychology alone does not explain the scale of the problem.

Cruelty is no longer shocking, and that is the real problem

The mother dog's suffering is not an isolated tragedy. Not long ago, a five-month-old kitten in Dhaka was beaten mercilessly — an attack so brutal that its cries echoed through social media. When the owner confronted the abusers, she was abused in return. For days, people debated the incident. Then it vanished into the digital churn.

How did we get here, to a country where harming defenceless animals is not shocking, but expected?



The widespread circulation of graphic videos has created a paradox. People are more aware of cruelty, yet more desensitised to it. Viral content produces rapid emotional responses, but rarely long-term engagement.

Farhana Sultana, a PhD scholar studying psychology, describes the current mindset. "People feel bad for a moment, share the post, and then scroll to the next thing. The concern rarely turns into action. I believe that this short-lived engagement compromises accountability."

Without sustained pressure, perpetrators go unpunished, allowing the cycle to continue.

Legal protections exist, but are barely enforced

Bangladesh introduced the Animal Welfare Act 2019, which outlines penalties for abuse and sets guidelines for humane treatment. On paper, the law is comprehensive. In practice, enforcement is limited.

Many citizens are unaware of how to report animal cruelty. Law enforcement agencies often lack training or interest in handling such cases. As a result, most incidents rely on social media exposure rather than formal legal processes.

Mahmudul Hasan, a university student, points out, "We see laws being quoted online, but when someone tries to file a complaint, there's confusion about where to go and who is responsible." Hasan, a regular volunteer at an animal shelter, has voiced his frustration with the inadequate and fragmented infrastructure for protecting, rescuing, and treating street animals.



This disconnect between legislation and implementation creates an environment where cruelty can continue without consequence.

Street animals are part of our neighbourhoods. They scavenge to survive. They curl up on warm corners to rest. They do not exist to disturb us — they coexist with us. Sultana remarks bluntly, "Every religion teaches mercy. But here, we treat animals as if their lives don't matter at all."

The truth is uncomfortable: harming animals has become normalised in a society that claims to value compassion.

A case that should not be forgotten

The cruelty that the mother dog has faced is a direct reminder of an unresolved act of violence. The incident is recent, ongoing, and representative of a pattern that deserves attention beyond a few days of social media visibility.

If we want to reduce cruelty, we must treat these cases not as isolated emotional triggers, but as indicators of a structural problem — one involving law enforcement, psychological health, public awareness, and ethical responsibility.

Animal welfare is not a minor social issue. It is a measure of collective behaviour, accountability, and empathy. And as long as cases like Pabna continue without meaningful action, the question remains: what does this say about our society's willingness to protect those who cannot protect themselves?

A TASTE OF NOSTALGIA: Chattogram's Beloved Liberty Falooda

When you walk into Liberty Drink House, or just Liberty Falooda as the locals lovingly call it, you'll enter a small, vintage-style shop frozen in time. The old-fashioned logo, the retro tiles, and the classic seating arrangements make you feel as if the 20th century never really left. It's the kind of place where people don't just stop by for a treat; they come to relive nostalgia.

As you can guess from the name locals have given it, the first thing most people order is the legendary falooda. And when you order one, you're served two glasses: a tall glass filled with the dessert itself, and another simple glass of water. It's just their way of doing it, and that hasn't changed in decades.

House has kept its original list of items from 1964. Almost nothing has changed, not the recipes, not the ingredients, not even the serving style. The shop believes that the secret of their popularity lies in maintaining authenticity. According to the manager, Saber Ahmed, nearly everything served here is made in-house, except the noodles. "From the curdled milk to the jelly, everything is prepared fresh every day," he shared.

The falooda itself is built in four simple layers. At the bottom sits their homemade ice cream. Above it is a layer of noodles, followed by

curdled milk — a unique touch that no other falooda offers, giving it that unique richness. And finally, on top, a layer of bright green and red jelly. It might look simple, but the balance of textures makes it

unforgettable.

For those who aren't fans of noodles, there's an alternative: the fruit salad. It follows the same layered concept, but the noodles are replaced with freshly cut seasonal fruits. Refreshing, colourful, and surprisingly filling, it's offered at the same price as the falooda — Tk 130.

Back in 1964, a glass of falooda cost only Tk 3.

Today, it's Tk 130, a small increase considering how many years have passed, and how the shop has stayed true to its original recipe.

And that is what makes Liberty Drink House truly special. It's not just a shop, it's a small piece of Chattogram's food heritage, still alive, still cherished, and still serving memories in tall glasses.




The shop is located on the first floor of Chattogram New Market (Bipani Bitan), a space crowded with shoppers every day. For many people, a visit to New Market is incomplete without a stop at Liberty for a chilled glass of falooda.

The history of this shop is just as fascinating as its taste. Liberty Drink House first started its journey in 1964, during the Pakistan period. Its original owner was a Pakistani businessman who introduced a unique style of falooda to the city, long before it became a mainstream dessert. After the Liberation War, in 1989, it was bought and revived by Hosne Ara Begum. She reopened the shop with the same menu and slowly rebuilt its reputation. Today, she remains the proud owner, watching over a business that has served generations.

One of the most remarkable things about the shop is that Abdul Malek, one of its very first chefs, still works there. Now an elderly man, he prepares each item with the same quiet dedication he had back in the 1960s.

Speaking of the menu, Liberty Drink

The Date of Birth dilemma

Is your actual birthday the same as the one listed on your birth certificate, national identity card, or passport? If so, congratulations! Because most Bangladeshis have an 'official' date of birth (DOB) and an 'actual' DOB. In rare instances, the 'actual' DOB matches the 'official' DOB. But why is this the case?

When I was a kid in the '80s and '90s, the common practice was to reduce a child's age by at least one year, so the child could appear for the admission tests of top-tier schools more than one time. If a child failed the first time, he or she could try again the following year.

In those days, when the private sector in Bangladesh was limited in scope and capacity, government jobs were the most sought-after. Decreasing age by one, two, or more years meant that individuals could apply for these competitive positions for a longer period of time. Consequently, once employed, they could stay in these jobs beyond the mandatory retirement age.

However, the secrecy surrounding a person's actual age can have a psychological impact. Even today, when someone asks me my age, I feel uneasy. I give a nervous smile and wonder whether I should tell my official age or my actual one. In contrast, here in the US, I see people talking about their age very frankly, as if there is nothing to

hide. I wish I also possessed this level of frankness. But no, I can never be as frank as these Americans, especially when it comes to discussing age, because I grew up in a culture where we rarely discussed age, and even if we did, we always stated our 'official' age.

In our culture, asking someone's age is considered so impolite that many children never find out their parents' 'actual' DOBs. Our parents do not feel comfortable sharing their actual year of birth with their children.

A friend once asked me why we Bangladeshis lie so much. I said, "Because we grow up telling lies. We lie about our age throughout our lives. We lie every single time we utter or write our date of birth. Now imagine how many times we have already lied." I think that in this manner, we have normalised lying in our culture.

Healthcare

I know people who have their age reduced by as much as three or four years. When these people go to a doctor's office and state their 'official' age, they neither help the doctor nor themselves. For instance, age is important in determining the eligibility for certain tests and adult immunizations. For instance, colonoscopy or mammogram (for women) are generally recommended

at age 45. However, if you're 41 years old on paper, your physician will delay recommending one of these tests for four years. This means that if you are not honest about your age while seeking healthcare, you might miss out on important life-saving medical tests.

Legal rights

Not having the correct age on paper also presents other challenges. For instance, you will have to wait to cast your first ballot or obtain a driver's license. In addition, you will not be able to sign contracts or make your own financial or medical decisions, if your 'official' age indicates that you are underage.


Nasir Uddin Ahmed, 62, is a non-resident Bangladeshi who lives in Sydney, Australia. Even though Ahmed is now eligible for the Seniors Card, a card that seniors can use to avail deals and discounts at restaurants, retail shops, and on public transport, he is unable to obtain the card because his 'official' age, that is, his age on paper, is 58. People can miss out on good opportunities and beneficial services when they are not truthful about their age.

In a country where birth certificates

can be forged, and birthdates altered, and where lying about one's DOB is perfectly acceptable, lying about other things becomes just as easy.

Lying about the DOB is something we are taught from a young age and continue to practice until our last breath, and thus, our death certificates also display an inaccurate date of birth, a sad consequence of a long-standing custom.

I collapsed at the person's feet, sobbing and gasping on the floor.

"But..wha..is..my..faul..?"

"You're alive for no good. That's what your fault is," replied the hoarse voice.

For a few minutes, a stunned silence filled the room. I could not summon the strength to speak again. I was exhausted, overwhelmed, unprepared for this; at least not today, not on such a special day as our third wedding anniversary.

As I struggled to sit up, memories replayed in vivid flashes: the best moments of our life together, hand in hand, promising to stay for better or worse, in sickness and in health, until death parted us. I clutched my chest as my heart pounded uncontrollably. The pain felt too dense to endure.

We had known each other since sixth grade, and love blossomed over the years. We believed we were meant to be. Life was beautiful in each other's company.



My better half, my wife — had seemed infallible, understanding, and passionate. I was grateful for a perfect partner, until a year into our marriage.

I would have to pretend, I thought. I would have to play with my cheer, work my brain to hide the panic from my face. I would need to look my best to complement my charming partner around the several people who have always looked up to us as an epitome of love. So, I did, once again.

"I am content. I am happy," I whispered to my fatigued reflection — a small attempt to lift my falling spirits.

Descending the red-carpeted stairs, I spotted many familiar faces, my mother among them, radiant with joy. Her sight froze my insides, but I forced a reassuring smile. She must have felt relieved to see her cheerful child, unaware of the hurricanes beneath.

I hugged her tightly before moving on to greet more guests at our extravagant anniversary celebration.

According to a national survey by the Bangladesh Bureau of Statistics (2022), 19 per cent of Bangladeshi men reported experiencing physical, psychological, or economic violence from an intimate partner at some point in their lives. In fact, the World Health Organization has found that about 1 in 4 men worldwide report experiencing domestic violence in various forms.

Yet, male victims rarely come forward. Shame, disbelief, cultural expectations of masculinity, and fear of ridicule keep them silent. Abuse against men is often dismissed as weakness, even humour, generally ignoring the trauma that might have been hidden beneath.

But violence is violence, no matter who endures it.

If we are committed to building a safer Bangladesh, one where women and children are protected with unity and compassion, we must extend the same humanity to men. No one, regardless of gender, should suffer in silence within their own home.

Every voice deserves to be heard. Every victim deserves protection.
