## ACC to scrutinise affidavits of aspirants

Candidates who provide false info could face charges

For the first time, the Anti-Corruption Commission will scrutinise the affidavits of general election aspirants to hold them accountable for their declared assets and liabilities.

The affidavits detail candidates' assets and liabilities, including those of their dependents at home and abroad. For years, such declarations were rarely questioned and were often treated as routine paperwork rather than tools of accountability.

The ACC's move gains significance in light of recent amendments to the Representation of the People Order (RPO), which strengthen the Election Commission's (EC) powers to act against candidates who submit false information, if proved.

Under the amended law, the EC can cancel candidature even after an election victory if falsehoods in affidavits are proven at any point during an MP's five-year term. The commission may hold a hearing and revoke the membership if violations are proven.

Fakhrul's income rose by Tk 57,700 in 7 years

BNP Secretary General Mirza Fakhrul Islam Alangir, who filed nomination papers for contesting the February 12 polls from the Thakurgaon-1 constituency, has reported a marginal increase of Tk 57,700 in his annual income over the past seven years.

According to the affidavit submitted to the Election Commission, his current annual income stands at Tk 11.83 lakh, earned from agriculture, business, consultancy, honorariums and bank profits.

Of this, Tk 1.80 lakh comes from agriculture and Tk 1.97 lakh from business, entirely through shares in Hurmati Ali

Porwar's assets worth Tk 1.14cr

Jamaat-e-Islami Secretary General Mia Golam Porwar has declared assets worth more than Tk 1.14 crore at current market value, according to his election affidavit submitted to the Election Commission.

The 67-year-old is eyeing to contest the upcoming election from the Kulna 5 constituency. He holds a Master of Commerce degree in accounting.

The affidavit shows that his sole source of income is business, from which he earns about Tk 4,67,500 annually. His previous profession was teaching.

He owns non-agricultural land and buildings with a current market value of Tk 1 crore, though their acquisition value was Tk 22.72 lakh.

Porwar has Tk 5.90 lakh in cash and Tk 7.24 lakh in his only bank account, jewellery worth Tk 7 lakh,

Akhter earns Tk 5.05 lakh a year

National Citizen Party Member Secretary Akhter Hossen has declared his annual income of Tk 5.05 lakh, earned from agriculture, business, and employment.

The information was disclosed in the affidavit he submitted to the Election Commission along with his nomination papers to contest the 13th Jatiya Sangsad election from Rangpur-4.

According to his affidavit, Akhter and his wife, Sanjida Akter, jointly listed his profession as politician and party chairman. He has reported a total of Tk 4 lakh as his annual income – Tk 1.9 lakh from shares, savings certificates and deposits, and Tk 2.1 lakh as allowances as leader of the opposition.

In 2024, however, he had declared an annual income of Tk 44 lakh,

GM Quader's wealth grows despite fall in income

Jatiya Party Chairman GM Quader's annual income has declined 10-fold since the last election, but his cash holdings and assets have increased, according to a comparison of his affidavits for the last and the upcoming national elections.

In the latest affidavit, Quader, contesting from Rangpur-3, listed his profession as politician and party chairman. He has reported a total of Tk 4 lakh as his annual income – Tk 1.9 lakh from shares, savings certificates and deposits, and Tk 2.1 lakh as allowances as leader of the opposition.

BNP'S POLLS ACTIVITIES  
Tarique to begin countrywide tour next week

The BNP is set to ramp up its election activities nationwide, with acting chairman Tarique Rahman taking a central role in courting voters for the February 12 polls.

"Since the election schedule has already been announced, we want to keep ourselves busy with election-related activities -- we want to move forward under the leadership of our leader Tarique Rahman," said Syed Emran Saleh Prince, joint secretary general of BNP.



Tarique is likely to begin his countrywide tour from next week. The Daily Star has learnt from people involved with the planning process.

He will visit all eight divisions of the country, starting with Rangpur and ending with Dhaka.

He will travel in the bulletproof bus that has been imported for him and address public rallies along the way.

While in Rangpur, he might visit the family of Abu Sayed, a 25-year-old student activist at Begum Rokeya University whose death on July 16, 2024 from police bullets was the turning point in the July uprising.

Such gestures are intended to link the party's campaign with the broader public sentiment that followed the uprising.

In that leg of the trail, he will also cover Rajshahi and Bogura. Tarique is contesting from the Bogura-6 constituency in the election.

After North Bengal, he will head to Mymensingh.

The route has been designed to build momentum in the regions before ending the tour in the capital, according to people with knowledge of the plans.

The visits are intended to help him see the country in person after 17 years in exile

## Manna, Azad among 34 disqualified in scrutiny

At least 34 aspirants in eight districts have lost their chances to contest the upcoming national election, as their nomination papers were scrapped during scrutiny by returning officers.

Jamaat-e-Islami Assistant Secretary General AHM Hamidur Rahman Azad and Nagarik Oikya President Mahmudur Rahman Manna are among those disqualified.

Azad, who sought to run from Cox's Bazar-2, was disqualified for failing to submit proper documents related to one of his cases, said Returning Officer MA Manna. His lawyer Md Arif said an appeal would be filed against the decision.

Manna's papers for Bogura-2 were turned down due to incomplete information on his cases and inconsistencies in his financial statement, said Returning Officer Toufiqur Rahman.



## JAISHANKAR'S VISIT A positive move but requires more understanding

While the recent overtures from New Delhi to BNP may be seen in a positive light and an expedient move, it requires earnest introspection on India's part to explore why bilateral relations between these two neighbours remain frosty at best.

The gathering of foreign dignitaries at BNP chief Khaleda Zia's funeral was remarkable, to say the least. Ministers from Bhutan, Nepal, the Maldives and India attended the funeral as did the speaker of Pakistan's national assembly. Envoy from about 40 countries joined

the event as did millions who flooded the streets at the heart of Dhaka and brought it to standstill for several hours. There were condolence messages from premiers around the region including China.

The funeral had suddenly become a regional event befitting a great stateswoman, not just the leader of one of Bangladesh's largest political parties or just another former prime minister. But most significant, in all this was perhaps, the attendance of the Indian foreign minister S Jaishankar. One of the most visible figures of the Indian cabinet, Jaishankar also delivered a personal message from the Indian prime minister Narendra Modi. The foreign dignitaries met Khaleda's son, who is now BNP's acting chair and de facto head of the party, Tarique Rahman.

But in light of India's lukewarm response and a notable reluctance to engage with the interim government, Jaishankar's visit and Modi's

## HADI KILLING Charge sheet by Jan 7: DB

Police are preparing to submit the charge sheet this week in the murder case of Ingilab Moncho spokesman Sharif Osman Hadi, accusing absconding Faisal Karim Masud, the key accused, and several others.

"The investigation is now at the final stage," said Shafikul Islam, additional commissioner of the Dhaka Metropolitan Police and chief of the Detective Branch (DB), which is probing the killing.

"We are hopeful that the charge sheet in the murder case will be submitted by January 7," he told The Daily Star yesterday.

When asked about the possible number of accused to be named in the charge sheet, he did not specify an exact figure but hinted that it could be between eight and 12.

Hadi, an aspiring candidate for Dhaka-8 and a prominent youth leader during last year's uprising, was shot in
