

Pak, Afghan forces trade fire at border

Pakistani and Afghan forces exchanged fire along their border on Tuesday night, with each side accusing the other of initiating the clash, days after Pakistan airstrikes in Afghanistan strained already tenuous ties.

The incident marks the latest flare-up along the 2,600-km (1,615-mile) border, where tensions have risen since Pakistan's strikes on Saturday and Sunday and threaten a fragile ceasefire following deadly clashes in October.

Mosharrif Zaidi, spokesperson for Pakistan's prime minister, told Reuters the Afghan Taliban authorities had initiated "unprovoked firing" in the Torkham and Tirah sub-sectors along the border.

"Pakistan's security forces responded immediately and effectively, silencing the Taliban aggression," Zaidi said, warning that any provocation would be met "immediately and severely."

RAKHINE STATE Myanmar junta air strike kills 17

A Myanmar military air strike on a village market in the country's westernmost state killed at least 17 people, two local sources said yesterday.

Myanmar has been consumed by civil war since the junta snatched power in a 2021 coup, pitching the military against an array of ethnic minority armed groups and pro-democracy guerrillas.

Armed opposition group the Arakan Army said 17 "innocent civilians" were killed in the strike on Yoe Ngu village market in Rakhine state on Tuesday, while civilian volunteer group the Ponnagayun Youths Association (PYA) put the death toll at 18.

A Myanmar military spokesman could not be reached for comment. "The scene was really bad, four or five buildings were burnt down and many buildings were destroyed," said PYA chairman Pyae Phyo Naing, who arrived at the strike site in its aftermath.

Iran has 'sinister nuke ambitions'

Claims Trump in his State of the Union address; Tehran says deal can be reached as negotiators head to Geneva for talks

An Iranian delegation headed by its top diplomat set off for Geneva yesterday for talks with the US, as the Islamic republic's president struck an upbeat tone about the prospect of a negotiated agreement to avert fresh conflict.

Donald Trump has repeatedly threatened strikes if Iran fails to cut a deal on its atomic programme, and in his State of the Union address on Tuesday, the US president accused Tehran of "sinister nuclear ambitions" after he ordered a massive military deployment around the Gulf.

But Iranian President Masoud Pezeshkian yesterday said that he had a "favourable outlook for the negotiations", after Foreign Minister Abbas Araghchi and his team left for Switzerland.

"We are continuing the process under the guidance of the supreme leader so that we can move beyond this 'neither war nor peace' situation," Pezeshkian said in a speech.



Trump in his address claimed that Tehran had "already developed missiles that can threaten Europe and our bases overseas, and they're working to build missiles that will soon reach the United States".

But an Iranian foreign ministry spokesman yesterday refuted those claims as "simply the repetition of 'big lies'". The maximum range of Iran's missiles is 2,000 kilometres according to what Tehran has publicly disclosed.

"My preference is to solve this problem through diplomacy but one

thing is certain: I will never allow the world's number one sponsor of terror, which they are by far, to have a nuclear weapon," Trump said.

Hours before Trump's speech, Iran's Araghchi declared the two sides had "a historic opportunity", saying a deal was "within reach, but only if diplomacy is given priority".

In recent weeks Trump has deployed two aircraft carrier groups and dozens of other warplanes to the region to back up his threats, and Iran has repeatedly said it would respond firmly to any attack.

Preparations on track for post-uprising polls in Nepal Says interim PM

Nepal's interim government has said preparations are on track for parliamentary elections next week, the first since a deadly 2025 uprising, urging voters to exercise their right "without fear".

The Himalayan republic of 30 million people holds elections on March 5, less than six months after youth-led anti-corruption protests toppled the previous government.

The unrest killed at least 77 people. "The government will leave no stone unturned to conduct the election in a clean, fair, fearless, and peaceful manner," Sushila Karki, the interim prime minister, said late Tuesday.

"I urge all citizens to exercise their voting rights with confidence and without any fear."

Violence in September 2025 was the worst since the decade-long civil war ended with a peace deal in 2006.

The day is observed to mark the Palkhona carnage, in which 74 people — including 57 army officers — were killed at the then Bangladesh Rifles (BDR) headquarters in Dhaka on February 25-26, 2009, when BDR members staged a mutiny.

Among the victims was the then BDR director general Major General Shakil Ahmed.

A one-minute silence was observed in honour of the victims, as members of the armed forces rendered a state salute. A prayer was offered seeking eternal peace for the departed souls of the martyred officers and the wellbeing of the affected families.

Following the Palkhona tragedy, the BDR was renamed Border Guard Bangladesh (BGB). Three representatives of the slain army officers' families also spoke at the event, sharing their pain over losing their loved ones 17 years ago. They placed several demands, including ensuring justice for the killings and bringing the masterminds behind the incident to justice.

Speaking at the Army Multipurpose Hall, Chief of Army Staff General Waker-Uz-Zaman said the nation must remain united to ensure that no incident like that of February 25-26 ever recurs, describing it as a "stain" on the country's history.

He said that under a special directive and in the presence of the prime minister, the day is being observed in this manner for the first time, and an iftar has been arranged for the families of the martyred. On behalf of all present, he thanked PM Tarique, saying his presence instilled

confidence and hope among the family members of the soldiers martyred at Palkhona.

"The Bangladesh Army has always ensured full support for the families of those slain and will continue to do so in the future, Insha'Allah."

Waker noted that the relationship between the Bangladesh Army and Border Guard Bangladesh was forged through sacrifice in the Liberation War. "The Bangladesh Army and Border Guard Bangladesh are working together to protect the country's independence and sovereignty."

Later, Tarique joined the families for iftar.

Home Minister Salahuddin Ahmed; BGB Director General Maj Gen Mohammad Ashrafuzzaman Siddiqi; Chief of Naval Staff Adm Mohammad Nazmul Hassan; Air Chief Marshal Hasan Mahmood Khan; the prime minister's Defence Adviser Brig Gen (ret) ATM Shamsul Islam; and the prime minister's Principal Secretary ABM Abdus Sattar, among others, were present on the occasion.

Tarique's wife Zubaida Rahman and daughter Zaima Rahman were also present.

environment of the media," read the statement signed by Editors' Council President Nurul Kabir and General Secretary Dewan Hanif Mahmud.

If there are specific, evidence-based allegations against any journalist, those must be addressed under existing laws through a transparent judicial process, the statement added.

"But harassment and motivated cases are not acceptable under any circumstances," it said.

The council said it had repeatedly requested the interim government to withdraw the false and motivated cases and to take effective measures to stop the

harassment of journalists.

"They assured us that the cases would be reviewed and that steps would be taken to withdraw the false and harassing cases. But unfortunately, the expected progress in this matter has not been observed," the statement read.

The council strongly urged the newly elected government to give the issue the highest priority and to take swift initiatives to withdraw such cases.


It reiterated that ensuring media freedom and professional security is a fundamental commitment of a democratic state and expressed hope that the government would act accordingly.

Germany's Merz in China as he seeks reset with Beijing

German Chancellor Friedrich Merz on a visit to Beijing aimed at resetting relations that have been clouded by a yawning trade deficit with the world's second-largest economy.

On his first visit to China as chancellor, Merz, who was accompanied by a large business delegation, told President Xi Jinping that he wanted to deepen what he called the "comprehensive strategic partnership" with China.

Xi welcomed the comments from Merz, who faces a tough balancing act of redefining an economic relationship that has been increasingly unfavourable to Germany.

"The more turbulent and intertwined the world becomes, the more China and Germany need to strengthen strategic communication and enhance strategic mutual trust," he said.

The German chancellor's visit, following visits by French President Emmanuel Macron and British PM Keir Starmer, came as European leaders have looked to shore up their ties with China following the widening rift with the Trump administration.

Merz, who is due to visit Washington next week, encouraged Chinese firms to step up investments in Germany but said both sides needed to remain clear-eyed.
