Ex-Somoy TV MD
Ahmed Jobaer
sent to jail

A Dhaka court yesterday sent Somoy TV’s former managing director Ahmed Jobaer to jail in a fraud case.

Dhaka’s Additional Chief Metropolitan Magistrate Md Zakir Hossain passed the order, rejecting Jobaer’s bail petition, defence lawyer Forhad Hossain Nion told The Daily Star.

Earlier in the day, Jobaer, along with three others, surrendered before the court and sought bail in the case, he said.

The court granted bail to Jobaer’s son, Ahmed Rafid Kader Rivu, and Somoy TV employees Sheikh Mahmud Yeasin and Sany Chowdhury, he added.

On June 17, another Dhaka court issued arrest warrants for the four as they did not comply with its order. The case was filed on May 10 by Syed Asaduzzaman under various sections, including fraud and breach of trust, of the Penal Code.

Forhad claimed that the case was “entirely false and baseless” and had been filed to harass his client. He said a longstanding dispute exists over the ownership and management of Somoy Media Limited.

Scrap trader killed,
bike set ablaze

A scrap trader was hacked to death at his home in Munshiganj’s Louhajang upazila early yesterday.

The victim, Sohel Munshi, 39, of Kalurgaon village, was found dead in the courtyard of his residence, while his motorcycle was found ablaze nearby, said Md Anisur Rahman, additional superintendent of police (Sreenagar Circle).

Quoting family members, the police official said Sohel went to bed after dinner. His wife was sleeping in an adjacent room with their child and mother-in-law.

Late at night, family members noticed a fire in the yard and rushed outside, where they found Sohel’s body lying in a pool of blood and his motorcycle on fire.

According to the family, unidentified assailants may have lured or called Sohel out of the house, hacked him to death with sharp weapons, and then set his motorcycle on fire before fleeing.

Police sent the body to Munshiganj General Hospital morgue for an autopsy.

According to police, Sohel was involved in the scrap business and had a drug-related case filed against him in 2022.

to Dhaka, where Tipu and Kabir were arrested with assistance from the DMP’s Detective Branch on February 20, 2015.

According to the witness, Eshanullah then instructed the team to hand the detainees over to a Barishal DB team instead of taking them to Agailjhara Police Station.

Later that night, the detainees were killed in a staged crossfire, he said.

Nazrul was the second prosecution witness against former Abul Hasanat Abdullah, Eshanullah, and former Uzirpur ASIs Mahabul and

Jaasim.

Meanwhile, a Hefazat-e-Islam activist yesterday told ICT-1 that he was abducted by DGF personnel in 2015, held in secret detention for over a year, tortured, and later shown arrested in alleged staged militancy cases that kept him in jail for eight years.

Tajul Islam Sumon, 39, said he was abducted from a madrasa in Manikganj on November 4, 2015, after posting criticism of the then government’s repression and alleged killings of Hefazat activists on Facebook.

Billboards creep back into Ctg

Ten years after a major eviction drive cleared Chattogram’s skyline, billboards are making a return to the port city.

New billboard structures have appeared at key intersections, including Jamal Khan, Kazir Dewri, Probortok, GEC, Lalkhan Bazar and Tiger Pass, frustrating residents who remember a time when advertisements dominated the skyline and obscured the city’s hills.

The campaign to remove billboards began in January 2016 under then mayor AJM Nasir Uddin, following sustained pressure from civil society groups. At the time, Nasir vowed that the Chattogram City Corporation would never allow billboards to return.

His successors, former administrator Khorshed Alam Sujan

and former mayor Rezaul Karim Chowdhury, largely maintained that position. Current Mayor Shahadat Hossain, after assuming office on November 5, 2024, also pledged not to allow billboards in the port city.

“In the past, we saw that those involved in the billboard business



were affiliated with the ruling party. This time, the situation appears no different,” alleged Akhtar Kabir Chowdhury, president of the Chattogram chapter of Shushashoner Jonno Nagorik.

Amid growing criticism, the CCC launched an eviction drive on February 19, beginning at Kazir Dewri.

Mohammad Ashraful Amin, acting chief executive officer of the CCC, said no permission had been granted for any billboard installation.

“We have ordered those who installed the structures to remove them immediately,” he told The Daily Star.

Mayor Shahadat reiterated his opposition to illegal structures but said digital displays would be treated differently. “LED screens will remain. People need a place to advertise. LED screens exist in Dhaka and in cities abroad as well,” he said.

The mayor said the CCC would allow owners a “reasonable period” to dismantle the unauthorised structures. “If they do not remove them, we will take those down ourselves,” he warned.

During the study period, nearly 200 girls got married and 72 became pregnant.

65 RMG workers
fall ill after
drinking water

At least 65 workers of a ready-made garment factory in Kaliakair upazila of Gazipur fell ill after drinking water yesterday morning and were admitted to the Kaliakair Upazila Health Complex.

The incident took place at Dressmen Garments Ltd in the Chandra area.

According to hospitalised workers, they drank water shortly after starting work in the morning. Soon afterwards, several workers began experiencing dizziness, vomiting and weakness. Gradually, workers on other floors developed similar symptoms.

Some workers, requesting anonymity, said they noticed an unusual taste and smell in the water. Although they tried to alert the authorities, the situation deteriorated rapidly before any action could be taken.

Dr Sadiya Tasnim Munmun, upazila health and family planning officer of Kaliakair, told The Daily Star that workers started arriving at the hospital around 10:30am, creating pressure on its services.

“We are providing them with necessary treatment,” she said.

Gazipur Civil Surgeon Dr M Mamunur Rahman said 60 to 65 workers had so far been admitted to the health complex following the incident.

Gazipur Industrial Police Superintendent Md Amzad Hossain said additional police personnel were being deployed to the factory to prevent any potential unrest.

Atiqul Islam, AGM (Administration) of Dressmen Garments Ltd, claimed, “Around 50 workers had fallen ill. Treatment arrangements were made immediately after the incident.”

He added that continuous rain on Monday had caused waterlogging in the area and suggested that workers might have consumed water from a submerged tap. “We did not find any problem with the factory water,” he said.

Shahidul Islam, officer-in-charge of Kaliakair Police Station, said the workers had consumed water supplied from their own water pump. “Samples of the water were sent to a laboratory in Dhaka for testing.”
